CLIFF'S NOTES

Rules: The Park has rules that everyone received and reviewed when they bought or rented their coach. <u>Please read and follow them</u>. Failure to follow rules is grounds for eviction, and management has shown that it is willing to evict.

No cars may be parked on the street at night. Failure to follow this rule may lead to the offending car being towed, resulting in fines. [Ed. Note: I can verify this. EVEN IF you run out to the street before they hook up your car to tow, you will get the fine.]

Cars parked on the street during the day should be staggered so emergency vehicles can pass by.

Garbage: Do not bring garbage to the bins on Monday morning. By that time, the bins are overflowing. Wait until Monday afternoon or later, when the bins are empty.

Do not put tvs in the trash.

Fires: Test your smoke detectors to make sure they work. Recommended action: purchase a fire extinguisher if you don't have one and know how to work it. If a fire starts, spray it with the fire extinguisher immediately and GET OUT OF THE HOUSE. Fire destroys mobile homes very quickly.

Visitors: Reminder:that rent is based on one or two per household. Each person above the two must pay an additional \$30 a month, including visitors who stay over 30 days. Please be proactive about this and pay the money without first being reminded.

Other announcements:

The purified water dispenser at the clubhouse operates on its own schedule. After someone has filled containers, it may take the dispenser some time to regenerate enough water for more containers. There is a light on the dispenser that tells whether it is ready.

The pool has been shocked and heated and is ready for use. Remember not to be in the pool alone.

Some have questioned why the application fee is "so high." One reason is to help cover garbage fees, since new owners usually throw away most of the furniture and electronics. Cliff is considering a fee of \$10 for each tv in newly purchased homes.

Mr. Larson (the owner) calls the lawn service for lawn care on an as-needed basis. The park pays for lawn mowing, etc., once a month but the need sometimes goes unnoticed. If you notice the lawn needs trimming, please let Cliff know so he can call Mr. Larson.

Sometimes an automobile will leak oil onto our new, nice looking pavement, creating an eyesore. If you notice a leak by your house, call Cliff to have it cleaned up. Let's keep these streets looking nice!

Lost and Found Dog/Cat: If you have found a dog or cat, you can post on a site called <u>pawboost.com</u> or call Animal Service on Walsingham. If you call, Animal Services will come out, free of charge, to pick up an animal. Any questions, please call Rose Kalp at 459-4808. We have sent quite a few animals to animal services.

PLEASE BE a responsible owner and have your animal fixed. This service is very low cost through animal services.

All Residents: Rules commonly broken:

- 1. Parking overnight on street and/or every day.
- 2. If you have someone living with you, make sure you have registered in the office.
- 3. Do not pile garbage in front of garbage bins. When you throw garbage, throw it to the back so when you open the door, it doesn't fall out and there is space.
- 4. Check mobile for cleaning, trim, awnings, driveway and/or painting. We will have someone out soon checking your mobile.

Still relevant announcements Cliff made this year at Koffee Klatch:

- 1. Keep the dumpster area neat, especially on the weekends. If the dumpster is full, please put extras neatly beside it.
- 2. Parking on the grass or sidewalk is against the rules. If necessary, park on the road.
- 3. Cars parked on the street after midnight will be towed. [Eds. Note: you have to pay the fine even if you run out before the tow truck takes your car away. We have nice neighbors who remind us when we are parked on the street at night.]
- 4. The Office must authorize overnight parking at the Clubhouse.

These messages are posted in the Clubhouse and pertain to every month:

Every Friday from 9 to noon: please turn off your hot water tanks. We use this time to fix leaks in the park.

Every Sunday at 5 p.m.: please flush your toilet(s). Our sewers were designed for more pressure than they get with low flow toilets. Flushing simultaneously will increase pressure and help keep the lines clean.

Just Sayin'



Bay Ranch Profile: Lynda and George MacNeill

o you remember the TV show "Everybody Loves Raymond"? Well, Bay Ranch has their own version but his name is not Raymond. There are no lights, TV cameras, action or anything like that. It's just that at Bay Ranch, "Everybody Loves George."

George is George MacNeill, who lives six months in Summerside, Prince Edward Island and six months at Bay Ranch along with various other Canadian and American snowbirds and residents who like to relax, enjoy the activities and soak up the Florida sunshine.

George is battling vascular dementia. He was diagnosed in August, 2014, the year before he and his wife Lynda purchased a home at Bay Ranch. But they still come every year and are welcomed by everyone in the park.

The disease comes in stages, as Lynda has experienced. "It started with confusion, then a personality change. He became verbally abusive, not the gentleman I married. It wasn't very pleasant when it started," said Lynda. "Now he's very confused and has short time memory loss."

She said there is a big change in George from last year, as he is no longer on a prescribed drug. "The doctors said the medication he was taking was no longer doing any good and a waste of time, our money and the government's money. The only thing to keep it at a slow pace is to keep active, which is why we are here in Florida.

"He's playing horseshoes and shuffleboard and I hope he can still play both next year. Everyone who plays with him is patient and understanding. He has more freedom and independence down here than back home. He can't get on his bike and go wherever he wants back home."

The MacNeills sold their home in P.E.I. last year and spend their summers in a RV park near the ocean. Just about every day an individual takes George for a 20 minute bike ride. In addition, he spends a couple days a week at a nursing home. It's much like a social club and setup like a coffee shop. He enjoys it, says Lynda.

Nevertheless, it's not Bay Ranch. To George and Lynda, Bay Ranch means everything. "He starts in July," added Lynda. "When are we going to Florida? When are we going to Florida? And he can't wait to get here. The first couple of years we were here, he would ask me when are we going back home? I don't notice that this year. This is his home."

