PROXIES FOR ANNUAL MEETING – DECEMBER 5, 2016 Joann Barr

To all Briar Creek Property Owners:

You will be receiving in the mail from Progressive Management your General/Limited Proxy. It is important that all owners submit their proxy for our Annual Meeting scheduled for 10:00AM, Monday, December 5, 2016. Your completed SIGNED Proxy ensures the Board of Directors will be allowed to conduct business during 2017. Unsigned proxies will not be counted.

Be sure you vote for each issue as explained in the Proxy. A quorum of owners (159 of 317) is required to pass the listed issues. If we do not have a quorum our monthly maintenance fees will go up considerably. Only one Proxy is valid per property. If you own two properties, submit a proxy for each one. Please show your Unit Number, then date and SIGN your Proxy before submitting. The signature must be any owner on the title. If you change or have changed the title or mailing address since purchasing you need to let Progressive Management know.

You must submit your Proxy prior to 10:00AM on December 5, 2016.

There are several ways to submit your Proxy:

- 1. Drop in the mail slot at Clubhouse Director's Office.
- 2. Give to Jo Ann Barr any time, or drop off at 106 Cedar Elm Drive, put in black mail box at back door.
- 3. Mail to Progressive Management



It is recommended that your Proxy be dropped at the Director's Office or given to Jo Ann Barr. Mailing slows the tally process. Early submission insures there are enough proxies received to conduct business during the 2017 year.

PARKING ON THE GRASS

know we have covered this in many greeting sessions with new residents and many existing residents have heard this before.



For the benefit of anyone not hearing this before, here it is again. PLEASE DO NOT PARK YOUR VECHILE ON THE GRASS. I know you may be able to move it when the Lawn Maintenance people arrive. And I know there was some reason that made sense to you, but if your vehicle is parked on our grass, beyond the aesthetic view to visitors and residents, there is a cost related issue. The weight of your vehicle, maybe not the first time, but eventually it will weaken or break the water lines that are 1 - 2 feet below the surface. That requires a plumber and cost the Association \$300 - \$500 and possibly more in some circumstances. Many of the lines in the community are in that 5 foot easement in front of your property. So beyond the inconvenience it causes when we shut off your water, it's also a cost factor we all must pay which means you pay. I know that only works out to about \$1 or \$2 per month on your monthly Maintenance Fee but that's not money well spent.

SAND IN THE STREET

A fter the most recent continuous rain and previous heavy rain events, I have seen evidence of large quantities of sand on some streets.. Not being an erosion expert, I have evaluated the sand and believe it is residue left from a property where soil has been washed away. This means that if the soil is not returned or the cause of the erosion is not altered, someone's understructure also may be eroding. If you see large quantiles of soil or sand in the street after a rain storm, I suggest you evaluate your downspouts from the roof. Are they disbursing the rainwater evenly or are they concentrated into one area? If your downspouts are connected above or below ground, is all of the rain being redirected to the street? If it is just redirected to another property then they may be the ones experiencing soil erosion. If soil or sand is coming from these connections there could be a breach.in your connection system. Many homes are downhill of the runoff so it may not be your unit but one upstream so to speak. Someday you may look under you home and see a space between your building and the pillars designed to hold it up.

The Board has discussed this situation and we do not have the authority or power to change it, only to monitor it and make you aware. We strongly suggest that you perform an inspection on the underbelly of your unit...make sure Hermine did not wash away sand and/or soil. Check your downspouts, make sure they are directed properly.



October is FIRE PREVENTION MONTH...ARE YOU READY?

In October 2012 I had just completed a 10 days mission/vision trip to Ahmedabad, India and was headed home the next day. Before going to bed, I laid out my clothes for the return trip, packed up everything I could and laid down for the night. Early the next morning I was awakened by my teammate from across the hall beating on the door, yelling: "There's a Fire!" What about you...are you prepared for a fire?

According to the National Fire Protection Association, 51 percent of fires in manufactured homes were reported as having NO smoke alarms present. The following are safety tips to consider...

• Keep smoke alarms working. Never remove or disable a smoke alarm. If you do not have alarms and cannot afford them, the Safety Harbor Fire Department will supply you with one.

• Make sure you have enough smoke detectors. You can never have too many. They can be purchased at WalMart for under \$10. There should always be an alarm in your sleeping area!

• Know your escape plan. Is your bedroom in the back of the house away from the door? If so, can you open your windows easily for an escape route?

• Have an Emergency Notebook. This can be a binder that has all your essential information in it. (Birth certificates or copies, copies of all insurance policies or just the info page, car titles or copies, list of current prescriptions, copies of driver's license, a phone list of everyone

we might need to call ASAP, including insurance agents, wills and medical directives, rabies certificates for all pets, credit card info, etc..

• If you are dependent on medications, keep them ALL together so you can easily drop them in a container in a rush.

Final lesson learned: Be grateful for what you have every day. It can always get worse, and it can all be gone in a flash. We have great fire protection with the Safety Harbor Fire Station in close proximity to the park, but I would rather feed them donuts than see them in action within Briar Creek!


