Here is the update on our kitchen project. The design has been approved to include many of the recommendations that were made to the board by the entertainment committee. The kitchen wall cabinets and floor cabinets are currently being custom fabrication at this time. The board has worked hard to obtain proposals/estimates and have succeeded to keep the cost of the cabinets & countertop under budget. We thank the social club for the support and generous donation made to the clubhouse kitchen renovation.

The plan concerning the remodeling project to start is mid-August. The first phase of the project will be the removal of the existing cabinets & countertop. Plumbing to the sinks will be shut off. The propane fuel line to the stove has to be relocated. The stove fuel supply line will now run along the left exterior of the hood to the stove. The dropped ceiling tiles will be removed so that we can apply a coat of paint to the supports. A fresh coat of paint will be applied to the walls. We would like to get the stove & refrigerator removed during the renovation if possible.

Phase two would be the installation of the cabinets, countertop and sinks. Phase two of the project should not take any longer than two weeks to complete.

FYI, Pinellas County has published their annual hurricane preparedness guide. Please obtain a copy of the guide as there is very good information and direction in case of a storm emergency. Of the most noted information is that all manufactured & mobile homes are "Zone A level" and when announced, you must evacuate. So do not delay, please make plans as soon as the authorities make the announcement.

Our fire hydrants have been painted red as requested by the fire marshal. The fire marshal stated that all privately own fire hydrants are required to be red. Special thanks to Bill, Sandy, Bob, Mike, PJ & Ruth for helping out the hydrant painting project.


