WE MUST SCOOP THE POOP!

ost Briar Creek dog-owners do clean up after their pets, but for the others... Well, they seem to think it's okay to let their dogs go wherever they like, and do nothing about it. They do this on their own lots, on common Briar Creek grounds or-believe



it or not- on other homeowner's lots.

Maybe they're acting under the misconception that dog feces is good fertilizer, so it's beneficial for the lawns to just leave it there. A little research will show you that dog feces is high in coliform bacteria, a definite health threat. In Gainesville alone, it's estimated that 10,000 lbs. of dog waste PER DAY is generated, and a lot of it (and its coliform bacteria) washing into local streams and creeks. This, in turn, adds largely to the blue-green algae blooms that are threatening many of Florida's coasts and the manatee population. And no form of composting can get hot enough to kill this bacteria, so we can't safely turn it into fertilizer through that method.

But most importantly, cleaning up your dog's waste is simply the respectful and courteous thing to do. If your neighbors started dumping the contents of their trash cans in your yard or driveway, how would you feel? Outraged, right? I'm sure we can all agree that would be a disgusting and unsanitary thing to do. Well, leaving your dog's waste behind is just as (if not more) disgusting.

So please, ALWAYS clean up after your dog, no matter where you are in the park- it's the neighborly and environmentally responsible thing to do.



NEW: FOOD POLICY

Social Committee Board of Directors

ASTE NOT, WANT NOT: In an effort to dispense leftover meals and desserts in a fair and equitable manner from entertainment committee functions, the social committee Board of Directors has established a new policy effective April 1, 2017. 

Identification of houses where oxygen is stored

In light of the fire in the park at the end of March and the huge response from so many different Fire Departments, it was suggested that was because there was oxygen in the house. Does the Fire Department know which houses in the park do have oxygen equipment in them?

Common sense of the home owner and the supplier of the oxygen would include posting a sign on the door/window of oxygen in use. A concern for fire fighters entering any fire is the presence of chemicals as found under the sinks, ammo & explosives, propane tanks & gas within utility rooms and sheds, meth labs, etc. I do not know if there are any local codes on that issue.

I do not think the Board of Directors should get involved in keeping any type of list concerning oxygen in our residents' dwellings. The liability is too high because there could be tanks in the dwellings that we do not know of and/or were not told of. It would be a good idea to mention the posting of the oxygen signs at coffee. (Information provided by Tom Feeley)

Insurance

There was a small fire on one of the houses in BC2 yesterday...quickly contained with fire people from 4 or 5 different stations. Some folk suggested the response may have been because there was oxygen in the house that started burning. If someone lives next door to a house where there are oxygen tanks, and that house burned and the oxygen tanks blew and damaged a neighbor's place, who's insurance would be on the hook?

If oxygen tanks in a nearby house blow up, damaging a nearby home, there could be 2 answers. If the owner was negligent, and negligence could be proved, (eg the owner lit a match or a cigarette lighter near the tanks causing them to blow) then it would be their responsibility for the damage to nearby homes. Otherwise the second answer is that the neighbor's policy would have to pay for the damage to their home. (This information from our insurance company applies to the policy on our house. I didn't ask about any rules that apply to all home insurance policies.)
