

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN BRIAR CREEK

EMINDER – PLEASE TAKE NOTE

With elections approaching, the Board of Directors would like to clarify the applicable Restrictions of Phase 1 concerning signage in our Community. Below is the portion of the bylaw restrictions that apply.



"14. After notification to the Board of Directors, one 14" by 12" "FOR SALE" sign may be permitted inside a window of a mobile home unit. During an "OPEN HOUSE", one sign on the premises, and one 18" x 24" directional sign per owner or real estate company will be allowed. *No other signs of any kind shall be displayed on anything within the Park without authorization from the Board of Directors.* General notices and articles for sale may be prepared for posting on the bulletin board after approval by the Board of Directors. Any "OPEN HOUSE" shall be attended by either a representative of the owner or a real estate agent at all times."

FOOD FOR THOUGHT

ne of my father's favorite sayings was, "When the going gets tough, the tough get going". I will borrow from his motivation and courage and suggest that we apply that in our everyday life while we disregard all the negativity and pessimism on social media, TV media and sometimes even our friends and neighbors.

Speaking of motivation, for those of us who like to keep busy I'd like to share a homemade bread recipe that requires very little effort and that produces a quantity suitable for one or two people. It only requires 4 ingredients, needs no special pans or mixer, there's no kneading or complicated shaping involved, and 95% of the work is hands-off. You also have the option to bake one half of the dough today and keep the other piece of dough in the refrigerator up to 3 days and bake it then. You will appreciate this recipe too because it delivers delicious flavor, a slightly crisp and mega chewy crust, and those signature soft holes inside like a ciabatta or French bread. Ingredients

- 3 and 1/4 cups **flour** plus more for hands and pan
- 2 teaspoons instant yeast
- 2 teaspoons coarse salt
- 1 and 1/2 cups cool water

Note: **Salt**: Use a coarse salt, such as coarse sea salt, in this bread. If you only have fine salt, reduce to 1 and 1/2 teaspoons.

Instructions

- 1. In a large ungreased mixing bowl, whisk the flour, yeast, and salt together. Pour in the cool water and gently mix together with a rubber spatula or wooden spoon. The dough will seem dry and shaggy, but keep working it until all the flour is moistened. If needed, use your hands to work the dough ingredients together. The dough will be sticky. Shape into a ball in the bowl as best you can.
- 2. Cover the dough tightly with plastic wrap or aluminum foil and set on the counter at room temperature. Allow to rise for 2-3 hours. The dough will just about double in size, stick to the sides of the bowl, and have a lot of air bubbles.
- 3. You can continue with step 4 immediately, but for absolute best flavor and texture, I strongly recommend letting this risen dough rest in the refrigerator for at least 12 hours and up to 3 days. Place covered dough in the refrigerator for 12 hours 3 days. I usually let it rest in the refrigerator for about 18 hours. The dough will puff up during this time, but may begin to deflate after 2 days. That's fine and normal– nothing to worry about.

- 4. Lightly dust a large nonstick baking sheet (with or without rims and make sure it's nonstick) with flour and/or cornmeal. Turn the cold dough out onto a floured work surface. Using a sharp knife or bench scraper, cut dough in half. Some air bubbles will deflate as you work with it. Place dough halves on prepared baking sheet. Using floured hands, shape into 2 long loaves about 9×3 inches each (doesn't have to be exact) about 3 inches apart. Loosely cover and allow to rest for 45 minutes. You will bake the dough on this prepared baking sheet.
- 5. During this 45 minutes, preheat the oven to 475°F (246°C).
- 6. When ready to bake, using a very sharp knife or bread lame (some even use kitchen shears), score the bread loaves with 3 slashes, about 1/2 inch deep. ("Score" = shallow cut.) If the shaped loaves flattened out during the 45 minutes, use floured hands to narrow them out along the sides again.

Note: **Round Loaf:** If you want to shape all the dough into a boule (round loaf) simply shape into a round ball instead of 2 loaves in step 4. Baking instructions are the same, but the loaf will take a few extra minutes in the oven.

