2019 Pool Resolution The Board of Directors of Briar Creek I had a meeting with our attorney, Ben Rabin; and this resolution is the combined effort our legal counsel and the BC1 BOD. Together, we have reviewed the concerns of our community in reference to the community pool. Historically, since our beginning, there have been children's hours at the BC1 pool. In an attempt to be reasonable to homeowners and guests, there have always been 3 hours each day for 'Adults Only'. As recently as January 2018 we expanded the pool hours by 2 hours each day, opening the pool 2 additional hours making the hours 8 am to 10 pm daily.

Out of these 14 hours each day, only 3 hours have been restricted as 'Adults Only.' Briar Creek 1 is an exempt community for 55+ residents. We have always tried to be reasonable in all our restrictions. Since the pool is open 14 hours daily, 11 hours are available for minors with adult supervision and 3 hours are 'Adult Only'. In an effort to be reasonable to homeowners and guests, the following rules will be effective immediately, upon Board of Directors approval:

Pool hours are 8 a.m. to 10 p.m. (14 hours total)

1 p.m. to 4 p.m. (Adults only)

In an effort to be reasonable we have moved the Adult only hours to 1p.m. to 4 p.m. and are reinstating the holiday hours for Christmas and Easter weeks. The week before and the week following Christmas and Easter, the pool will be open 8 a.m. to 10 p.m. with NO adult only hours. Visiting minors with adult supervision will be entitled to swim anytime during the hours the pool is open. We believe this provides unrestricted swimming during the most common visitor time frame of the year. Effective 4/10/2019

Annual Inspections

Inspections are an incredible undertaking, especially with all of the follow-up paperwork that's created this time of year. As I was thinking about the re-inspections I'll be doing throughout the summer, it dawned on me: why not spread the inspections out over the entire year? Frankly, it would be easier on the Inspection Committee if we turn it into a 12-month project. Therefore, I'm asking each resident to let me know which month they would prefer to have their home inspected. Many of you request a delayed inspection anyways (especially for home washing during the "pollen-heavy" months); now you can pick the month you want to do the work, and not have to request that delay every single year. Scheduling your work should also be easier, as we won't be trying to hire help all at the same time.

On most Wednesdays, you'll find Joanne Barr and myself at coffee hour with schedules where you can sign up for your inspection month. We'll be giving priority for January-April to our snowbird residents, as they need to schedule the work during the months they're here. In return for that priority, I will need some "early" snowbirds to schedule their inspections in October, November or December. I'm asking year-round residents to allow us some latitude for scheduling your inspections during the summer months, but that means you'll have 15 to 18 months before your next inspection.

This will be done on a first-come, first-served basis, so please get to coffee hour as soon as possible. Or you may notify me, but you MUST select at least two (2) months in which we can do your inspection. PLEASE: I will do this only by email or written notice dropped off at the Director's office (inside the Clubhouse): NO PHONE CALLS. Send your monthly choices to: jeff@mybriarcreek.com

Some reminders: overnight parking in the street is prohibited. Parking on the grass also is prohibited.

Exercise room: The equipment has been adjusted and all equipment is running good. If you find any issues, please call me.

Fertilizers: There are certain types of fertilizers that shouldn't be used near the water. If you live on the pond do not use fertilizers which contain phosphorus. When it rains the phosphorus will run into the lakes and promote algae. The algae rob the lake of oxygen which the fish and aquatic life desperately need. If you recall, this is what happened to Dove Pond where we found a large number of dead fish and quite a smell. It takes just 1 pound of phosphorus fertilizer entering a pond to produce 500 pounds of algae. When purchasing fertilizer be careful to get a type that states it is non-phosphorus. Also, if you have a lawn company spray your lawn, be sure to ask them to please use a non-phosphorus fertilizer near the water.
