UPDATES FROM THE BOARD

Parking in Briar Creek

ur Snowbird neighbors are beginning to return, and I know we all look forward to welcoming old friends back to Briar Creek. But as our population increases, so does the need for parking spaces. We want to remind you of our parking rules now so you can inform future guests, and hopefully avoid some past problems.

- No overnight parking on our streets.
- All cars (those belonging to guests as well as residents and homeowners) parked in guest-parking areas must display a completed parking pass that's visible from the street.
- No one is allowed to park any type of recreational vehicle or watercraft anywhere within the park, including all common areas, or anywhere on your lot. The sole exception to this rule is the one that allows you to park an RV in front of your home to pack it for an upcoming trip up to 48 hours before leaving. Examples of RVs are (but not limited to) "pop-top" campers, travel trailers, fifth wheels, motorhomes, and pickups with slide-in campers. Watercraft includes all motorized boats, jet skis and any non-motorized craft that requires a trailer to move it over the road. Canoes and kayaks will most likely be exempt from this rule, but need to be stored out of sight and off the ground. Larger non-motorized craft (canoes, kayaks, pedal boats, etc....) will need to be approved for storage on an individual basis.
 - All vehicles must be licensed and registered at all times.

The enforcement of these rules is critical for emergency responders, not to mention the well-being and convenience of all of us. Therefore, you will find stricter enforcement of these rules this year than in the past. There are NO EXCEPTIONS to these rules, and enforcement can include towing of vehicles (with the vehicle's owner being responsible for all related towing charges). While every effort will be made to notify the owner before a vehicle is towed, emergency situations may require immediate towing with no notice. Unlicensed and/or abandoned vehicles will be given a one-time, 24 hour written notice before they're towed.

We're seeking even more cooperation from the residents in the pet area (north of Briar Creek), as you have the least amount of guest parking. Your guests should park in the area just east of our clubhouse, and they can use the walkway/ bridge behind the pool to get to Turtle Creek Court. From there it's a very short walk to Sugar Bear Drive. Better yet, park your own vehicle in that lot before your guests arrive, and allow them to park in your own driveway.

Trees

he planting or removal of any trees within Briar Creek requires two things:

An Architectural Review Request Form, and

• A permit to remove and/or plant a tree from the City of Safety Harbor

The City of Safety Harbor takes its trees quite seriously, and wants to ensure that their beauty is preserved for the entire community to enjoy. As a city ordinance takes precedence over any restrictions or by-laws we may have, I will not consider any architectural request for tree removal and/or planting that does not first include an approved Safety Harbor permit. You should be aware that Briar Creek residents that proceed without a permit are subject to a fine of \$100-\$500 from the City of Safety Harbor. I encourage any resident to contact me immediately if they feel a tree has been (or is currently being) removed/ replaced without a valid permit.

So please- obtain your permit(s) from the city of Safety Harbor first. If they don't approve the permit, then there's no reason for the Architectural Committee to consider your request.

PROXIES FOR ANNUAL MEETING DECEMBER 4, 2017 – Joann Barr

o all Briar Creek Property Owners:

You will be receiving in the mail from Progressive Management your General/Limited Proxy. It is important that all owners submit their proxy for our Annual Meeting scheduled for 10:00AM, Monday, December 4, 2017. Your completed SIGNED Proxy ensures the Board of Directors will be allowed to conduct business during 2018. Unsigned proxies will not be counted.

Be sure you vote for each issue as explained in the Proxy. A quorum of owners (159 of 317) is required to pass the listed issues. If we do not have a quorum our monthly maintenance fees will go up considerably. Only one Proxy is valid per property. If you own two properties, submit a proxy for each one. Please show your Unit Number, then date and SIGN your Proxy before submitting. The signature must be any owner on the title. If you change or have changed the title or mailing address since purchasing you need to let Progressive Management know.

You must submit your Proxy prior to 9:00AM on December 4, 2017 *There are several ways to submit your Proxy:*

- 1. Drop in the mail slot at Clubhouse Director's Office.
- 2. Give to Jo Ann Barr any time, or drop off at 106 Cedar Elm Drive, put in black mail box at back door.
 - 3. Mail to Progressive Management

It is recommended that your Proxy be dropped at the Director's Office or given to Jo Ann Barr. Mailing slows the tally process. Early submission insures there are enough proxies received to conduct business during the 2018 year.

Help for Severe Aortic Stenosis



Severe aortic stenosis is a narrowed aortic heart valve that doesn't open and close properly, reducing blood flow to the rest of the body.

Morton Plant Hospital is now enrolling eligible patients in the Medtronic Evolut R low-risk trial, which investigates the safety and effectiveness of a transcatheter aortic valve replacement (TAVR) system in patients with severe aortic stenosis who are at a low surgical mortality risk. TAVR is a minimally invasive alternative to open-heart surgery used to treat failing aortic heart valves in patients with severe aortic stenosis. Morton Plant Hospital was chosen as the first hospital in Tampa Bay to offer the TAVR procedure for patients with severe aortic stenosis who were at an intermediate or high surgical mortality risk. Our team has completed more than 700 TAVR procedures over the last five years.

Beautification Matching Grant Fall 2017

An application was submitted to the City of Safety Harbor for their Fall 2017 Beautification Grant, which if approved, grants 50% of the cost (up to \$2500) of a landscaping project. A plan was submitted for landscaping in 3 common areas: 1) the planter on Sugar Bear at the laundry facility; 2) the planter on the corner of Briar Creek Blvd and Cypress; and 3) clubhouse grounds to include the planter boxes on the rear of the building, adding a new tree (a replacement requirement) and replacing the dead Azalea on the walkway.

This project completes the landscaping needed in common areas of the park which began in the spring of 2016.



very Fall welcomes in the "Flu Season." There are many individual thoughts and feelings surrounding inoculations. The Flu has many variants; seasonal Flu shots will not protect you against all strains of the Flu, just the one expected to be the most likely to infect the population during any given season.

The Center for Disease Control (CDC) recommends for the most effective protection against this year's strain, one should be inoculated by the end of October; it is not too late, now, though. Keep in mind that is takes about two weeks to benefit from the shot.

The Flu vaccine is not recommended for everyone; check with your doctor before making your decision. Most insurance programs cover the expense of the Flu vaccine, as well as the Shingles and Pneumonia vaccines; again check with your primary physician.

Last Flu Season, the CDC estimates that 310,000 people were hospitalized for flu-related illnesses. Best calculated average number of Flu deaths annually has been updated to about 23,600.

It is true, that we all "gotta go somehow," if we can prevent death by flu, why not roll up your sleeve and take the shot?




