1) From the City of Safety Harbor website:

Water Shortage Order Issued for Pinellas

Due to the current drought conditions, the Southwest Florida Water Management District (SWFWMD) issued a modified Phase I Water Shortage Order that includes Pinellas County and other surrounding counties under their jurisdiction. The order goes into effect on May 8, 2017.

The current restrictions for irrigation using potable, well, lake or pond water sources do not change. However, the shortage order serves as a reminder that water resources are becoming limited and water conservation needs to be practiced by all residents. The order requests that all water users reduce wasteful and unnecessary water use and be prepared for more stringent restrictions if drought conditions worsen.

Customers should monitor Pinellas County Utilities' water restrictions website at http://www.pinellascounty.org/utilities/water-restrict.htm for up-to-date information, as restrictions can change at any time. The current authorized irrigation schedule using potable, well, lake or pond sources for Utilities customers are as follows:

Addresses ending in an even number (0, 2, 4, 6, 8): Thursday and/or Sunday



Addresses ending in an odd number (1, 3, 5, 7, 9): Wednesday and/or Saturday

Prohibited lawn irrigation hours: 10:00 am – 4:00 pm

2) Satellite dish installations

Te held one more breakfast on May 14th. It was a tribute to those who have passed but were a significant part of the monthly Sunday breakfast in Phase I. Pat & I moved to Briar Creek in 2003 and we had heard there was a group who did a breakfast on Sunday mornings. I like to cook, so we decided to try and rejuvenate the breakfast. As I recall, Frank Scanniello was involved before and he dropped off some old posters and a cash box to help us get started. I looked for some volunteers in the kitchen and Joe Guazzerotti, Bill Sullivan and Bob Tompas reported for duty in February 2004. We sold 210 tickets and served 194 at our first breakfast. Residents must have liked it, because by April 2004 we had sold 240 Tickets and served 219. Our peak came in 2006 when we sold 253 tickets. I recall Bill was always in charge of the scrambled eggs and took pride in his eggs, to the point we had to buy new frying pans for his eggs! Bob was always on the meat station and loved those 'Bob Evans Sausage Patties'. We had a goal of always presenting a nice plate appearance. I recall Bob telling me one of the sausage patties had broken and, being the trooper he was, he volunteered to eat the broken patty! As I recall that seemed to happen about every 20 minutes or so. We retired from Breakfast in 2012, it was time to let someone else step forward and take over. A year or two later someone did, but I recall from time to time seeing Bill & Bob in the kitchen helping out. Bill and Bob have since passed but they have left me with many good memories. Pat and I were once told when we leave this world me never really leave.....we leave a little piece of us behind for others to see in our children and friends. To this day when I scramble an egg I remember Bill, and every time I open a box of 'Bob Evans Sausage Patties' I will remember Bob. So this is not goodbye to old friends, just Auf Wiedersehen (until we meet again).





Rainy season in Florida officially begins June 1st; which also is the opening of Hurricane Season. Be prepared! We sure could use some rain – without the categorized storm force winds!



Two Season State

Ty Season. Wet Season. That's it for most of Florida.

Wet season officially begins June 1st and continues through the end of November. Sometimes wet season is also called; 'HURRICANE SEASON.' A good hurricane season is one that spares all occupied land masses of damage and destruction. It has been many years since the Tampa Bay Area has been devastated by hurricane force winds. We can hope and pray that trend continues.

The most seasoned of meteorologists announce their annual predictions and often revise them as the season progresses. The most sophisticated instruments coupled with most experienced forecasters are sometimes no match for the whim of Mother Nature. The path of a storm can shift directions with one small zig or zag of the system. When the area is under a hurricane watch, pay attention to the regular updates. Watch means watch it; upgraded to a Warning, be ready to take action prior to the storm making landfall in the area of concern.

Be prepared. Most local supermarkets have preparedness brochures/guidelines readily available. The information is vital. (Be on the lookout – there may be brochures available soon in the Book Nook.)

- Basically, know what you are going to go; where to go if Briar Creek is in the path of a major storm.
- Fill your car with gas. Have cash on-hand. Buy bottled water enough for each person for at least three days. Baby wipes, too will become extremely handy. If you choose to stay, fill the bath tub with water ahead of time use it to flush the toilet. Stock up on non-perishable food items edible without cooking. Add a non-electric can opener to your kitchen. Have supply of medications. Pets need to be provided for as well stock up on their food, etc. If you plan on riding out the storm in a shelter, make certain it is pet friendly (if you have a pet). Charge cell phones, etc.
- Shelters may expect you to bring pillows, blankets and your own food supply. Be prepared.
- Consolidate all important documents/papers; place them in zip lock bags (to keep dry) take them with you if you evacuate. Use garbage bags to cover/contain/keep other items dry. Maintain contact with family or friends.

Hurricane season peaks around August; look for reminders and updates in the Media throughout the season. Keep in mind that provisions can be purchased a few at a time whenever you shop for groceries. If you don't use them during the season, they can be donated to the local food pantry.



 - The address for the house check
 - The homeowner's name
 - The phone number to reach the homeowner
 - The address of your destination
 - A phone number and address for a local contact
- Please share whether or not someone else will have access to your home, if you will leave lights or TV on or on a timer, if you have pets on the premises, and if you have lawn maintenance

All residents are encouraged to keep an eye out for unusual behaviors and feel free to ask question, but when you feel that someone is doing something illegal, stop and call 9-1-1. Please do not tip the potential crooks off by telling them you have or are calling the police. Be a good witness and leave the rest to deputies of the Pinellas County Sheriff's Office. The electrical contractor is completing the installation of the exterior pool lighting. 
