Ver the last month we have been approached in -person and via e-mail by several members of the Community to write an article about Courtesy. We address this as more of a definition of Common Courtesy and some of the common Courtesies we have all come to perform and expect in life. Our objective is not to "preach" but to inform.

The Cambridge Dictionary defines Common Courtesy as "the basic level of politeness that you expect from someone."

Why does Common Courtesy matter? – as of late people have focused a lot of attention on elevating culture and identifying the old traditions we can leave behind. While some people might lump common courtesy in that bunch, it's actually just as important today as it was hundreds of years ago.

Common Courtesy

- <u>It Sets a Positive Tone</u> at the end of the day, everyone wants to treat others with respect and kindness, and knowing common courtesy shorthand lets you do that in a language other people understand. Being courteous to strangers from the start can set a positive tone for any future interactions you have.
- <u>It Keeps Social Order</u> Sure, we all walk through life abiding by bigger laws of the land, but for the everyday stuff, we can only rely on common courtesy to get us through. Without some kind of established behavior profile, every public interaction would end in chaos. Just imagine trying to get on the train without everyone knowing not to crowd the entrance, not to shove, and to make room for people getting off.
- <u>It's a Quick Way to Show Respect</u> Practicing common courtesy is just another way that we can show respect for other people. Being polite makes sharing a common space comfortable. You can't avoid dealing with others, so you might as well make them feel welcome.
- <u>Put positive energy into the world</u> Do you remember the last time someone entered a room and lifted the energy of everyone present? You can be that person, too. Sharing positive energy is a great sign of courtesy.
- **Don't judge a book by its cover** start judging people on their qualities and not their external appearance.

Here are 10 easy ways to Practice Common Courtesy in your Everyday Life.

- 1. Help people pick up things they dropped.
- 2. Ask someone struggling if they need help helping that "short" person get something off the top shelf.
- 3. Be kind on the phone, even when you're angry having to deal with call centers to solve a problem can raise anyone's blood pressure, but the disrespectful thing to do is start screaming at the worker on the line. They're just doing a job, and it's important to treat *Continued on page 6*

- 8. Don't Stand right in front of the Elevator doors remember there are people needing to get off the elevator.
- 9. Acknowledge everyone in the Group if you run into a friend and they've got someone with them, make sure you give them a nod and say hi. You might feel uncomfortable greeting a stranger, but it's way more uncomfortable acting like they don't exist when they're right in front of you.

Living in Largo

hought we would tell you about some of the events available to you as residents of the City of Largo.

L City of Largo Police Department Residential Security Assessment program. Free service provided by Largo PD officers that have been certified in Residential Home Security and Crime Prevention. The consultation takes approximately thirty (30) minutes, and the resident must be present at the time of the inspection.

This program was presented to Lincolnshire residents at Coffee Hour on March 6th, 2024 by Officer Keith Bowling. Part of this security assessment may find you eligible to receive the installation of a "free" lock box to assist in the event of a 911 emergency calls, when you are unable to open your house door for the emergency personnel. The lock box stores your house key and the code assigned is maintained by the emergency dispatch system to notify responders about the lockbox. Remember if you place a 911 call and the emergency responders cannot get into your home, they will break down the door. If you are interested in setting up a Residential Security Assessment, please e-mail Officer Keith Bowling at kbowling@largo.com. Don't forget to give him your name, our community name, phone# and your Lot#.

Time To Contact the VA

illions of U.S. veterans will be eligible beginning March 5 for health care with the Department of Veterans Affairs under an accelerated effort to provide benefits and services to those exposed to toxic substances while serving. The VA announced Monday that all veterans who have served in a combat zone since the Vietnam War, as well as those who participated in training or operations and came into contact with hazardous materials, will be able to enroll in VA health care.



The expansion of health care benefits was mandated by the PACT Act, signed into law by President Joe Biden in August 2022, which required the expansion to occur by 2032. VA officials said last month the acceleration is a result of a hiring blitz made possible by provisions in the law. "If you're a veteran who may have been exposed to toxins or hazards while serving our country, at home or abroad, we want you to come to us for the health care you deserve," VA Secretary Denis McDonough said Monday in a release.

