huffleboard season is upon us! To all our past players, welcome back! To all our new residents, you are welcome to join in! And to anyone else who resides in Briar Creek, you are welcome to play as well, of course.

Our Briar Creek Phase I courts are always available for residents (except when in use for tournaments) – help yourself to cue sticks and discs from the shuffleboard shed. The light pole on the west end has a switch for the court lights for evening play.

From your Clubhouse Librarians

his piece was originally prepared for the Monthly Media last fall, and it has been updated to be reprinted this year just in time to give everyone, including our returning snowbirds, to have a chance to read it.

The BC2 library is very well used all year round, and we usually go into the library several times a week to shelve books and generally tidy up.

Your donations of books, magazines and puzzles to the clubhouse library are always appreciated and as the library collection started to need more space, we have had to make a few changes.

Because of space concerns, we have removed the many duplicates, as well as stained, moldy, and torn books. The duplicates in good condition are being taken to one of our local community libraries which are able to find good homes for them.

We have also discovered that we have enough books in large print to justify having a dedicated section for those books. This is located in the puzzle section of the library.

There is also now a section containing many books with a Christmas theme and it is located in the main part of the library right above the basket in which you put books you are returning.

A year ago, for all the books in our library, we started a system which will allow us over time to identify those that have not been taken out for a long time and may no longer be needed. For this reason we are asking that you always place all books being returned and donated in the basket provided. We will check these, date stamp any new donations and put the books back out on the shelves.

For the puzzle section, there has been a large increase in the number of puzzles on the shelves but we have found that many of the puzzles are missing pieces. So if you are a "puzzle solving person" and discover that the puzzle you are working is missing pieces, *please do not return it and put it into your recycling bin instead*.

We do have a few dedicated puzzle people who are systematically "doing" all the puzzles in our collection to identify those that are complete, The puzzles are then being identified as "complete" by putting one of the colored "stickies" (the kind that we use to price items at the annual bazaar) on the front of the box.

If you are a puzzle person and the puzzle you are returning is complete, we are asking that you put a "sticky" on the box top and mark it "complete" and add the date. That way, our puzzle people will know they don't have to do that particular puzzle. You will find an envelope with "stickies" in one of the plastic wall racks (the kind you often find in doctor's offices with magazines) on the wall between the puzzle section and the main section of the library.

We do want to thank you again for the many books, magazines, and puzzles that have been donated, we are more than happy to accept all future donations.


