James Judge Gilmore

August 31, 1920 to August 4, 2019



Tim was born to Edward Gilmore and Mary Mimnaugh in New York, New York. He had three siblings, Frank, Rita and Jack who were 20 to 28 years older than Jim and one sibling, Edward, younger than Jim who died in his early childhood. Jim went to Blessed Sacrament Catholic School in Bayside, Long Island. I met Jim's first grade teacher after Mass and she recognized Jim. God bless her.

Jim was 17 or 18 when he worked in the CCC, Civilian Conservation Corps. that was established by President Franklin D. Roosevelt during the Great Depression. Jim was sent to Las Vegas to work at building roads and earned \$25 a month to send to his Mom. Jim had no memories of his father. When it was learned that his Mom was sick, he was sent back to New York State to fight the Elm Disease and kill the gypsy moths. He was taught

how to climb a tree with a length of rope.

Because Jim's brothers and sister were so much older than Jim, he was happy to be like a brother to the kids in the Gessner family, Babe, Arnold, Buddy, and Ruthie. Mrs. Gessner and Mrs. Gilmore were great friends. Jim was always included in Gessner family gatherings and they welcomed me when Jim and I got married. My brother, Bill, said when I met Jim, my life was better and when Jim met me, his life was better.

In November of 1940, Jim signed up in the army. After about a year of training, he was going to get on a ship to England when he called his brother Frank at his office, and his secretary told him that he was at his mother's funeral. Jim got on the ship and found the Captain's cabin, banged on his door, and the Captain told him that not even he could get off this ship now.

Jim went overseas on the Queen Mary with the 1st. Division including men, and equipment and vehicles. It was crowded to say the least. Men ate in shifts and slept in shifts. Jim was in the infantry and volunteered to be a messenger dispatcher which meant that he was a runner from battalion to company, bringing messages that he kept in his head back and forth. I asked Jim why he volunteered for that job. He told me, as only Jim could, that the food was better at battalion. Jim met his objective in each of these campaigns: Algeria-French, Morocco, NormandyOmaha Beach, the second wave, Northern France, Rhineland, Rome, Sicily and Tunisia. Jim came home in September of 1945. When Jim came home from the war, he lived with his brother Jack and his wife Hazel, and their two boys, Bobby and Jack. Hazel was like a second mother to me after Jim and I married. In time, Jim and some of the Gessner boys, took a road trip to Maine. Jim loved Maine and decided to return, and got a job working in the woods. Later, still in Maine, he worked at Saco- Lowell Shops which was one of the largest textile machine manufacturers in the United States. When the mill in the shops moved to South Carolina, Jim chose to stay in Maine. He then started a life style that pretty much lasted until he married me, a Connecticut high school math teacher, who he met at summer camp run by the son of his friends, Marie and Jerry McConnell. Jim worked at the River Club



in Kennebunkport during the summer and then headed down to Flushing, NY, to help Arnold Gessner in his jewelry store over the holidays, and then headed to Naples, FL, working at the Naples Hotel. Come summer, he timed it so he could go to the Masters at the Augusta National Golf Club, before he headed back to Kennebunkport, ME.

Then, on June 19, 1976, Jim and I got married at Saint John's Catholic Church in Old Saybrook, CT. Can you guess some of our guests? Arnold Gessner was Jim's best man, David McConnell, Jack Gilmore, and Bill Gritzmacher were his ushers. There were many teachers from my school, along with all the Gilmores, Gessners, and Gritzmachers.

Jim and I lived in Torrington, CT, but when school was out we headed up to Maine. We both worked many summers at KBIA, a summer day camp for kids run by David McConnell. Jim was the maintenance man and he also worked with the CITs, counselors in training.

Jim and I never had children of our own, but we certainly loved working with kids. We enjoyed our nephews and nieces, and great and great -great nephews and nieces. We had many years to enjoy our camp in Maine and our cottage on PEI. We have been blessed. Later in life, we both enjoyed living in Florida in a mobile home park. We first lived at Bay Pines and then after that park got sold, we found and moved to Boca Ciega in 2005. When we write our Christmas cards, we start in PEI, and come down the east coast. Jim was part of the Greatest Generation. The world would have been quite different if all of those young men and women did not give all they could for the rest of us. Both Jim and I can say that we have loved and been loved.