Lynda said many of the residents are not only understanding of the circumstances but very helpful too. "Our neighbor, Maria Pesante had this place all cleaned when we arrived, the bedding washed, everything. All we had to do was open the door, walk in, then go for some groceries." When Lynda shops or has an appointment and George has just come home, Pesante checks on him every five minutes to make sure everything is okay.

Maria is not alone. There are many others at Bay Ranch who have come to the forefront. They realize the circumstances, love George and also understand that Lynda needs a break from the hectic routine. She mentioned Jimmy Jones, Jan Raabe, Joe Rodriguez, Harry and Becky Webber and Jules Vaillancourt, to name a just few who have pitched in. Raabe, for instance, takes George along with his bicycle to Safety Harbor to ride a bike trail for about four hours every Friday. That gives Lynda time to get things done around the house or other duties.

"I have found everybody in the park very helpful. That includes the management and staff. The secretary Carol has been really good to George. We call her 'Kentucky Carol' because she is from Kentucky and there are a number of Carols in the park.

"I'm lucky he doesn't wander as some do. I know if George got disoriented and knocked on anybody's door, they would help him. That's the nice part about this park and the people. This is the best place, the best therapy for him. That's what is keeping him going.

"Even the doctor said this is the best place for him. Keeping him active is going to slow down the disease more than anything else. He loves dancing and the back home, I take him to dances. But he is much quieter back home."

While she is grateful for all the assistance, it is still quite a task when you look at it, especially behind the scenes. Just getting to Florida is quite a trip, 1,945 miles to be exact, with Lynda doing all the driving and navigating. And she does that with stopovers the first three nights.

But there's more, a lot more, such as bathing, getting out his clothes to wear every day, shaving, taking a shower and so on. The daily routines we all do.

"It has become a way of life," said Lynda. "People don't see that part. They don't see that I have to tell him to brush his teeth, have a shower, remind him to use soap in the shower, the different things. Shaving is a big chore. He has an electric razor and a safety razor but he forgets. If I'm not there to supervise he is scraping his face as he forgets."

It's tough, really tough, but somehow Lynda has accepted the challenge. She has also accepted the fact that George has to be supervised. "The hardest transition for me was that George has always been the main figure of our household. He always made the decisions but discussed them with me first. Now, things are reversed, and I am in charge of everything. I find that really, really hard.

"There have been days that I thought about walking away, but I can't. It's in the vows. I can't walk away. I have to be patient. We just take every day in stride. I have accepted it."

The MacNeills have been married for 49 years. They met when both worked in a department store in Toronto. George, 20 at the time, worked as a stock boy and Lynda, 17, was *...continued onn page 34*

a part-time cashier. They dated for three years, then married. They have three children and six grandchildren.

In his heyday, George was natural athlete, playing both hockey and baseball. In hockey he was a goaltender and a pretty good one, according to newspaper stories back home in PEI. He anchored his university team to the national finals before losing, and he was a star for the Summerside Combines, an intermediate amateur club. Game after game, he made sometimes 60 to 70 saves per outing, staking his squad to one-goal victories. He loved the action and the barrage of shots, and he always found a way to rise to the occasion, especially in the big games.

George didn't start out as a goaltender according to Lynda. "He told me he didn't like taking a break on the bench. He wanted to be on the ice all the time." So to do that, he became a goaltender "And a good one," said George sitting at the table during the entire interview.

George also played baseball and said he played all the positions but Lynda clarified that saying catcher. "I loved it," added George.

However, hockey was his favorite and he played old-timers hockey well into his 50s before hanging up the blades because of an ailing shoulder. It was a case of give up hockey or forget golf down the road.

His favorite NHL team was and still is the Toronto Maple Leafs. As a boy growing up in PEI, he faithfully listened to the broadcast legend Foster Hewitt describe the Leafs, first on radio, then on black and white television, just about every game they played. The Leafs were George's team and they are to this day. Like many Leaf die-hard supporters George is hopeful that they will end the long drought dating back to 1967 and win another Stanley Cup. "They will," says George.

It was fitting this past November George was inducted into the Prince Edward Island Sports Hall of Fame for his hockey achievements over the years, joining two former Leafs from the Island--Errol Thompson and Billy MacMillan--who were previously inducted. George didn't make to the ceremony as he was already here at Bay Ranch keeping active, but his daughter and granddaughter represented George.

Hopefully down the road Lynda will be honored in some way for all the sacrifices and care she has done and for all the patience she has shown. In fact, she deserves a gold medal. After all, she has really made it all possible. For at Bay Ranch, "Everybody loves George."

A tireless fighter for a cause

B orn Feb. 15, 1820, Susan B. Anthony devoted her life to the fight for social justice and reform. She began her activism as a member of the American Anti-Slavery Society in the years leading up to the civil war. In 1866 she founded the American Equal Rights Association with Elizabeth Cady Stanton, and the pair embarked on a mission to secure civil liberties for all citizens regardless of their gender or race. This work would lead Anthony and Stanton to found the National Women's Suffrage Association, where they continued to advocate for women's voting rights.

Anthony died on March 13, 1906, 14 years before her work would be realized. In 1920, the 19th Amendment was added to the U. S. Constitution, giving women the right to vote. In 1979 the U.S. Treasury Department honored Anthony by placing her image on the dollar coin.

Happy Fat Tuesday

his year the revelry of the carnival season will culminate on Tuesday, Feb. 13, in celebrations around the world before the start of Lent.

In the United States, the city of New Orleans is the capital for all things Mardi Gras, which is French for "Fat Tuesday."
