As some of you may know, Briar Creek has a new website. Gene Arend, who developed and maintained our ebsite for thirteen (13) years, decided to retire. First a big Thank You to Gene for the numerous hours of work on our behalf. Your Board of Directors has decided to enter into a contract with Progressive Management to maintain our new Website. I have listed below some things you need to know.

- 1. Our new website is <u>mybriarcreek.com</u>. We were able to keep the same domain name so no change there.
- 2. The new website has a different look than the old one.
- 3. The new website has a protected tab only available to owners. This tab contains all the Board meeting minutes, financials, by-laws and any contracts with vendors. This is required by Florida Law.
- 4. To be able to access this protected tab, you will need a password. To get your password, you will need to email Progressive Management at info@progressivem.com. Once they receive your email, they will verify you are an owner. They will then send you an email that will come from the website hosting company, Vinteum. It will ask you for a log in ID which will be your email address (when you start typing it, your email address will come up automatically). It will then ask you for a password. This will be a password you need to create. You will be the only one that knows this password. Once you have done that, you will need to log back in to the website. When you click on the tab labeled "Access Your Community," you will be prompted for your user id and password and then you will have access to the owners only tab.

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

TRASH/RECYCLING/YARD WASTE COLLECTION

I've been asked to remind all BC I owners about the City of Safety Harbor's rules for what can and cannot be included in your recycling and yard waste. The following is an image of a brochure from the City about Recycling and then some rules/guidelines for yard waste that have been cut and pasted from the City's website. Please pay particular attention below to the correct yard waste container since a number of people have been placing their yard waste in plastic bags. This is not allowed.

"YARD WASTE

Yard waste is only collected on Wednesdays and in 32-gallon cans or bundles at the curb. Please do **not** place recyclable yard waste in the 90-gallon barrel, recycling containers or various other totes/containers. Do **not** use plastic bags. All yard waste must be in 32-gallon cans or bundles.

Materials

Yard waste materials, such as grass clippings and leaves must be placed in unlined garbage cans no larger than 32 gallons, limited to 1.5 cubic yards in volume (1.5 cubic yards is equal to 8 cans or bundles), and curbside by 6:30 a.m. on Wednesday only.



Bulky Yard Waste

Yard waste too bulky to be containerized such as branches and other vegetative materials must be cut into sections no longer than 4 feet in length and 6 inches in diameter, then bundled with twine in arm size manageable bundles. Please do not tape bundles or mix paper or plastic in as this will contaminate the recycling process for the entire load and will result in yard waste not being collected. Piles of yard waste in excess of 1 and a half cubic yards can be collected by special arrangement with the sanitation division for additional cost. Please make arrangements by calling 724-1550, ext 2002."

fter some 91 days, the clubhouse re-opened on June 11 with restrictions according to the six foot distancing guideline, residents only, no guest at this time. On Saturday, June 13, the social club held their first coffee and donut social. The chairs and tables in the clubhouse have been arranged according to the restricting guidelines. Therefore, due to the restrictions, no cards, dominos or fitness classes at this time. Hopefully in the near future the restrictions will ease so we can then start to get back to normal. Our property manager, Progressive Management has conducted a mailing to all of the property owners concerning the new Phase II website.

Included in the mailing were two letters one was a statement from your board of directors, the second letter was instructions on how to obtain a user ID and password that is required so to access the financial statements, rules & documents.