Under the PACT Act, more than 100,000 veterans have enrolled in VA health care and roughly 760,000 disability claims have been approved. VA officials did not detail exactly how many veterans now will be eligible for care under the expansion but said the figure is in the "millions." "Beginning March 5, we're making millions of veterans eligible for VA health care years earlier than called for by the PACTAct," VA Under Secretary for Health Dr. Shereef Elnahal said. "We want to bring all of these veterans to VA for the care they've earned and deserve." The expansion allows all veterans who deployed to combat zones in support of the Vietnam, Persian Gulf, Iraq, and Afghanistan wars to enroll in VA health care.

In addition, veterans who never deployed but were exposed to pollutants while participating in a known "toxic exposure risk activity," or TERA, either in the U.S. or abroad, will be eligible. That would include exposure while on active duty, active-duty training or inactive-duty training to: air pollutants from burn pits, particulate matter, sulfur or oil well fires; chemicals such as pesticides, herbicides, contaminated water or depleted uranium from embedded shrapnel; occupational hazards such as lead, industrial solvents, toxic paint, asbestos and firefighting foam; radiation, including nuclear weapons handling, maintenance and detonation, X-rays and occupational exposure; and chemical or biological weapons or nerve agents.

According to the VA, the department will use service records and other resources to determine whether a veteran participated in a TERA. Veterans are not required to have a service-connected disability or file a compensation claim to be eligible for VA care. New enrollees will have access to a toxic exposure screening provided by their primary care physician and may be referred to specialty care depending on need, Elnahal said during a call with reporters last month.

They also will be assessed for placement in the VA's priority-based health system and referred ... continued on page 40

to the Veterans Benefits Administration if they qualify for additional benefits. Priority group placement determines whether a veteran is required to make copayments for appointments or prescriptions, depending on treatment or the medications. During a press conference Monday, Elnahal said that, by law, veterans receiving treatment for exposure-related illnesses will not make copayments for appointments related to that care.

"This is a real economic benefit opportunity for veterans but also a clinical benefit," Elnahal said. The Veterans Health Administration has set a goal to hire 52,000 employees this fiscal year, which, when factoring in attrition, should grow its workforce by 3%. Elnahal said the increases could help to absorb new patients, meet demand, and standardize -- or even improve -- wait times.

"Challenges abound with hiring for every single health care system, so we are not complacent at all," Elnahal said. "We're continuing to make the changes we need to make the hiring process better and faster."

The VA is encouraging veterans to apply for care or benefits by visiting the <u>VA.gov/</u> <u>PACT</u> website or calling 1-800-MYVA411.

ast month the article centered on the use and merits of the newest obesity, weight loss and diabetic medications. This month let us look at the other side of the coin, necessary precautions. These meds are not for everybody.

None takes the place of proper meal planning, well placed exercise using the calories from eating which are readily available for use by all our cells. Not stored in fat cells.

The weight loss versions of semaglutide (Wegovy) and tirzepatide (Zepbound) are FDA approved to treat people with obesity, not those looking to shed a few pounds. Obesity is a chronic disease that is relapsing (and) that requires long-term treatment. When used for this purpose only results can be remarkable and observable. These prescribed medications are often expensive and the top co-pay tier in our pharmacy plans if covered at all.

This is how these <u>prescribed</u> medications work. These medications suppress appetite. Feeling full too quickly or feeling sick after only eating a little can disconnect a person from their innate hunger and fullness cues. Like having an early alarm system on eating.

We need to nourish throughout the day to have the energy to do with our body and minds what we want to do. The downside is not eating enough essential foods for energy and bodily requirements. Am I eating enough? Monitoring by our health/medical team is critical.

They have not been FDA approved for treating binge eating disorder which is a complex mix of behavioral pressures.

While these therapies seem close to magic bullets, they are not without gastrointestinal side effects like <u>nausea</u>, <u>vomiting</u>, <u>diarrhea</u>, <u>and constipation</u>. *These symptoms are related to*

how the drugs work to slow down the gastrointestinal tract. Other more severe, but rare, side effects include <u>pancreatitis and irreversible gastroparesis</u>, or inflammation of the pancreas and stomach paralysis.

These drugs can also *lead to a <u>loss of healthy lean muscle mass</u> in addition to fat, particularly in the absence of exercise. <i>Significant <u>weight gain</u>* after stopping the drugs unless there is a supportive nutrition and exercise plan. Along with an appearance issue: sagging skin. How do we then get back to using diet and exercise to maintain weight loss or maintain our weight goal?

The benefits of prescription weight-loss drugs for people with obesity often override the risks, but compounded formulations of the medications that have not gone through the thorough FDA certification can cause big problems. The alterations of the FDA approved medications are promoted in media advertisements as if they were truly legitimate.


