



Storm Lesson

The following information was contributed by a Briar Creek resident and is certainly food for thought when it comes to mobile home wind damage.

In a recent windstorm in the Dade City area, it was found that wind damage almost always started with the carport roof peeling back, which occasionally progressed to pulling off part of the roof of the home. Upon investigation, it was discovered that all damaged units had one thing in common. In every case, the front support leg of the carport had been damaged (most likely by a car bumping into it) prior to the storm. That damage (or bump) broke the bond between the carport leg support and the concrete floor/drive. When the wind got under the roof, it raised the leg and, as a result, the roof peeled back, which progressed into additional damage to the unit roof. It was verified that the leg had been previously damaged by the dents on the leg itself and the condition of the holes where the leg had previously been anchored. To further validate those finding, homes, often right next door to the damaged units, whose carport legs were securely anchored, suffered no damage.

Homeowners, please check the legs of your carport to ensure they are firmly anchored to the driveway. If they are loose and not solidly attached to the driveway, they can be moved just a few inches to solid concrete and re-anchored with masonry screws. As the old saying goes, an ounce of prevention can be worth a pound of cure.

Telcome to the Book Nook! Phase I library space has a new, friendlier and more inviting name. Come in and browse the shelves. If you see a good read or two (no limit), you are welcome to borrow and lose yourself in a good book. Returning books or donating books i just drop them in the basket on the floor in front of fiction. The



books – just drop them in the basket on the floor in front of fiction. The collection and the shelves have grown.

The main room contains genres including Romance in the island unit; fiction collection is shelved by author's last name and encircles the room; Sci-Fi/Fantasy are housed on the back case near the window, opposite the location for "new" books to the nook.

The "annex" is in the adjacent poker room where you may find a modest collection of non-fiction, Western, LARGE PRINT, seasonal and a shelf or two of medical topics.

New to the Book Nook: Official State of Florida Advance Directives brochure in abundance. So many of us are uncomfortable discussing or even thinking about end of life issues, but the topic is better dealt with while we can. The brochure walks the reader step by step through completion. It is not necessary to have the document notarized, just witnessed. It is advised that you share it with whomever you designate to represent you if you are unable to speak on your own behalf. Make sure it is readily available when needed. Make copies for others near and/or dear to you. Laws and rules often vary state by state, this is for Florida. Snow birds may want to look into similar documents in your summer states.

Another document, in limited supply, is "Five Wishes." This tool allows you to be very specific about who you want around you in final days, hours or minutes. It also provides space for any requests such as cremation vs. burial, organ donation, music during service or celebration of life. Perhaps instead of flowers, you would prefer donation to a favorite charity or research for a cure. Five Wishes does not need to be notarized either.

Both instruments are easy to complete and cover any possible personal relationship; traditional marriage; significant other/co-habitation; same sex relationships/marriage; live alone but have dear friend or companion, etc. If demand exceeds supply, additional copies can be obtained upon request.

A note regarding volunteering in the Book Nook: Anyone can be a librateer! If you only have a week to spare, sign up. The much appreciated and devoted core of current librateers continues to provide coverage because no newbies sign up. One week, sign the roster on the clip board and call me 305-546-2714 for an introductory briefing on reshelving books. Easy. If you find it suits you, sign up for another week or two whenever you have time to share.

Finally, thank you to everyone who extended warm welcomes to me upon my new "chapter" of life here in Briar Creek.

If you are making changes to the exterior of your property, you are required to complete a Alteration/Renovation Form for approval by the Board of directors. the forms to be completed are outside the Condo Office in the Clubhouse. Please date the form, filling in your name and address and a detailed description of the change. You will also be required to include the name of the Company doing the work and their License number.

Submit the completed form to the President of the Board.

DO NOT do any work until the form is approved by the Board and you receive a letter stating the approval. Give yourself enough time for the project as it has to be brought before the Board at the next Board Meeting. Between May and August, there are not Board Meetings, however, the procedure is the same - complete the form and submit to President - four(4) Board Members have to sign off on the form *before any work is to begin*. Again, give yourself enough time for the change as four(4) members may not be readily available. Once you receive the letter of approval, you may start the work.

Also, be advised, any work requiring a permit from the City/County will not be approved until the permit is attached to the Alteration/Renovation Form. For example, removing trees, pouring concrete to widen driveways or make walkways.





Exercise: More isn't necessarily better

osing weight is just a matter of exercising, right? Actually, that may not be the case, according to a study of exercise and weight loss reported on the CNN website.

Researchers looked at 332 adults in the U.S., Jamaica, and Africa, measuring their activity level over a week. The volunteers displayed a variety of exercise levels from sedentary to active. Although those who exercised and were active more burned away more calories than the others, their activity tended to hit a plateau—after a certain level, more exercise didn't produce more weight loss.

Switching exercises helped a little, since using different muscles can make your body use more energy. But in the long run, a combination of exercise and a reduced-calorie diet may be your best bet for losing those unwanted pounds.

Don't get zapped at work (or home)

lectrical hazards at home and in the workplace injure thousands every year from burns and shocks. Faulty or overloaded wires cause the majority of accidents, so protect your family and your co-workers by following these guidelines:

- Get inspected. If your electrical panel hasn't been inspected for more than 10 years, get a qualified electrician to look it over.
- Unplug heat appliances after use. At home, that includes toasters, hair dryers, and irons, among others. In the office, unplug space heaters or anything else that can cause a fire.
- Use the correct wattage. Putting a 75-watt bulb in a 60-watt light socket is asking for trouble
- Don't overuse extension cords. They're meant for short-term use, not as way to plug in as many appliances as possible into one outlet.
- Use surge protectors. They'll keep computers and other appliances safe from overloaded circuits
- Keep appliances away from water. If an appliance that's plugged in falls into water or gets wet, unplug it before you reach for it.
- Don't yank cords. When unplugging an appliance, always grip the head of the cord. Yanking and tugging can damage the cord's wire and insulation, which can lead to an electrical shock or fire.
