BOARD BUSINESS and UP DATES

From the Desk of Jeff Clark, President

A Third Cable Provider Choice?

I had assumed that we had just two choices of cable service (Spectrum and WOW), but it turns out that there may be a third option: Frontier. At the urging of Helen Coar, I contacted Frontier Communications as to the availability of their fiber-optic (FiOS) cable service. The person I spoke to (Denise) stated that their service is available in Phase One, and with no upfront charges.

There are, however, two caveats:

- 1. Denise could not confirm that Frontier is available to every homeowner in Phase One, as they have to verify each address individually. She encourages anyone interested in their service to call them at 877-815-2212, or go online at www.frontier.com. A credit check is required if you do sign up for their service.
- 2. Frontier's FiOS cable can provide phone and internet service, but you would have to get TV through Dish Network, with whom they have a business relationship.. (Does that mean, for example, they handle all of your billing? I'm not sure, you'll have to talk to them.) So, if you want Frontier and you want cable, you'd need to have a satellite dish installed on your property (assuming you don't already have one).

I am NOT necessarily recommending Frontier. They started out as Rochester Telephone, a company I'm intimately familiar with, having lived in Rochester, NY, for 40 years. BUTtheir advertised basic internet rate is as low as \$20/ month, and FiOS service can be lightning fast. If you only want internet and/or phone service, and already get TV through services like Roku, Chromecast or Amazon Fire, then Frontier is at least worth a look.

If you would like to make a complaint about the conduct of another resident or a guest, the care of a BC Common Element, the violation of our rules or any other issue regarding the operation and maintenance of BC, please try to identify the appropriate Director to address the issue according to their Committee responsibilities.

If it is a matter of violation of our Community rules which requires immediate enforcement, such as someone drinking alcohol at the pool or a parking violation, then call the appropriate Director immediately (call the President or Vice President if you can't figure out which Director is appropriate). If it is a situation where you feel threatened or someone is putting you, others or property in danger, then your best course of action is to immediately call the County Sheriff's office at (727) 582-6200.

Otherwise, it is Board of Director policy that complaints of rules violations must be done in writing in order to be acted upon. There is a complaint form available to be filled out on the wall to the right of the Directors Office at the Clubhouse. The Directors are not obligated to act upon verbal complaints or complaints done in writing that are submitted anonymously.

By the way, there is no requirement that a Committee Chairperson must also be a member of our Board of Directors. If you would like to volunteer to be in charge of one of our Committees, feel free to mention it to any one of the Directors. We are a non-profit resident-owned and run community and are always happy to spread out the volunteer workload.



What is That Sound?

t's cicadas singing...in perfect harmony. The high pitched screeching is the mating call of males; the sound of their call varies geographically.



Females deposit the eggs in tree bark or branches; when they hatch as nymphs, they fall to the ground and then burrow. The nymphs live underground feeding on roots, moving through chambers and tunnels which they dig with claw-like front legs until they emerge. their underground tunnels. Cicada juveniles remain underground for ten or more years.

The periodical cicada emerges every 13 or 17 years in broods. The emergences are staggered so every year some will emerge from their underground tunnels.

Inspection Procedures

leff Člark

here can be up to 14 teams performing the annual inspection of all the properties* in Phase One. Since we're all human, it's impossible for each team to perform their duties exactly like the others. Therefore, we have a way for homeowners to express their concern or disagreement with an inspection report. You may not realize it, but this appeals process has been in place since inspections began. Below are descriptions of our Appeals Process, and the Inspection Committee that rules on the matter. Please keep a copy of this for future reference. The Appeal Process

If an owner does not agree with the observation of the inspection team, they can make comments on the inspection form and return it to the director in charge of inspections. The director will examine the reported objections and advise the owner. If the owner does not agree with those findings, then the owner can appeal the inspection to the President of the Board of Directors. If the President agrees with the inspection results, an appeal committee will be convened and the owner can present their appeal to the inspection committee.

The Inspection Committee

A committee will consist of five (5) members of the community who do not serve on the board, the Director in charge of inspections and the President. The two directors will not vote on the appeal but enforce the decision of the appeal committee and observe the appeal process. The decision of the appeal committee is final.

It's important that these inspectors do their jobs, and complete them without interference or harassment from homeowners. If you disagree with their findings, DO NOT tak your frustrations out on them! Follow the above process and everyone will be happy.

*Yes, even common properties like the clubhouse, laundry building, BC Mart and its adjoining garage are subject to inspection.

*If you're not familiar with these documents, you can obtain copies by downloading them from the Briar Creek website (under the Forms" tab), or you can write to me and I'll be happy to provide you with printed copies.

The roofing project is currently in the final phase of completion. 100% of the metal panels have been installed on the clubhouse and garage/exercise building. The top cap, coping & flashing is being installed on a daily basis. A new LED light has been installed over the entrance door to the exercise room. During the rainy season, your lawn might not be cut on a regular basis. As the ground becomes saturated with rain water the lawn mowers cannot cut because they will only create ruts.

From your Clubhouse Librarians

Y our donations of books, magazines and puzzles to the clubhouse library are always appreciated and our library collection is starting to need more space. So we are in the process of making some changes to the library.

Because of space concerns, we have removed the many duplicates, as well as stained, moldy, and torn books. The duplicates will be put out for sale at our next bazaar.

We also discovered that we have many more books in large print, so we now have a dedicated section for those books. It is located in the puzzle section of the library.

There is now a section containing many books with a Christmas theme and it is located in the main part of the library directly underneath the window beside the Return book basket.


