

Want to thank my family and all of my friends in Amber Glades for their kindness and support during this horrific time of my life. I was with Ronnie for twenty-eight years.

Ronnie was born in Kingston, NY on March 16, 1937. His dad died when he was two years old and he was brought up by his Mom and Uncle Chipe. His uncle took him all over and helped him deliver blocks of ice to

persons who did not have electric refrigerators. His uncle taught him to play the banjo and he played drums in high school. He graduated from Kingston High School in 1955. He enlisted in the Air Force and served in France for four years.

He worked for Western Printing for about twenty years and then joined IBM. He was married for twenty-nine years and was then divorced. He had one daughter. I met Ron on January 3, 1986. I retired first. He was still working. Upon his retirement he began playing drums with his uncle in the Riverview Banjo Band, which lasted for about four years.

We moved to Florida in May 2008. Here he played drums in the Suncoast String Band. He began playing guitar about two years ago and played at Amber Glades Clubhouse with some of the bands and played at Pot Luck Dinners.

Florida Department Of Highway Safety And Motor Vehicles

Section 316.1964, Florida Statutes, authorizes all individuals who have been issued a parking permit to park on the street at a turnstile meter parking space free of charge. However, there are restrictions on the duration of time a person can park free on the street. When an on-street parking meter restricts the



duration of time that a vehicle may be parked, a vehicle properly displaying a disabled parking permit is allowed a maximum of four hours at no charge; however local governments may extend such time by local ordinance.

For Black Cats Hallowe'en Can Be More Trick Than Treat



I f you have a black cat, Hallowe'en is the time of the year to make every effort to keep it safe from thieves who might use it for nefarious purposes. Keep your cat indoors lest it be stolen for use in satanic rituals. There are individuals who think Hallowe'en gives them the freedom to kill or terrorize an animal for entertainment.

Taking advantage of my serendipitous turn of events, I opted to get married. I chose to have a catered affair in lieu of the usual "Football Wedding" reception. Often held in a large rented hall, so as to accommodate the large number of relatives (children included.) Families were huge in my day.

The bride's family on the eve of the wedding would make all kinds of sandwiches wrapped in wax paper and at the reception would go to each table and when someone who wanted a sandwich, would say, "Gimme a ham and Swiss," the family would throw it across the table like a football. Hence the term "Football Wedding."

I booked the largest hotel in Brooklyn, the St. George, which boasted the only in-door salt-water pool in the city. I had over fifty relatives at a sit-down seven-course meal in the hotel's banquet room and the tariff was just under \$150. The rest we saved

to furnish our home when I was discharged.

P.S. I often joked to my wife, "I won you in a crap game." I may have said it once too often because my wife reacted by treating me like a bachelor for a week, and that made me put an end to that joke.
