

The Phase I clubhouse is available for personal reservation by owners for private events. Under our Deed Restrictions (by-laws) the event has restrictions if used for commercial events. Check with Gene to understand these restrictions. If Alcohol is consumed, even if it's BYOB (Bring Your Own Beverage) the use of Alcohol on common elements must be approved by two director's. You may not provide or sell Alcoholic beverages in the clubhouse as our Insurance does not include a clause for sale or distribution of Alcohol and you will be personally liable.

On the mybriarcreek.com website under the Phase I section on the Clubhouse Tab is an online form used to reserve the clubhouse. The calendar is up to date for at least 18 months and is posted showing events previously reserved by the Association, Social Club, Owners, or offered to charity or local governmental agencies.

If the date you desire is taken complete the online request form and we will see if we can make arrangements to accommodate multiple requests. Once completing the online reservation form, which is self-explanatory, it is automatically forwarded and begins the reservation process. Your date will be tentatively posted pending final approval. Be sure to read the Clubhouse Usage Agreement. This outlines your responsibility for care and use of the clubhouse and also has the Alcohol request included.

The online form will require you to confirm you have read and you accept and agree to the rules for clubhouse use. This procedure is in place to make the clubhouse available to all owners while also reserving dates for Social and Community use. It also ensures the use is covered under the Association Insurance blanket. Help us help you plan your private event.

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



A few years ago a new form was initiated. We are asking all people currently using the RV Park to fill out and sign the new form and get a copy of the rules and regulations for storing your boat or RV in the lot. Leave your form at the secretary's office in the clubhouse. A copy of the rules is on the front gate of the lot. Be sure that your space is clean, mowed and in pristine condition. You cannot change your space without the express approval of the board. 