Safety Guidelines for Hurricanes

Before a Hurricane

- Secure your property. Permanent storm shutters offer the best protection for windows and doors. A second option is to board up your windows with 5/8" marine plywood—cut to fit and ready to install. Tape does not prevent window glass from breaking.
- Install straps or additional clips to securely fasten your roof to the frame structure. This will reduce roof damage.
- Trim trees and shrubs around your home to minimize the risk of broken branches and debris.
- Clear loose and clogged rain gutters and downspouts to prevent misdirected flooding.
- If you have a boat, determine how and where to secure your vessel.
- Keep articles in your basement elevated to avoid damage from even minor flooding.
- Put any valuables on high shelves or on a higher floor of your house. This includes photograph albums and irreplaceable keepsakes.
- Keep any household chemicals on high shelves and ensure they have tight caps. Chemicals that mix into floodwaters are very dangerous and unsafe.
- Consider building a safe room.
- Buy a fire extinguisher.
- Make sure all pets have ID tags.
- Prepare a document file to take with you in case you need for insurance later! Photograph or scan important documents like driver's licenses, social security cards, passports, prescriptions, tax statements and other legal papers. Upload the images online for safekeeping. Store hard copies in a watertight container you will bring with you.
- Keep a well-stocked Emergency Survival Kit in case you lose power. This includes any prescription medicines, three days' worth of food and water (for pets, too), and cash.
- Find all local emergency shelters. Know your evacuation route. Have a "to go" bag ready if needed.
- Fill plastic bottles with drinking water. Think about what you might need if you are isolated for a number of days and must endure a power outage.
- Fully fuel your vehicles.
- Download the Red Cross Emergency App for iPhone or Android. Or text: "GETCANE" to 90999

As a Hurricane Approaches

If a hurricane is likely in your area, you should:

- Stay informed by monitoring the storm via local radio, NOAA radio, TV, and internet. Listen for alerts to evacuate.
- Secure your home and close storm shutters. Even awnings can be broken and picked up



by strong winds and potentially become a projectile.

- Bring all lawn furniture, grills, trash barrels, bikes, hanging plants, toys, and gardening tools inside or tied down in a secure spot.
- Turn off utilities if instructed by authorities to do so. Otherwise, turn the refrigerator and freezer thermostat to its coldest setting and keep its doors closed.
- Move freezable items from the fridge to the freezer.
- Turn off propane tanks.
- Ideally, move any electronics to higher shelves to keep away from water damage.
- Have your cell phone on a charger so it's ready to go. Then avoid using the phone except for serious emergencies.
- Remember: Have a certain amount of cash available. If power is lost, ATMs may not be working.
- Moor your boat if time permits.
- Ensure a supply of water for sanitary purposes such as cleaning and flushing toilets. Fill the bathtub and other large containers with water.
- Have on hand: fire extinguisher, emergency/first aid kit, prescription medicines, flashlight/batteries, blankets/sleeping bags, cooking/eating utensils, canned foods, water bottles, jumper cables, paper maps, GPS, toilet paper, toiletries, rain gear,
- Stay inside.

Evacuate under the following conditions:

- If you are directed by local authorities to do so. Do so immediately (do not wait!) and be sure to follow their instructions.
- If you live in a mobile home or temporary structure—such shelters are particularly hazardous during hurricanes (no matter how well fastened to the ground).
- If you live in a high-rise building—hurricane winds are stronger at higher elevations.
- If you live on the coast, on a floodplain, near a river, or on an inland waterway.
- If you feel that you are in danger.

Have an arranged meeting place for your family in case you get separated! One of the biggest issues in hurricanes is not knowing if your loved ones are safe. Remember that cell phones may not work. You need to communicate ahead of time (like the "old" days)!

Only return once the authorities declare it is safe. Avoid all flood waters! Never drive or walk on flooded roads.

During a Hurricane

If you are have not evacuated, go to your safe room. If you do not have a safe room, follow these guidelines:

- Stay indoors and away from windows and glass doors.
- Close all interior doors—secure and brace external doors.
- Keep curtains and blinds closed. Do not be fooled if there is a lull; it could be the eye of the storm—winds will pick up again.

- Take refuge in a small interior room, closet, or hallway on the lowest level.
- Lie on the floor under a table or another sturdy object.

After a Hurricane

Recovering from a disaster is usually a gradual process. Safety is a primary issue, as are mental and physical well-being.

- Let your friends and family know that you are safe.
- Do not return home unless authorized to avoid electrical hazards and other dangers.
- Do NOT drink tap water unless authorized to do so.
- Check the temperature in your fridge or freezer. Anything that has remained at 40 degrees Fahrenheit or colder is safe to eat. Otherwise, throw it out to be safe.
- Also, throw away ANY food that has come in contact with flood waters which may carry waterborne diseases, chemicals, etc. Better safe than sorry.
- Document any damage with photos and contact your insurance company.
- In your home, immediately remove or air out water-damaged items. It's critical to minimize the chance of mold growing in your home.
- Do NOT drive or walk through floodwaters which may be electrically-charged and filled with contaminants; just six inches of moving flood water will knock a grown man down. Do NOT underestimate the power of moving waters.



hile I was at the Phase 2 Clubhouse looking through Volume 1 1977-1982, I had the good fortune to listen to 5 neighbors social distancing, talk about their finding Briar Creek after looking for 6 months, picking out a vacant lot, wanting a specific location because of the water flow, the cow pasture just north of Briar Creek, and now that Jim has passed who is the longest living Phase 2 resident/s. I will ask their permission and we will profile them for next month.

