Association Contractors

discussion and disagreement on the time to engage a contractor for repair or maintenance of Briar Creek Common Elements arose at the Board of Directors Implementing on January 6th. Some are of the opinion the Board can engage a contractor within 24 hours to commence on repairs or maintenance. While an individual home owner can obtain service immediately and maybe in some cases in one or two days the Board does not have the ability to operate in that time frame. The Association is a Florida Corporation under Florida statue 718. Prior to accepting a contractor the Association must first receive a Certification of Liability Insurance. This can take several days or more for the contractor's insurance agent to provide the document. Once received the board must meet with a quorum, four or more directors, and agree to accept the contractor and proposal. Florida statue 718 requires a notice be posted 72 hour prior to the meeting. An emergency or special meeting of the board under Roberts Rules of Order page 91 lines 30-31 states "A special meeting (or called meeting) is a separate session of a society held at a time different from that of any regular meeting, and convened only to consider one or more items of business specified in the call of the meeting. Notice of the time, place, and purpose of the meeting, clearly and specifically describing the subject matter of the motions or items of business to be brought up, must be sent to all members a reasonable number of days in advance.". The board is bound by these conditions therefore engaging a contract or contractor can take in most cases a week or more. It is sometimes more prudent to deal with the current contractor to complete a task and then later consider options for replacement of the contractor when time is at the board's advantage. The board does not have in many cases the luxury of speedy results. Sometimes you must work with what you have and later determine if another contractor is in the best interest of the Association.

PLEASE Don't Do It!

eeding wildlife is generally discouraged and, in some cases, *illegal*. In Florida, it is illegal to feed manatees, sand hill cranes, bears, raccoons, foxes, and alligators. Intentionally placing food or garbage, allowing the placement of food or garbage, or offering food or garbage in such a manner that it attracts certain species is not only a public nuisance, but it is prohibited by law.

Feeding certain animal and bird species is prohibited because it can negatively alter feeding behavior in some species and can cause them to become accustomed to people. In other words, feeding wildlife often has a detrimental rather than a helpful effect. Feeding animals may cause some species to concentrate so much on this supplemental feeding that they become a nuisance or a threat to people.

Even though you may think you're doing a favor to wild birds and animals, you are more likely giving them a death sentence. If you're feeding wildlife on a regular basis, please don't. Animals are happier when they forage for their own food. Besides making them self-sufficient, it's much better for their health. A diet of hot dogs, breads, snack foods, etc., are not conducive to healthy wildlife and poor nutrition can spread disease. The animals will thank you! Plus, you won't have to worry about being cited and/or fined by a Florida conservation life officer.

Table Tennis

- 1. The recently purchased Table Tennis setup is located in the NW corner of the Clubhouse.
- 2. Any resident, family or friends are certainly welcome to use this equipment on a first come/first serve basis. Obviously, its use must be scheduled so that it does not interfere with other coinciding events in the Clubhouse. If the noise of play conflicts with other clubhouse activities in the clubhouse, the bi-fold doors can be closed to resolve that issue. The doors divide the clubhouse floor from east and west. When in use, the tennis table should be set up on the west side of the clubhouse.
- 3. This equipment was quite expensive; we purchased a quality product, so please do not abuse it. If the equipment is used judiciously, it will last a long time and maintain its usefulness. Use of this equipment would follow the same rules that apply, in general, to the swimming pool privileges, etc.
- 4. Presently, every Wednesday evening at 7:00PM has been planned to have those interested in playing to come and enjoy.
- 5. Be sure when using this equipment to leave the Hall the way you found it.
- 6. Most importantly, please be very careful putting up and taking down of this table.
 - a) When putting the table half down, note the <u>red handle</u> allows the release of the lock. You MUST hold the table from dropping HARD and it is quite HEAVY.
 - b) When putting the table half vertical to put away, the <u>red release</u> is located on the right side end of the table underneath. Again, the table is quite HEAVY, so please be very careful. When the table is completely up, push a bit to be sure that it is securely

LOCKED.

7. When rolling the table about to position to play, make sure that the two wheels with a locking mechanism is released. Also push the table (not from the TOP, but as low as you can as the table can be TOP HEAVY. "Top heavy" means that it could flip over if one is not careful.

- 8. The equipment necessary to play is stored near the netted table; i.e., a cover for the folded-up table, as well as four (4) paddles with ping pong balls in a case on the library bookcase right next to the stored table. Please keep in mind the Social Club paid for the equipment, so please handle with care.
- 9. There is a sign up sheet on the Phase I bulletin board; the sheet is for anyone interested. Keep in mind you do not need to be a good and/or experienced player to participate in this fun activity.
