BOARD BUSINESS

NEW POLICIES FOR BRIAR CREEK 1

BRIAR CREEK PARKING POLICY

There are 4 common element parking areas: BC Mart Lot, Laundry Lot, West Side of the Clubhouse and East Side of the Clubhouse.

ALL parking on Common Elements is by permit ONLY, which is a BC sticker or Visitor Pass filled out. BC stickers are not a mandatory requirement while on your personal property, BUT...All BC residents MUST have a BC sticker in the vehicle if parked anywhere on the common element, preferably on the rear window unless you back into your house driveway which then should have a front & rear sticker. All overnight guests parking MUST have a visitor card filled out and laying on the dash of the vehicle.

1. The BC Mart lot has several excess spaces and is available EXCEPT for the space in front of the storage unit where the BC truck is parked. (Please do not block the garage door or the front door at any time unless the BC Mart is open and the dropping off items

- - or shopping.)
 - 2. The Laundry lot will have 3 spots identified with signs for those doing laundry with a 2-4 hour time limit. The other spaces will be for overflow/guest parking. (again, by permit only)
 - 3. The West Clubhouse lot is for BC residents and guest(s) using the clubhouse and pool. There is NO overnight parking in this lot at any time.
 - 4. The East Clubhouse lot is for clubhouse guest(s), owner's guest(s) and owner temporary (48 hours to 14 days maximum per BOD minutes 2007) parking. (If an owner is parked there temporarily, PLEASE park away from the shuffle courts. There MUST be a BC sticker in the vehicle or a guest parking pass filled out. (The Sheriff's department has informed us that this is for our own protection due to stolen cars being dumped in housing developments.) We NEED to know who the car belongs to in the event of an unexpected situation so they may be contacted to be removed, rather than towed. This is for everyone's benefit. We are hoping there will not be a need to do further "policing" of our lots, but if necessary; warnings* will be issued and then the vehicles will be towed.

*In the Amended and Restated By-Laws recorded in Pinellas County dated 2/22/200l, Article 5 Directors Powers and Duties, Levying fines against Unit Owners for violations of the rules and regulations established by the Association is stated fully... We are hoping none of this is needed.

This is not a permanent lot for anyone. Our guidelines do say that you should be able to park your vehicles in your driveway. If they do not fit, you can be required to remove the vehicle and store at your expense.

As a homeowner, if you opt to rent your home at any time during the year, you **CANNOT** leave your vehicle in one of these lots during the rental period.

Our by-laws are not specific as to the use of these lots and thus we are initiating this policy hoping the problem will remain minimal.

This Policy will become effective 30 days upon board approval, dated and signed and copies given to every resident and rental owner mailed a copy.

RENTAL POLICY FOR BRIAR CREEK 1 What constitutes a BC1 Rental?

If you own the property and you are not there, but there are overnight guests/friends staying in the home for 30 days or more, this would be considered a Rental; even if no money changes hands (this would be considered a gratuitous rental).

What guides the decision making of this policy?

In our Declaration of Condominium of BC1 under #16 Conveyances, Sales, Rental, Leases and Transfer, subheading B Rental or Lease it states "a parcel shall not be leased or rented without the prior written approval of the Association...

The number of units rented or leased at any one time shall be limited to ten percent (10%) of the total off three hundred seventeen (317) units, (thirty-one [31] units).

The current list of rentals is full at 31 total. The list is being updated and confirmed. Anyone wishing to be placed on the waiting list **MUST** state in writing, date, and place in the clubhouse office mail slot. Should an opening become available, the opening will be filled from this list. This list is currently maintained by the Director/Secretary of the Board.

ALL persons desiring to Rent/Lease (30 days or more) are required to fill out an application and submit to Amy Carson (Progressive Management) with the required fee for a background check for ALL expected occupants. As of this time, the fees are as follows: \$20 per person for a Florida resident; \$30 per person for an out of state resident and \$50.00 per person for a Canadian resident. (This fee is subject to change by the company that does the background checks.) This is for the protection of the homeowner as well as our community. When the background check is completed, Amy will send all the information to the Board for final approval. (Please know that when we sign off on a rental or lease, we are approving this person(s) to be your neighbor, and we want to be diligent in our efforts.)

30 days from the date a rental is vacated, the owner MUST submit (in writing, dated and signed) to the Board of Directors Secretary or appointed person, a letter of intent to again rent or lease the home within 7 months OR the rental spot will become available to any BC1 Homeowner who wishes to rent their property. This person will be taken from the updated posted list of Rental Requests. *see bottom of page*

NO ONE shall at ANY TIME rent their home/property WITHOUT Board Approval. Doing so will jeopardize the owner's ability to rent at any time in the future. PLEASE NOTE, as a homeowner, you are responsible for any damage done to your home AND the Common Elements.

Under the Rules of Condominium of BC1 Article 15 OBLIGATION OF MEMBERS, A. No Owner shall use or permit the use of his lot for any purpose other than as a single-family residence, and maintain his lot in a clean and sanitary manner. A single-family unit is defined as one or more related by blood, marriage or adoption, or no more than two unrelated persons living and cooking together a single housekeeping unit.

No two families shall occupy the same residence at any time Should this be verified by the BOARD, the property management company, Progressive Management, will proceed with necessary action to correct this situation. Again, BRIAR CREEK MH COMMUNITY, 1.INC.



is a single family 55+ Community and at NO time shall a person under 18 years of age be permitted to occupy a unit for more than 60 days as a guest of the unit owner or rental occupant.

RULES FOR RENTAL WAIT LIST:

Any homeowner in BC1 may request to be placed on the Rental Wait List by submitting a written request to the person handling the Rent/Lease applications for the park (currently the secretary to the board). Request must be dated, signed by all homeowners, and delivered to the Board mailbox at the BC1 Clubhouse. When an opening occurs, the person in charge will notify #1 on the wait list to see if they have a rental available in the next 30 days. If so, it is their rental. If not, this person goes to the bottom of the wait list and #2 is offered the same, etc., until filled. (A rental must be owned/titled to the person on the wait list within 30 days of the offer)






