

We hope you are all staying safe and healthy as COVID-19 continues to be present in Florida.

We are spotlighting some of our long-term residents in the next few "Neighbor-to-Neighbor" articles. It is amazing how Briar Creek has changed over the years since its founding in 1977!

I had the pleasure of speaking by phone to one of our Phase 1 residents, Beverly Alho, who moved into the park with her husband in that first year, 1977. We



had a wonderful conversation about how things were back then.

When she and her husband moved into Briar Creek, there were only a few mobile homes set up in the park at the time. When they bought their house on Sugar Bear, she said, "We knew the park was growing." There was "nothing here" back then. McMullen-Booth was a 2-lane road, there was no hospital, no Medical Arts, no grocery stores, no fire station, and no police station.

The pool was in progress of being built and afterwards, the Alhos would meet a large group of friends at the pool every evening. They all became close friends. "Now, they've either moved back north, gone into a nursing home or passed away. Those were fun times," she said. In the beginning, there was no clubhouse, no Board of Directors, and no shuffleboard.

After the clubhouse was built, Beverly and her husband attended dinners, shows, holiday activities, and Bingo. When the first Board of Directors was instilled, rules for keeping the park beautiful were ratified. "I'm glad they did," she said.

I asked Beverly how old she is because, in my head, living in Briar Creek 43 years and assuming she was 55 when they moved in, then she must be 98! We had a good laugh because Beverly is actually a young 75 years old and moved into the park at age 32. "The 55+ restriction came in the early 80s but they never allowed families with kids to live here." Since she and her husband had no children, that was a big draw for the Alhos. "It's always been so quiet and peaceful here."

Beverly has always loved animals and when they added a Pet Section, she was really happy. I asked her about other wildlife in the area in the late 70s. The park was surrounded by fields, grass and had no fences. At the time there was an abundance of wildlife; turtles, armadillos, bob cats, possums, raccoons, and coyotes. Once, when she was sitting outside in her back yard, she saw a wild pig. "I kind of adopted her. Every night, she would come," Beverly said. "I

named her Miss Piggy and my dogs loved her. She came for several years and would sit on my lap sometimes." Eventually, Beverly found a "pig rescue" in north Florida where Miss Piggy could live out her days.

Yes, We Do Have Seasons

ere in Florida, many trees drop their leaves in the fall or early winter, just as they do in the northern states. For example, red maple can be found throughout Florida, and other trees that drop leaves include sweetgum (liquidambar) and crape myrtle.

Cypress trees have leaves and shape that look similar to evergreen trees, but they also drop their leaves. The leaves of the two cypresses near the benches overlooking Dove Lake will start to turn coppery and then fall as the weather turns cooler. The trees aren't dead, only dormant for the winter.

By contrast, the Southern magnolia stays green and keeps its leaves year round. The leathery leaves are shiny and dark green on the top, but the undersides are naturally a rusty brown.

The Southern live oak keeps its leaves for a long time—all through winter. Come spring, the live oak drops its old leaves in a rush as the new buds start to come out. (That's why we end up raking in March!) Live oaks are beautiful trees—the Baranoff Oak near the Safety Harbor Library is an awesome example.




