



VETERANS SEMINAR MONDAY MARCH 9 TH, 2020....

here will be the 15th annual Veterans Seminar on Monday 9 th 2020 at 10:30 to noon at the Club house. Sponsored by the Disabled American Veterans.

All veterans, military retirees, spouses and widows of deceased veterans are invited to attend. Topics to be discussed include: VA compensation, Hospital, Widow and Death Benefits. For example: All vets with ALS are Service Connected. WWII, Korea and Vietnam veterans may be eligible for hearing aides and VA compensation. Veterans that served in Vietnam are automatically service connected for Type 2 Diabetes, Coronary Artery Disease, Parkinson's disease, Prostate Cancer and over 20 different types of cancer. Widows of Vietnam vets who had any of these diseases when they died may be eligible for monthly death benefits.

New military commissary privileges for disabled veterans.

There are new VA's Rules. The DAV will have a National Service Officer here to answer questions and assist attendees.


Searching for New Organizer of Monthly Calendar

Something to Consider – Remembering a Father

y father and I didn't get along well when I was growing up because we were very different and we didn't understand each other. I was very radical in his eyes and it scared him. Shoot, I even scared myself sometimes. He wanted to change me and I rebelled against his efforts to do so. Unfortunately, he died at age 58 when we were just beginning to build a new adult relationship. But I am very thankful that we were able to tell each oth-er "I love you" before he passed away. Don't leave this world or let someone else that you care about leave this world without telling them you love them, which means that you should be saying it a lot because you never know when your time is up. By the way, do you know where you are going when your time is up?

As I aged and raised my family, I learned to appreciate my father more. He did the very best job he could and was a good man. He wasn't extraordinary, but he was honest, loyal and hard-working. He was of that "great generation" that grew up during the Great Depression. My father married my mother when he was 20 and she was 16, and they raised 4 kids on a middle class income. He did his best to provide a good life for his wife and family. I don't remember a lot of the things he told me, and he didn't say much, but I do remember some words of wisdom that have helped me through life. Below are a few that I want to share with you.

- "Any honest hard work is good work." (Meaning, son, don't judge a man by what he does or what he has. It's his character that matters.)
- "If you have all that you need, and one or two things that you want, you have all this world has to offer." (Meaning, son, happiness doesn't come from having more and more things. It comes from appreciating and enjoying what you do have.)
- "How you manage your money will always be more important than how much money you make." (Meaning, son, you must live within your means and save for the future. You may make a lot of money in your life, but if you live beyond your means, you won't sleep well or retire comfortably.)

On the lighter side, a month or so after I had withdrawn from my second year of college because I was bewildered and without direction, he told me that I was going to have to find something else to do be-sides lay on the couch and let my hair grow. Two weeks later I shipped off to Fort Polk, Louisiana for basic training and a two-year Army enlistment. It was one of the best decisions that I ever made. I am thankful to him for being the catalyst I needed to make it.







epending on its severity, the flu virus can sicken between 9-49 million Americans. Most flu deaths involve people over 65. So, it's time to get your flu shot if you haven't already done so.

Each year scientists must predict which strains of the virus will predominate. - Follow the "six foot rule," and stay 6 feet or more away from anyone who is coughing.
- Wash your hands often, especially after you handle an object someone else was using.
- When in public, try to avoid touching your lips, eyes or nose unless you've just washed your hands.
- Get your flu shot!
- If you have symptoms, talk with your doctor and follow instructions.
- Don't fall for claims that supplements will prevent the flu. They won't!
- If you get the flu, stay home so you won't infect others.



Housing supply is low; prices are increasing

By Barefoot Realty Group, Brokerage Agent for Americana Cove

ccording to the Florida Realtors Association, the Tampa/St. Petersburg/Clearwater area saw a 20 percent decline in active listings in January 2020 over the previous year. Homes priced under \$200,000 are especially in short supply.

The supply shortage is found at every price tier throughout the U.S., notes the Association, but "it's especially pronounced at the entry-level."

At Americana Cove, any home under \$100,000 that has been updated is never on the market long, explains Broker Marty Pozgay. "Prices were stable during most of 2019, but have increased in 2020."

The challenge we see is that homeowners who are selling homes themselves are pricing their homes too low, because they don't know the market, which in turn, hurts all other residents who are trying to sell their homes as it decreases the value of all homes. "We have seen cases where residents are leaving as much as \$20,000 to \$25,000 on the table because they priced their homes too low," said Pozgay.