There were many firsts. The first 8 homes in Briar Creek Phase 2 were set up in June through September 1980. The ground breaking ceremony for Phase 2 Recreational Hall was in November 1980. The building was completed in May 1981 and given a name change to Clubhouse. Bill and Coulette Dompier hosted the first get acquainted party in December 1980 for their 7 neighbors. In March 1981, the Briar Creek Social Club Phase 2 was formed. The meeting was at the Fowble's home with 17 families attending. The agenda for the first meeting was; Recreational Hall and pool rules suggested swim and name tags were suggested, and management would supply the Recreational Hall with pool table, tables and chairs. The second Social Club meeting was in the Clubhouse. Coffee hour began in September 1981.

September 1981 Briar Creek 2 News had its inaugural article in the Briar Creek monthly media. This was the last paragraph. "Many new residents are moving in this month. Remember - be friendly - make them feel they did the right thing by choosing Briar Creek 2 for their new

home - because you and I know that we made the right decision!" The next month, October 1981 issue, Phase 2 became full partners with Phase 1 in the presentation of Briar Creek Newsletter.

We commend and are grateful for all the individuals over the past 43 years, who were diligent in keeping pictures, newspaper articles and monthly medias in the many scrapbook volumes for us neighbors now. Thank you Marge, for graciously stepping in to finish this year's Phase 2 volume.





included at all, several with outdated phone numbers or no phone number and several listings for owner residents and renters who no longer live in the park.

We agreed that we should ask the people most involved with new residents and renters for their opinions, so we asked the President of the Social Club to set up a small Ad Hoc Group with whom we could consult. This group was composed of



Lois Heisdorf as President of the Social Club, Joan Davies because of her work with the Board of Directors on the interviews with prospective residents, Ruth Miller and Brenda Greene because of their work as the Welcome Committee visiting each new resident family, Pete Loranger because of his role in the distribution of the Directory, and Art and myself. We owe this group a big thankyou for putting up with a large numbers of emails and paper documents to review and comment on.

We reviewed the Florida Statute which allows parks like ours to produce a Directory with the names of all residents, and we have revised the form that has been used in the past permitting the inclusion of telephone numbers with the residents' approval. The new form clarifies that the park has the right to list the names of all residents, with or without phone numbers, and that the approval to publish a telephone number extends to any new numbers used by the resident. The current form technically only allows the publication of a specific number and in checking the directory we found that a large number of these phone numbers were no longer in use as so many people no longer have land lines and rely on cell phones only. Just to make it clear, we will continue to ask residents for their agreement before publishing their phone number.

In looking at the current Directory carefully we found that there are several residents whose names are not included and also there are many households where a second person (often a family member) now lives with the resident originally approved by the Board of Directors but this additional person is frequently not included in the Directory. We have been told that this gap causes difficulties when a resident is looking in the Directory for someone they know lives here but is not listed as a resident in order to deliver a card or a message.

Another area of confusion has been the inclusion of some renters but not all, and the names of those who were included often continued to be listed long after the renters have left. So we have proposed that the names of long term renters (one year or more) will be included but not the names of short term renters. Instead we will publish the names of these renters in the Monthly Media (with their agreement). With more sharing of information about lease terms, we can delete renters' names when their lease is over.

Because of the covid situation and the closure of the clubhouse, the work of this group turned into an email consultation where we sent everyone a document which identified the concerns, and proposed some options for resolving them. This was also the opportunity for group members to identify other concerns or options. The group was asked to identify the options they thought most appropriate. The responses were collated and a "results" paper was then sent to the President of the Board of Directors to make sure that all proposed changes were acceptable.

We now have the go-ahead from Ron Prevost on behalf of the Board to implement a number

of changes. These changes will not mean a radical overhaul, but we hope that the result over time will be that the Directory will be a "Community Directory" where all of our approved residents will be included and the Directory itself will be up to date and more helpful.

However so that we don't cause confusion or upset any of our current residents, the new ways of listing will not be retroactive, but will apply only to newly approved residents. We will of course encourage anyone currently approved to live here but not listed to contact us so their names can be included in the next Directory. Likewise with phone numbers, any resident whose phone number is not included is encouraged to contact us to change their entry.

We started introducing these changes on September 1 with the information collected from all new residents coming to live in the park. The names of all new residents will be added to the Directory. For current residents whose name and phone number are not included in the current Directory, we hope to be able to contact each person to encourage the inclusion of their information in the next Directory.


