ditor's Note: Now that Ione has the cast removed from her wrist – and is wearing a boot cast on her right foot – she can cook and come up with recipes for us.

The heat of summer is here, at least for most of us. For those of us who are experiencing heat, meal planning can be challenging. I know I don't like to do a lot of cooking because it heats up the house and is hot doing the cooking. Cool and refreshing salads and desserts that are easy to make are always a welcome addition to any meal. I like using Jello recipes, substituting sugar free Jello with no other change in the recipe. Not only is it refreshing, but a lot of the carbs have been removed. Here are a few of my favorites:

Orange Dreamsicle Salad

Ingredients

- 3 oz. package of orange gelatin, such as Kraft Jello
- 1/4 cup of boiling water
- 1 (16 oz.) tub of whipped cream thawed, such as Cool Whip
- 8 oz. package of cream cheese softened
- 1 (11 oz.) can of mandarin oranges

- 1. Dissolve the gelatin in the boiling water. Stir until completely dissolved
- 2. Transfer the gelatin mixture to a bowl to cool off, and start to thicken

3. Once the mixture has started to gel, and thicken, fold in the mandarin oranges with their juices

- 4. Meanwhile, in a separate bowl, mix the whipped cream and cream cheese together
- 5. Add the orange mixture to the cream mixture, and fold in
- 6. Refrigerate, covered overnight
- 7. Mix again just before serving

I have made this with different flavors of jello and used no fruit or fruit that goes with the flavor. I really like lime with no fruit.

Serving suggestion - Serve with whipped topping, and enjoy!

Strawberry Cheesecake Bar

The Strawberry Cheesecake bars will not be low carb, even if you use sugar free jello, but they taste great.

- Ingredients:
 - 1 roll refrigerated sugar cookie dough
 - 1 box (3 oz) strawberry flavor gelatin
 - 2/3 cup boiling water
 - 1 tub (16 oz) regular cottage cheese
 - 2 (8 oz) cream cheese, softened
 - 2 Tablespoons granulated sugar
 - 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
 - 1/4 cup strawberries, chopped
 - Sliced strawberries, for topping

Directions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350F degrees. Line 9x9 baking pan with foil and then spray with nonstick baking spray.
- 2. Press refrigerated sugar cookie dough into bottom of prepared baking pan. Bake for I 15-20 minutes. Let cool for 10 minutes.
- 3. In a small pan, boil water and stir in gelatin, set aside. Puree cottage cheese in food processor until creamy. Using a electric or stand mixer, mix cottage cheese mixture, gelatin, cream cheese, sugar and vanilla extract until smooth. Stir in chopped strawberries.
- 4. Pour mixture into prepared cookie crust; smooth top. Cover and refrigerate 4 hours, or until set. Garnish with sliced strawberry before serving.

Watch for the dangers of carbon monoxide

arbon monoxide (CO) is a colorless and nearly odorless gas created by the incomplete burning of solid, liquid, and gaseous fuels. It's poisonous to people and pets, so be careful. Symptoms of the poisoning are:

- Headache
- Fatigue
- Shortness of breath
- Nausea
- Dizziness

To prevent CO poisoning, take these precautions at work and at home:

- Buy and install a CO alarm. Make sure it meets safety requirements, and follow the directions for proper placement and installation.
- Install appliances properly. Most of them should be installed by a professional.
- Check your appliances. Have your heating system inspected and serviced every year.
- Only burn charcoal outdoors. Never burn it in a tent, home, garage, vehicle, etc.
- Make sure you turn off fuel-burning engine equipment when you are inside a garage or basement. Just having the doors open does not ensure your safety.
- Always follow the manual directions when servicing fuel-burning equipment.
- Do not use gas appliances, such as ranges, ovens or clothes dryers, to heat your home.
- If you use a fuel-burning appliance that is approved for indoors, make sure it is vented to the outside following the manufacturer's instructions.
- Install and use exhaust fans over gas stoves.
- Open flues when you use your fireplace.
- Choose the proper size wood-burning stove for your home.
- Have a professional inspect, clean and tune up your central heating system (furnaces, flues, and chimneys) annually.
