BOARD BUSINESS and UPDATES

From the Desk of - Jeff Clark, President

Under Florida law, our community is a condominium, albeit a very unique one. When you hear the word "condominium," what comes to mind? For me, it would be a building 15 or 20 stories tall, or maybe groups of attached townhomes. And in those typical condos, you never have to worry about the exterior of the building, because the association takes care of it for you. Someone tends to all the plants, paints the exterior, and they repair & maintain the doors, windows, and roofs. In a well-managed association, everything always looks well-kept; it's a community you're proud to live in. BUT- the typical condominium owner pays \$400-\$500 per month in maintenance fees. Even at the low end of \$400 per month, that's nearly \$5,000 per year. Ouch.

Now, your Briar Creek Phase 1 maintenance fee of \$162/ month totals LESS than \$2,000 per year, a savings of nearly \$3,000 per year compared to the typical condo. While you do have some expenses to maintain your property (assuming you don't do it yourself), I'm sure you're not spending anywhere near that \$5,000 figure mentioned above. Still, we want to make sure our community is an attractive one, and that's where the Annual Inspection comes in. Using a standardized inspection procedure (which is available on the Briar Creek website), each home is inspected in late January or early February. If the inspectors find any shortcomings, they'll



note them on their inspection form, and you'll have 30 days to correct them. This procedure makes sure our community is a neat and tidy one, and may help you find small problems, ones easily fixed before they turn into big and expensive projects.

Most Briar Creek homeowners take pride in their residences, and it shows in how well they maintain them. But some neighbors need a little help in this area, so an annual inspection benefits us all. Now that you know WHY the Annual Inspection is important, I'll be explaining over the next few months our inspection procedures, the appeal process, and what to do if you can't complete necessary repairs within the 30-day allotment. And though six months away and subject to change, I'm currently planning next year's inspections for February 1st through the 10th.




