

Water and Swimming Safety

From the Red Cross

A recent Red Cross survey found that eight out of ten Americans are planning water activities such as going to the beach, pool, water park or boating or fishing this summer. A third (32 percent) of all Americans plan to swim at a place without a lifeguard. The Red Cross has launched an anti-drowning campaign this summer that promotes swim lessons and safe swimming. If a trip to the beach is part of someone's plans, the Red Cross has ten tips that will help beachgoers stay out of harm's way:

- 1. If someone plans to swim in the ocean, they should always check weather conditions before going in the water.
- 2. Swim only at a lifeguard protected beach, within the designated swimming area and listen to all lifeguard instructions.
- 3. Always swim with a buddy and always swim sober.
- 4. Young children and inexperienced swimmers should wear a Coast Guard-approved life jacket.
- 5. Everyone should enter the water feet first if they can't see the bottom or don't know how deep the water is.
- 6. Be aware of the danger of rip currents. If caught in one, swim parallel to the shore until out of the current. When free, turn and swim toward shore. If unable to swim to the shore, call out for help, float or tread water until free of the rip current and then head toward shore.
- 7. Limit the amount of direct sunlight received between 10:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m., and wear a broad-spectrum sunscreen with a protection factor of at least 15. Reapply often.
- 8. Stay hydrated. Drink plenty of water regularly, even if not thirsty. Avoid drinks with alcohol or caffeine in them.
- 9. Protect the eyes by wearing sunglasses that will absorb 100 percent of UV sunlight.
- 10. Wear beach shoes. The sand is hot and can burn someone's feet and glass and other sharp objects can cut them.

Macs taking over? Maybe not yet

Are you a Windows person or a Mac user? Conventional wisdom says that Windows computers belong in business environments, while the Mac is favored by educators, creative artists, and the elite. But that may be changing, according to data from VMware and reported on the InformationWeek website.

A survey of more than 370 IT professionals found that 71 percent of organizations support Macs, not exclusively Windows computers. Employee preference is the dominant reason, cited by 73 percent of the survey participants. The next most common reason was the need for applications that run only on Mac's OS X platform, named by 41 percent. The "Bring Your Own Device" movement surge in workplaces is also a major factor.

IT teams aren't necessarily happy about all those Macs, however. Forty percent of respondents said they find Macs more difficult to support. In any event, Macs seem unlikely to outnumber Windows-based computers anytime soon, since such machines still dominate over 90 percent of the market.

Forget the car—who gets the dog?

Divorces can turn into unpleasant battles over custody of children, possessions—and even pets. A survey of 1,600 members of the American Academy of Matrimonial Lawyers found that pet custody cases have grown significantly since 2001. One notable case involves actors Antonio Banderas and Melanie Griffith, who are trying to work out custody of their three dogs as well as their 18-year-old daughter. According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, Americans own about 218 million pets (not including fish). In fact, we have about 70 million dogs and 74 million cats, but only about 74 million kids.
