




Vakesh Rajani, M.D.

Please show your Unit Number, then date and sign your Proxy before submitting. The signature must be any owner on the title. If you change, or have changed the title or mailing address since purchasing, you need to let Progressive Management know. You must submit your Proxy prior to 10:00 AM on December 1, 2014.

There are several ways to submit your Proxy:

- 3. Mail to Progressive Management.
