




Vakesh Rajani, M.D.

Fire and Memories

few weeks ago four fire trucks and the fire chief vehicle made a splashing grand entrance to Blue Jay. I could hear the sirens coming. The back of my house is so situated that I can see the entrance. I watched the trucks come in and was amazed of how they could make the turn without upsetting. I was thinking I might have a fire truck in my back yard. Being good fire fighter drivers they made the turn and responded to the home at 195 Timber Run Drive. Fortunately the fire was not serious. However, it did have a lot of street observers and I, being one of them stood on the sidewalk between my home and Emil's home so I could see the backyard of 195. I was joined shortly by other street observers and I, being the oldest in residency

and by age related to my co-observers that there had been two serious fires here in Blue Jay destroying both homes and treasured items in the homes.

The first fire was in 1988 when the home at 116 Maple Leaf Drive occupied by Jim and Virginia Humphries was destroyed by fire. The home next to them 115 was owned



by Ned Harkness and was not occupied at the time. Ned sold the home to the Humphries 116 then became a vacant lot after the home was removed. Gary Moltenbrey and Lois Janice lived at 129 Cedar Drive. Gary was our mailman at the time and Lois was a real estate person selling homes here in Blue Jay. They decided they would buy the vacant lot and have a new home put in and moved in shortly after. Gary and Lois lived there until 1990 when they sold the home to Duane and Joanne Wyman.

The second fire was on December 17th 1991 at the home of Henry and Lois Morgan 130 Cedar Drive. It too was destroyed by the fire. Lois and Henry lost a lot of their valuables including all of Lois's Shirley Temple outfits. By February 1992 their new home was ready for them to move back. Lois still resides there today.
