



If not already, soon construction will begin on replacement of the water lines and resurfacing of our roads. Many residents attended the project meeting, listened to discussions between the Engineer and Contractor, and had the opportunity to ask questions. We will keep everyone informed throughout the construction period, approximately March through December. Information will be posted at the Clubhouse, messages through VOLO Village, listbot, and on the Americana Cove website.

The Contractor's goal is to keep inconveniences to a minimum. Residents will be notified when access to your driveway will not be available and vehicles need to be moved. You will also be notified in advance when your water will be shut off for connection to the new system.

Someone will get back to you as soon as possible. PLEASE DO NOT SEEK OUT OR INTERRUP CONSTRUCTION WORKERS WITH YOUR QUESTIONS UNLESS IT IS AN OBVIOUS EMERGENCY!

The Contractors equipment will be stored and located at the South boat ramp and on the vacant lots located on Mt. DeLeon. PLEASE STAY OUT OF THESE AREAS! This is for your safety as well as respecting their equipment.

It is very important for all residents to have their contact information current and on file with the Office.

All residents leaving for the summer please follow all items listed below.

- 1. Make sure your contact information is up to date and on file with the Office.
- 2. Please turn the water off to your home. If you do not know where your water turnoff is located, or you need assistance in doing so, please call the office immediately and a maintenance person will assist you. It is possible there may be some homes without a turn off.
- 3. Please turn off your water heater. This can be easily done by turning off the circuit breaker
- 4. If you leave a vehicle here for the summer, please make sure keys are left with someone you trust or the office. It may be necessary to move your vehicle depending on where the new water line will be run to your home.

Your patience and cooperation is key to making this project as seamless as possible!

Letter from the Manager

Below is a Healthy Home Maintenance Checklist for residents. These are Spring Cleaning Ideas to ensure your home is maintained in a manner that is conducive for a healthy home.

- 1. Make sure your gutters discharge water away from your home.
- 2. Check driveway, patio and sidewalk for trip hazards.
- 3. Clean gutters and drain spouts.
- 4. Check for mold or mildew and clean if needed.
- 5. Look for peeling paint and repaint if needed.
- 6. Look for signs of leaks where the roof deck attaches to the home.
- 7. Look for signs of leaks at windows and door sills.
- 8. Repair broken or cracked glass in windows and doors.
- 9. Clean dryer vent that leads to the exterior to prevent fires.
- 10. Check toilet supply/shut-off valve(s).
- 11. Clean and check refrigerator drip pan and icemaker connections, if applicable.
- 12. Check hot water heater for leaks.
- 13. Clean kitchen range hood screen.
- 14. Clean dryer vents and screens.

If you are heading north for the summer months there is a list of suggested items to keep your Florida home safe and secure until you return.

- 1. Lower and secure storm shutters.
- 2. Put in a forwarding order with the post office.
- 3. Put your phone, cable and internet on "seasonal" status.
- 4. Stop newspaper subscriptions.
- 5. Empty and turn off icemaker.
- 6. Unplug small appliance.
- 7. Shut off the water at the outside main value and notify the office if you cannot do this!
- 8. Shut off the breakers to the water heater.
- 9. Leave the air conditioning set to 80 degrees.
- 10. Be sure all windows and doors are securely locked.
- 11. Leave a key with a trusted neighbor or employ a home watch person or service and ensure the office knows who to contact if we need to during the water line project.
- 12. All outside items and furniture must be brought inside or secured in the event of a storm.
- 13. Notify the business office that you are leaving.
- 14. Change your VOLO Village Service to an alternate number or email.





Medication Related Problems in Older Adults

Medications can be ineffective because of:

Doctors may under prescribe because they are worried about adverse effects

Patient's adherence may be poor either due to financial reasons or a lack of understanding about the dosage

Poly pharmacy is a serious issue with older adults.

The definition is the practice of administrating or using multiple medications at the same time for the same disease or condition. It affects about 40 percent of older adults living in their own homes. This usually occurs when you see multiple doctors and they prescribe medication without knowing your history or that you see other specialist that are giving you prescriptions. It is important you should

always carry a list of all your medications both prescription and over the counter.

Foods also have a significant effect on medications. Listed below are some of the hazardous food and drug interactions including some over the counter drugs that can cause dangerous interactions, with your prescription medications.

Grapefruit and grapefruit juice can interact powerfully and cause serious effects with some blood pressure medications as well as medications to treat thyroid or cholesterol conditions.

Green leafy vegetables such as broccoli, brussel sprouts, and cabbage have been known to reduce the effects of blood thinners. Small amounts are OK but not daily or large amounts all at once.

Oatmeal and other fibrous foods are believed to interfere with the absorption of Lanoxin (digoxin).

Salt substitutes used by many people with high blood pressure can contain large amounts of potassium. High levels of potassium can lead to an irregular heart rhythm.

Licorice is another food that can lead to low levels of potassium. One piece won't hurt but not handfuls daily.

This is just a small sample of how foods can interact with your medications.

The bottom line to this article is knowledge and communication. Know all you can about your medications, and communicate with ALL your physicians and pharmacists.







What is the difference between a manufactured and modular home?

rokerage Agent for Americana Cove Home buyers often ask about modular and manufactured housing and what the differences are between the two types.

A manufactured home is a single or multi-section home built in a factory on a permanent frame, like a steel undercarriage/chassis, with a removable transportation system (hitch and wheels.) The unit is permanently attached to a site-built foundation and is subject to the 1976 federal standards established by the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

A modular home is constructed in a factory using conventional home floor joists and delivered to a site on a trailer or flat-bed truck. The delivered home may be in the form of panels that are assembled at the site, may be pre-cut and assembled on site or may be pre-built and delivered in one piece. The home, panels or pre-cut panels are lifted from the trailer and attached to a permanent foundation.

A modular home may be single or multi-storied. Modular homes are not built to HUD standards, but instead must be built to state and local uniform Building Codes, which are the same standards as any other site-built home.

Both modular and manufactured homes are often built in the same factory. For example, Jacobsen Homes and Palm Harbor Homes, who are well known as manufactured home builders, also build modular homes. In fact, Palm Harbor Homes is the first manufactured home factory in the U.S. that has been approved to build disaster resistant modular homes.

In August 2015, the Insurance Institute for Business & Home Safety (IBHS) certified Palm Harbor's manufacturing plant in Plant City as the first factory in the country to build Fortified homes. Modular homes earning the Fortified home label must meet stringent construction standards set by IBHS based on their building engineering research. The Fortified homehurricane program provides a uniform set of standards to make homes safer, stronger and more resistant to hurricanes












