

You will be receiving in the mail from Progressive Management your General/Limited Proxy. It is important that all owners submit their proxy for our Annual Meeting scheduled for 10:00AM, Monday, December 5, 2016. Your completed SIGNED Proxy ensures the Board of Directors will be allowed to conduct business during 2017. Unsigned proxies will not be counted.

Be sure you vote for each issue as explained in the Proxy. A quorum of owners (159 of 137) is required to pass the listed issues. If we do not have a quorum our monthly maintenance fees will go up considerably. Only one Proxy is valid per property. If you own two properties, submit a proxy for each one. Please show your Unit Number, then date and SIGN your Proxy before submitting. The signature must be any owner on the title. If you change or have changed the title or mailing address since purchasing you need to let Progressive Management know

You must submit your Proxy prior to 10:00AM on December 5, 2016.

o all Briar Creek Property Owners:

There are several ways to submit your Proxy:

- 1. Drop in the mail slot at Clubhouse Director's Office.
- 2. Give to Jo Ann Barr any time, or drop off at 106 Cedar Elm Drive, put in black mail box at back door.
- 3. Mail to Progressive Management

It is recommended that your Proxy be dropped at the Director's Office or given to Ja Ann Barr. Mailing slows the tally process. Early submission insures there are enough proxies received to conduct business during the 2017 year.





Are you a victim? Have you been abused? Part 1

rist we need to define victim and abuse. The dictionary defines victim as "a person who is deceived or cheated, as by his or her own emotions or ignorance, by the dishonesty of others, or by some impersonal agency; a victim of misplaced confidence; the victim a swindler" Have you been the victim of abuse (defined as corrupt practice or custom; improper or excessive use or treatment; a deceitful act).



As elders, we are often the victims of ELDER ABUSE, NEGLECT & EXPLOITATION. This happens so much to elders that Florida has a Department of Elder Affairs. The most commons areas of elder fraud are IDENTITY THEFT, HOME REPAIR FRAUD, and FINANCIAL EXPLOITATION. In this issue we will address protecting your identity and protecting against home repair fraud

To protect against ELDER ABUSE...

*NO ONE has the right to hit you (for any reason), to treat you like a child or to humiliate you for any reason at any time *NO ONE has any right to demand or take your money or HURT you *ELDERS have the right to be treated with respect and dignity at all times and NOT to be yelled at or threatened. *ELDERS have the right to control their own finances and personal property. IF you know of or have reasonable cause to suspect physical abuse, neglect and/or exploitation, you are requested to call the Elder Abuse Hotline 1-800-962-2873 All calls made to this number are confidential.

Here in Briar Creek we all need to be aware of those around us who might need some extra

care as they deal with life situations beyond their ability to handle. Never feel that you are alone. If you are meeting with a "professional" at your home, have a BC Buddy (Neighbor) to come over and listen in to the conversation. They can take down information as you listen for later consideration. Also this takes away the opportunity to be mistreated or misinformed. You hold the power, it's up to you. Make the call!

To protect your identity...

*NEVER carry your Social Security Card with you *NEVER carry more than one credit card *NEVER give out any personal information over the telephone *NEVER answer unsolicited email with your personal information. *ALWAYS get your mail daily if at all possible *ALWAYS check your bills and statements for accuracy and errors *ALWAYS dispose of mail and information with scissors or a shredder *ALWAYS put your mail on HOLD while you are on vacation. (Your mail carrier has cards for this or you can pick them up at the Safety Harbor Post Office, you can fill the HOLD out online at USPS.com OR write your information on a piece of paper and place in your mailbox with the flag up for your carrier *ALWAYS do online shopping ONLY with merchants that have a secure website.

To protect against Home Repair Fraud...

*ALWAYS compare estimates, the cheapest price is not always the best price *NEVER get your own permits-this makes you responsible rather than the contractor *NEVER allow anyone to pressure you into making a hasty decision (if they do not want to give you time to compare to examine the estimate, please beware) *NEVER allow anyone to take you to the bank to make a withdrawal for any reason (This does not mean that you are not to trust anyone, just not everyone. If your BC Buddy normally takes you to the bank to do your banking, please continue to do so. This applies to the ONE TIME out of the ordinary event. *NEVER fall victim to offers for free inspections or "sweet deals" of any kind (If it sounds too good to be true-it probably is) *NEVER pay cash for home repairs *NEVER pay for unfinished work or jobs.

The Hair State of Flaciation of Flaciat

The University of Florida in conjunction with the United States Department of Agriculture have joined forces to combat the non-native invasive air potato vine/plant. The intrusive and aggressive air potato tends to outgrow native species which disrupts the balance of local ecosystems.

Genetic testing of the invader determined that it originated in Asia. There is not a local natural way of controlling its spread. The University of Florida has established "nursery" sites in various locations within the state to rear the beetles. The beetles only feed on the invasive potato vines. As they effectively devour the vines, depleting their food source/supply, the beetles will die off.

On another note:

Residents have been noticing a new creature hopping around the creek. The Bufo Marinus, or Giant Toad has been present in Miami-Dade County for years. It's habitat is expanding across the state. If you Google "Giant Toad," or "Bufo Marinus," you will be able to find additional facts and points of interest. For those among us without access or inclination to utilize the internet, a brief introduction is provided below from: http://www.wec.ufl.edu/extension/wildlife_info/frogstoads/bufo_marinus.php (Photos of the Bufo and its call are available on the UFL link).

The Bufo is the largest (adults 4-6 inches) of toads and frogs found in Florida. It is not pretty nor is it an indigenous species. Initially it was released in the U.S. to help control white grub larvae in sugar cane fields. As often happens when attempting to introduce species from elsewhere to do something good here, there was an accident. In 1955, 100 Bufo were unintentionally released from an exotic pet dealer's shipment arriving at the Miami airport. The Giant Toad will prey upon native, smaller species of frogs, toads, insects (with any luck small rodents) and even pet food left outside. The Bufo breeds year round in standing water, canals, ditches and streams.

The Bufo has a defensive mechanism. The parotoid glands are located behind its ears on the back of its head. If threatened, handled or bitten by your cat or dog, the glands secrete a milky white toxin. The substance can cause burning to your eyes, irritation to your skin and can kill a cat or dog if they ingest the milky secretion. Symptoms of poisoning in pets include drooling, head shaking, crying, loss of coordination; in more serious poisonings convulsions are possible. Your pet's gums may turn red (take notice of their normal gum appearance). If you think your pet has been poisoned, use the hose. Turn their head sideways with snout pointing down. Flood the mouth with water, do not allow the animal to swallow this water. Flooding water in the mouth is usually successful, but call your vet immediately.

Whatever you do, remember that this toad will never turn into a prince!





"Pizzas, dog food and tanks."

For a lady who grew up wanting to be a vet, Maralee's working life certainly went in a very different direction. Instead she had a career that included developing and applying business computer systems to the manufacture of pizzas, dog food and tanks.

Here's how it all started. As a premed student, Maralee had a summer job with a software development company. Here she

was offered a full time position implanting software and training users. The premed program was changed to a business degree which she completed in the evenings.




