<u>Daylight Savings Time</u> – Don't forget to move your clocks one hour ahead on Sunday, the 12th. Daylight Savings Time begins.



Recycling Matters:

Please stop unnecessary waste.

Here are some tips from Pinellas County, which is very pro recycling. RECYCLE: collect usable materials separately from trash so that they can be transformed into new products. REDUCE: decrease the amount of garbage you generate. REUSE: use an item again instead of throwing it away.

Each week, do a little more. Each week reduce the amount of trash you put out for collection or take to the trash areas. Granted, we didn't grow up recycling, but we're not dead yet. We can learn this skill. Copy your Canadian neighbors. They know how to do this.

FYI, 77% of the incoming trash at the Solid Waste Facility in St. Petersburg could be recycled. Paper and Cardboard and Paper Board (Cereal Boxes)--28.8%; Bottles & Cans-8.3%; Yard Waste--8.5%, to just give you several examples. (I don't have the statistic for plastics and glass.)

Please take care and learn the modern habit of recycling. A few reminders: Flatten cardboard boxes. If you take paper, plastics, or glass to the recycle bins, please no plastic bags. Plastic bags go back to your grocery. Better still, recycle them. Just bring them back

for your own re-use or bring your own grocery bags. Your grocery store will give you smiles and compliments!

I hope you are enjoying the cardboard bin on the North Side and are flattening your boxes . Our next project is to have plastic and glass recycling on the North Side as well as the South.

Help for Severe Aortic Stenosis



Severe aortic stenosis is a narrowed aortic heart valve that doesn't open and close properly, reducing blood flow to the rest of the body.

Morton Plant Hospital is now enrolling eligible patients in the Medtronic Evolut R low-risk trial, which investigates the safety and effectiveness of a transcatheter aortic valve replacement (TAVR) system in patients with severe aortic stenosis who are at a low surgical mortality risk. TAVR is a minimally invasive alternative to open-heart surgery used to treat failing aortic heart valves in patients with severe aortic stenosis. Morton Plant Hospital was chosen as the first hospital in Tampa Bay to offer the TAVR procedure for patients with severe aortic stenosis who were at an intermediate or high surgical mortality risk. Our team has completed more than 700 TAVR procedures over the last five years.



Veterans Seminar March 13, 2017

veterans seminar sponsored by the Disabled American Veterans is planned to be held in the Club House at 10 a.m. to noon on Monday, March 13th. Coffee and refreshments will be available from 9:30 a.m.

All veterans, military retirees, spouses and widows of deceased veterans are invited to attend. Topics to be discussed include VA comp, hospital, widow and death benefits. For example: All vets with ALS are service-connected. WWII, Korea and Vietnam veterans may be eligible for hearing aids and VA compensation. Veterans that served in Vietnam are automatically service-connected for Type 2 Diabetes, Coronary Artery Disease, Parkinson's disease, Prostate Cancer and over 20 different types of cancer. Widows of Vietnam vets who had any of these diseases when they died may be eligible for monthly death benefits.

There are new VA Rules Establishing Presumption of Service Connection for Diseases Associated with Exposure to Contaminants in the Water Supply at Camp Lejeune, N.C.

The presumption of service-connection applies to active duty, reserve and National Guard members who served at Camp Lejeune for a minimum of 30 days (cumulative) between August 1, 1953, and December 31, 1987, and are diagnosed with any of the following conditions: adult leukemia, aplastic anemia and other myelodysplastic syndromes; bladder, kidney and liver cancers, multiple myeloma, non-Hodgkin's lymphoma and Parkinson's disease.



View from The Gate

ello everyone! We have put our Gate heads together and want to share an idea to make using The Gate easier for you and your Gate friends......

As you know, you are required to notify the Gate when you are expecting a visitor. We would like to make this real easy for you by telling you exactly what information we need from you and the order in which we would like you to give it to us:

1) Your First & Last Name 2) Your Address 3) The First Name (and last if you wish) of your guest. That's it! easy.

"Hi this is Brad Coath at 211 Mt. Piney, my friend Nate will be coming in today". We don't need a time (unless they will be arriving late in the evening or early next morning). We don't need car information. **HOWEVER**, if your guest will be driving in and out during their visit, let us know that please.

Now if your guest is **STAYING** for a day or more **and /or driving their car IN and OUT** of the community....that changes things a bit......

THEN, we need to know all of the above, PLUS when your friend is leaving, and if they are "in and out". So, "Hi, This is Brad Coath at 211 Mt. Piney, my friend Nate will be coming in on the 4th and will be coming in and out ". That information is then carried over each day and passed on to each new shift.

When the office is open, you can request a "short term" gate pass / hang tag and have it delivered to the Gate House for your guest to pick up upon their arrival. Please make sure you call the OFFICE in advance, not the Gate to request this. The Gate CANNOT issue Hang tags.



Helping Hands News

T.I.A. = Transient Ischemic Attack Now you know why they call it TIA

Many call a TIA a "mini stroke" as it has many of the same symptoms; but they do not linger or cause permanent damage. However, what they should do is alert you to the fact that you are at risk for a full blown stroke. Signs and symptoms of TIA are:

Partial numbness of the face

Jumbled words or slurred speech

Vision changes

Dizziness

It is important to seek medical treatment so you can perhaps prevent or delay permanent damage.

The underlying cause of TIA often is a buildup of cholesterol-containing fatty deposits called plaque in an artery. Plaque can decrease blood through an artery or lead to a clot. A blood clot moving through an artery that supplies blood to your brain may also cause a TIA.

Risk factors for a TIA include:

Age, family history, high blood pressure, diabetes, heart disease, sleep apnea, excess weight, lack of activity, smoking, or heavy drinking.

Evidence proves that prompt treatment of a TIA can reduce the risk of a future stroke. The goal is to improve blood flow and fix what caused the disruption. Treatment can include:

Anti-platelet drugs - like a low dose of aspirin or prescription drugs like plavix.

Anticoagulants - these affect clotting processes which are often prescribed.

Surgery - if the carotid artery is moderately or severely narrowed, you may need a carotid endarterectomy to clear blood vessels of fatty deposits and improve blood flow.

An important part of treatment is managing underlying conditions that increase stroke risk. This includes addressing and controlling high blood pressure, high cholesterol, or diabetes as well as maintaining a healthy lifestyle.
