BEAUTIFICATION MATCHING GRANT

Beautification Matching Grant recipients for 2016. This Grant was awarded after an application form was delivered to Safety Harbor City Hall and a lengthy award process was started in April of this year.

Safety Harbor will return 1/2 of the expenses incurred by us when we complete the beautification of the front of our Clubhouse by the end of June. One of the rules which was an important part of the application was that the improvements had to be seen from the main street of our development. A Safety Harbor landscaper was chosen from 3 different applicants and work was begun in May. After removal of the old bushes and tree, a dry rotted soaker hose and 8" of old dirt, new dirt and fertilizer, appropriate plants, a new soaker hoses with timers and mulch will be applied and nature will begin to work its magic.

We hope that all our residents will enjoy the new, fresh, colorful look for the front of our Clubhouse.

FIND IT IN THE "BOOK NOOK" LIBRARY

Few are comfortable discussing end of life issues; but we all need to express our concerns, requests and instructions. The Book Nook is now providing a valuable resource to get the conversation started. Now, it may help to think of things this way: Perhaps your parents died and no one knew that they wanted to be cremated. Mourning, loving, devoted and a little guilt ridden, you and your siblings (if you have any) spent thousands of dollars on cemetery plots, top end caskets with special vapor lock gaskets, granite headstones – the works, plus some. No one really knew so you did what you thought they wanted and deserved. No one ever talked about it. What if their wishes had been dramatically different, more affordable and very practical?

Mom wanted to donate organs and direct cremation with a celebration of life at a later date when everyone could gather. Dad wanted military rights, 21 gun salute and cremation following a viewing. He wanted to wear his dungarees and suspenders over a t-shirt while sporting his favorite cap. Instead of flowers he wanted donations of food or money for the local food pantry.

Now it's about us. Have you made any decisions? Have you thought about end of life issues in detail? The "Book Nook" has the **State of Florida "Health Care Advance Directive"** booklets. Feel free to stop by and pick one up. Open it! Read it! Take it with you; take two or three if you need more. The booklet is in compliance with Florida statutes and explains everything you need to know. It contains three convenient forms: Living Will, Designation of Health Care Surrogate and Uniform Donor Form as well as a cut-out card to carry with you. With information in hand, discussing your specific preferences is made simple, easy – comfortable. There are also web address links to compatible sources, such as "Five Wishes", which is a venue to provide details regarding **WHO** you would like with you in final hours; **WHAT** to do if illness or accident leaves you in a vegetative state; **WHERE** you want your remains or cremains; **WHAT** songs or music you want **WHEN** you die.

Follow the guidelines provided which are informative and complete. In so doing, you will be taking steps to assure that you rest well – how and where you prefer.

The Doctor is (NOT) in...PART 2

S o have you been thinking about what we as a community can do to become more healthy and supportive towards our family here at Briar Creek? This "health thing" is a work in progress that we all should be a part of. You might say, "I'm not sick, why should I become involved?" Here's why...

After we purchased our home in Briar Creek we were thrilled that we could step outside our door and go walking. The ground was relatively flat and we did not need to drive anywhere to get started. (In our Tennessee home we had to drive to flat land as all paths back home were up hill.) And so we did! Many of you walk on a daily basis and feel much better because of this, and so do we. But in February, something DIFFERENT happened.

On Friday, February 12, Dave and I were walking on Sugar Bear when I suddenly felt a heavy weight on my chest. I kept walking and it eased off and I thought to myself, maybe I should tell Dave. (YOU THINK???). At his insistence we returned home the short way across the creek and around the pool. I felt fine and did NOT have another pain. Great!! But he would not quit nagging me to go to the Doctor to be checked out! So finally that afternoon I went to the new Bay Care Urgent Care and Dr. Gilhooly was concerned enough to set me up with a cardiologist on Monday at noon. I was told to take it easy (no walking) until I saw him and instructed to call 911 if ANYTHING else should happen before then. No problem...we went out to a Valentine's Day Brunch at Safety Harbor Spa and Resort and later that evening enjoyed the holiday dinner and dance at the Clubhouse. Monday at noon I saw the cardiologist after his Nurse did an EKG. Long story short...I was admitted immediately for a heart cath. 6 hours later I was sporting a new stint due to a major blockage. I later asked if I had a heart attack and my DR said, "if you had had a heart attack we would not be having the conversation because my blockage was the widow maker. And to think I only had about 10 minutes of pain and nothing more.

Lesson learned...not all heart symptoms are the same. Do NOT assume you are OK. If I had waited you might not be reading this post!

GETTING IN TO HOT WATER

The Briar Creek Spa is a warm and inviting place to relax and relieve muscle aches, but for some it can spell trouble in the form of HYPERTHERMIA. What is hyperthermia? Hyperthermia is an abnormally high body temperature and because the water temperature of our Spa is above 1000F, several groups of residents and guests using the Spa must use care and seek their physician's advice before going into the hot tub.

Water is circulated through the hot tub which pumps out cold water and pumps in hot water. Unlike a hot bath, which is usually less than 1000F to start, the hot tub is hotter, does not cool down and may cause you to overheat. At-risk groups include:

INFANTS AND CHILDREN – little folks have a difficult time regulating their body temperature. When exposed to the high temperature of the Spa, their internal temperature can rise quickly which can cause a problem with their metabolism. (Metabolism is thousands of chemical reactions that occur at the same time in the body's cells to keep our cells healthy and powering everything we do: moving, thinking and growing).

PREGNANT WOMEN – some studies have shown an increased risk of birth defects in babies of women who have had an increase in body temperature, especially during the first trimester of pregnancy (from both external (hot tub) and internal sources (fever)). It is believed that using the hot tub raises the body temperature to a higher level for a longer period of time. This is due to the fact that in the hot tub the normal processes of perspiration and evaporation do not assist in the lowering of one's body temperature.

HEART DISEASE – extended immersion in hot water can overheat your body causing stress on your heart. Your temperature rises but your blood pressure drops! Evaporating sweat usually cools you off, but in the hot tub sweating doesn't work

so you can't cool down. Your blood is diverted from your core to your skin and your blood vessels dilate (open) to try to cool you. This causes the drop in your blood pressure so your heart rate increases to counteract the drop in pressure. If you have existing cardiac disease, this can force your heart to work harder. Medications can also contribute to the issue, especially cardiac drugs and diuretics.

Awareness and common sense can keep you safe while you enjoy the therapeutic benefits of the hot tub. Make sure the temperature of the Spa is not too high for you, especially if you are in one of the "at risk" categories above, stay hydrated, limit your time in the hot tub and make sure you have received clearance from your physician before engaging in the activity. HAVE FUN, BUT BE SAFE in BRIAR CREEK!






