## MANAGER'S MESSAGE

<u>ndependence Day – July 4th</u> - Happy Birthday USA. The business **MANAGER** office will be closed on Friday, July 3rd for the National Holiday.

▲ <u>VOLO Village</u> – We have a new communication tool - VOLO Village. This is similar to the email blast that we have been using; however, VOLO will call, text and/or email residents. The Board of Directors is taking advantage of a free 30-day trial of the program and plan to use it for a year to see how residents like it. After that year, the cost will be passed on to ONLY those residents who want to continue using it. The cost is \$4.00 per year, per residence; that is about \$0.34 per month. Each residence is allowed up to 2 land lines, 2 cell phones and 2 email addresses.

<u>Walkways</u> – The common area walkways have been returned to their gray color. This time the non-slip additive was included to make them safer.

<u>Fitness Center</u> – The exercise equipment has been reupholstered – it looks much better!

<u>Rule Reminder</u> -According to the Declaration of Master Form Occupancy Agreement, Monthly Maintenance Fees are due on the 1st of each month and become late on the 5th of the month. When payments are received late, the owner(s) is assessed a fee of either 5% of the delinquent amount of \$25.00, whichever is greater. When the next owner payment is received, it will first be applied first to an interest that was assessed, then to a late fee, then it will be applied to the attorney or management company's collection fee and finally the portion that remains will be credited to the maintenance fee payment. Therefore, when an owner makes their payment after the 5th of the month, if all collection cost are not included when payment is made, the amount submitted will not cover the maintenance fee and the account will be delinquent and continue to incur additional charges.

<u>Need Help?</u> – If you are struggling and need assistance with repairs to your home or help paying your electric bill, call 211.

South Laundry – Old Time Roofing replaced the roof on the South Laundry last month.

<u>Access Control Cards</u> – If you are one of our seasonal residents, you will need to schedule an appointment to have your photo taken so your new Access Control Card (ACC) can be created. The process takes about 10 minutes. These ACC cards have replaced all common area facility keys. All doors will remain locked all the time, except during the hours the facility is open, your ACC Card will allow access the Clubhouse, Library, Billiard Room and Pools. If you have a head shot photo that you could email the Business Office, we can prepare your ACC card and mail it to you or have it available for pick up when you return. Just email your photo to <u>office@clearwatercascade.com</u>. Perhaps you can have a friend or family member take your photo using your cell phone; then you can forward it to us. Be sure to provide your lot number. *Important Note - Once you have your card, please notify the business office a.s.a.p. if you lose your Access Control Card*.

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## Around the Park, On Foot, By Bicycle, Or In A Car

ith summer weather firmly in charge, everyone is out enjoying the great outdoors by bicycle or on foot. To ensure everyone's safety, here are a few reminders about Park rules. Pedestrians have the right-of-way when walking along and crossing the street. That being said, remember that motor vehicles have the right-of-weight. Mom and Dad were right when they said to always look both ways before crossing the street, don't assume that the drivers are looking out for you. And when crossing the street, cross it, don't wander across on a diagonal. If you walk after dark, carry a light. Lastly, walk on the left side of the street, facing traffic. If the driver of the vehicle coming at you doesn't see you, at least you can get out of the way. Bicyclists in Florida are subject to the same rules as motor vehicles. Those rules include driving on the right side of the road, stopping at stop signs and yielding the right-of-way. Don't assume that motor vehicles will yield to you because if they don't, you lose. Once again, it's that right-of-weight thing. And make sure that your bicycles have proper lights, reflectors, etc. when riding after dark. Drivers must be particularly alert in the park, as we have many bicyclists and pedestrians to look out for. Parking is also a consideration and there are a few rules to consider. Parking in the street is OK from 7:00 am to 11:00 pm; no overnight parking is permitted. At no time can a vehicle park within 30 feet of a corner. No vehicle may be parked in a carport or driveway so that any portion protrudes into the street or lawn. The speed limit in the Park is 15 miles per hour. Let's all look out for each other, follow the rules and enjoy the nice weather!

Whichever approach you take, send your problems to the office and let's all enjoy the Florida lifestyle.

# ARF

o these three letters mean anything to you other than a barking dog? They used to scare me, but not any more now that I know more about them. They stand for Action Request Form. This is a form that has many purposes and is required if you want any action taken. The Office can't fix or address a problem or complaint if they don't have the request in writing.

Some examples are:

- If you see something anywhere around the common areas of the park that requires repair, maintenance, clean-up etc., submit an ARF.
- If you see a speeding car and can identify it, submit an ARF.
- If you see something that violates the rules, i.e., motorcycle, unknown people using the facilities, improper use of facilities etc., submit an ARF
- If you see something praiseworthy, submit an ARF. We like to hear the positives as well.

#### \*\*\*\*\*

- DO NOT confront or go after people you don't know. Instead:
- 1. Call the Office 727-544-8111
- 2. Call RPM after hours 727-581-2662 and leave a message
- 3. Call Police Non-Emergency, if appropriate 727-541-0758

The Action Request Form is available from the office, on the Clearwater Cascade website (**www.clearwatercascade.com**), or on One Source, which can also be accessed from the CCHOA section on the website. Go to the website and click the CCHOA tab on the right. Under FORMS you may select an Action Request Form, a Sign-In form or a Sign-Out Form. When prompted, enter the user name and password. If you call the office, they will give these to you. You may also select One Source and again the office can assist you in setting up a user name and password to use this site.
