# **PROPOSAL FOR SHARE OFFERING**

The Board of Directors is considering the following share offering. The final proposal will be presented to the shareholders at the January 2015 annual meeting. The intention of this communication is to provide information to all residents of Crosswinds for the purpose of obtaining feedback to the Board before the final proposal is determined. This is not the final proposal.



PROPOSAL: To rename a specific number of common shares "Convertible" shares. The value of one common share remains \$35,000. The value of a "convertible" share will be \$25,000. The owner of a "convertible" share will enjoy the same benefits of ownership as the owner of a common share with one specific difference: The monthly maintenance fee for a "convertible" share will be set at \$100 plus the monthly maintenance fee for a common share, which currently is \$150.

A purchaser of a convertible share can convert his share to a common share upon an additional payment of the \$10,000 which is the difference in share price between the two shares, and then the maintenance fee would revert to that of the common share.

Along with this share offering, the Board is considering financing options for potential purchasers.

The Board is also considering an incentive plan for potential purchasers of new mobile homes for Crosswinds: an incentive that can be applied to the post-construction costs of a new mobile home; for example paved driveway, skirting, shed, contingent upon the purchase of one common share, \$35,000. This incentive plan would be available to current residents of Crosswinds subject to Board acceptance as well as potential new residents subject to Board acceptance and approval for ownership and residency.

I will hold a meeting at the Large Hall on November 14 at 10 am to discuss this proposal. This meeting will be open to all residents of Crosswinds and the Board is open to input from both Shareholders and Homeowners.



## **Free Roaming Cats**

Some residents are feeding stray cats that are roaming the park. Please stop feeding these cats because it will only create more problems. Controlling the population is crucial because a female cat can have three litters a year. Their offspring can then have litters and so on. These cats can spread disease to other animals, such as panleukemia, a virus which is rampant in the feral population. Panleukopenia virus is present wherever there are susceptible animals. Mink, ferrets, raccoons, and wild cats all serve as a reservoir. The virus is highly contagious. It is spread by direct contact with infected animals or their secretions. Contaminated food dishes, bedding, litter boxes, and the clothes or hands of people who have treated an infected cat are other routes of exposure. The Office can provide traps to capture the stray cats in the Park. The following article gives details regarding roaming cats in Pinellas County. In October 2008, the Pinellas County Board of Commissioners approved a Citizen's Working Study Group to study the issues, problems, prevention, and solutions regarding the feral cat population in Pinellas County. Members from a wide variety of concerned groups of stakeholders were recruited and the work of this group continued through October 2009. The Citizens' Working Group on Feral and Free-Roaming Cats presented the following recommendations that were approved by the *...continued on page 10*

Pinellas County Board of County Commissioners:

- 1. Approve the Establishment of a Feral and Free-Roaming Cat Initiative in Pinellas County, Florida that accomplishes the following:
  - Humanely reduces the current feral cat population,
  - Prevents free-roaming cats from becoming feral,
  - Encourages and elevates the status of feral and free-roaming cats back to that of a companion/pet with a residence and responsible owner/family.
- 2. Promoting and participating in our Groups ongoing education campaign that emphasizes the following points: necessity of early spay/neuter (by 5 months of age for kittens), benefits (to the cats, wildlife, and community) of keeping cats indoors, and the availability of low cost spay/neuter programs. Since the Group recognizes the budgetary limitations of the county, we recommend that you provide input and advice to this campaign through existing resources (veterinary and media experts, county websites, flyers in utility bills, etc...).
- 3. Continuing to support and potentially expand the current spay/neuter programs of Animal Services (including the Animobile) directed towards low income citizens. Encourage humane organizations and local veterinarians to participate in similar programs and publicly recognize them for their contributions. The Board is also highly encouraged to explore the possibility of sharing county resources such as the Animobile with humane organizations conducting such programs.
- 4. Continuing to support the current animal control code that requires owners to vaccinate, license, and prevent their cats from roaming free. This code also discourages leaving food or garbage outside where it attracts a variety of animals and encourages cats to free- roam and gravitate toward a feral existence.
- 5. The Group recognizes that some of the county's citizens are deeply invested, both financially and emotionally, in the well being of feral cats and actively participate in programs that trap, neuter and return these cats to the environment. Common sense tells us that if cats are already at large it is better that they be sterilized rather than fertile and vaccinated rather than non-vaccinated; however, BOCC support or opposition to TNR programs would continue the controversy and this may or may not be in the interest of the BOCC. We recommend, rather, that you encourage private humane organizations to interact with those citizens involved in such programs in order to work towards common goals that are in the interest of the BOCC and citizens of Pinellas County. Our Group, on your behalf, has identified these goals as ones that humanely reduce the total number of free-roaming and feral cats in the county, encourage responsible ownership of all cats, minimize nuisance complaints attributed to free roaming cats, protect the health and safety of our citizens, protect the welfare of all cats as domestic and companion ani mals and gives protection to our wildlife and encourages a peaceful co-existence between domestic cats and wildlife and among the residents of Pinellas County.




