Coffee Hour at the Large Hall



Friendship Thanksgiving Dinner, Thursday November 28.



Reading makes people better, study suggests

Do you read a lot? If so, chances are you're more kind and empathetic than most people, according to a study reported on the Peace Quarters website. Researchers in Great Britain asked 123 people about their reading or television watching habits. Then they analyzed participants' social skills, asking questions like, "How often do you consider other people's points of view versus your own?" and "Do you go out of your way to actively help others?"

The results showed that the book readers, usually considered introverted and antisocial, displayed more empathetic traits than people who primarily watch TV. The genre of books seemed to make a difference, with readers of romance and drama showing more empathy and skill at seeing things through another person's eyes.

Of course, it could be that empathetic people tend to read more, instead of reading creating more empathy. Either way, it's good news for bookworms.



Have a safe Thanksgiving

When you fire up the oven to roast your Thanksgiving turkey, you're probably not thinking about tragedy. But home fires are the most common disaster in the United States, and cooking is the leading cause of those fires. Thanksgiving Day is the unfortunate host to about 4,000 fires each year. Here are some safety tips to keep your Thanksgiving fire-free:

- Stay in the kitchen and keep watch while you are cooking.
- Use a timer if you have something in the oven or are boiling or simmering something on the stove.
- Don't wear loose sleeves or loose clothing when cooking.
- Keep anything that can catch on fire—pot holders, oven mitts, towels, etc.—away from your stovetop or oven.
- Turkey fryers are extremely dangerous, and most safety organizations do not recommend their use.
- Make sure you have a smoke alarm installed with working batteries. Push the button to check that it's working every month, and install new batteries at least once a year.
- After your guests leave, do a home safety check to make sure that all candles are extinguished and all of your cooking appliances are turned off.

Ditch these financial bad habits

ant to handle your money better? Most of us do. The Motley Fool website advises breaking these three bad habits:

- **Paying bills late.** A few days or weeks may not seem to matter, but you'll be hit with late fees, interest, and damage to your credit rating. Do your best to pay all your bills on time. Set up reminders so you're always on schedule. Automatic payment is one reliable option.

Brainstorming isn't the only solution

un fact: The man who popularized brainstorming in the 1940s also touted the benefits of solitude when searching for creative ideas. Alex Osborn's book, Your Creative Power, described how he brought a practice he'd seen in a previous job to the advertising firm BBD&O (he's the "O").

"The early participants dubbed our efforts 'Brainstorm Sessions,' and quite aptly so," the book says, "because, in this case, 'brainstorm' means using the brain to storm a creative problem—and do so in commando fashion, with each stormer attacking the same objective."

But he also advised solo thinking. "A good long shower or a hot tub often induces ideas. One reason is that while we bathe we are shut off from distracting influences." And he describes one particularly fruitful effort:

"Once when I faced a hard creative task, I went to an inn over 100 miles away. Not only was I uninterrupted—not only did I get away



from routine—but, because I had made such effort to go so far solely to engage in creative effort, my imagination seemed to work far better. The very taking of that trip tended to sharpen my imagination."


Brainstorming can be useful, but it's not the only tactic for sparking your creativity.

An alphabetical guide to inspiration

s creativity as simple as ABC? Harvey Mackay thinks so. The businessman and bestselling author shared his formula for innovation and inspiration in a column on the Daily Herald website. Here's how his list begins:

- A: Advertising. "Expand your brand beyond media-generated advertising. For example, we painted our company name and phone numbers on top of our delivery trucks so they were visible to people who worked on upper floors of tall buildings."
- **B: Bold.** "People are not inspired by ordinary messages, so give them a reason to remember you."
- C: Curious. "Curiosity may not have been good for the cat, but it's a winning formula for people."
- D: Different. "Don't be afraid to do things that have never been tried before. You have to have enough faith in yourself to trust your instincts."
- E: Everyone. "I firmly believe that everyone has the capacity to be creative, if only they allow themselves to be."

Add more plant-based foods to your diet for better heart health

E ven if you're not a vegetarian, this information may come in handy. According to the Science Daily website, a new study suggests that cutting back on animal-based foods and eating more plant-based foods may lead to a healthier heart.

Researchers analyzed data on food intake from more than 10,000 middle-aged adults in the United States who participated in a study from 1987 through 2016. None of them had any cardiovascular disease at the outset of the study. The researchers looked at the proportion of plant-based food the participants ate compared to animal-based foods. Those who ate the most plant-based meals had a 16% lower risk of cardiovascular disease (heart attack, stroke, heart failure, and other conditions), a 32% lower risk of dying from a cardiovascular disease, and a 25% lower risk of death in general compared with those who ate the least amount of plant-based food.

Meanwhile, another study reported on the Harvard T.H. Chan School of Health website suggests that a plant-based diet may help ward off type 2 diabetes. Researchers looked at data

from nine studies that included health data from more than 300,000 participants, of whom 23,544 had type 2 diabetes. Their review of adherence to an overall predominant- ly plant-based diet found that people with the highest adherence had a 23% lower risk of type 2 diabetes than those with weaker adherence to the diets.

You may not have to go completely vegan, but cutting out meat and eating more fruits, vegetables, legumes, and whole grains can have a positive effect on your physical well-being.
