Bringing people to the center

Steve Jobs bought a small computer manufacturer named Pixar. In 2000, he relocated the company to an abandoned factory. The original plan called for three buildings, with separate offices for computer scientists, animators, and the Pixar executives.

Jobs immediately scrapped it. Instead of three buildings, he wanted a single vast space with an atrium


at its center. As Pixar's Ed Catmull explains, "The philosophy behind this design is that it's good to put the most important function at the heart of the building. Well, what's our most important function? It's the interaction of our employees. That's why Steve put a big empty space there.

Jobs saw separated offices as a design problem. He shifted the mailboxes to the atrium, then moved the meeting rooms, cafeteria, coffee bar, and gift shop to the center of the building. "The atrium initially might seem like a waste of space," says director Brad Bird. "But Steve realized that when people run into each other, when they make eye contact, things happen."

Jobs insisted that the best creations occurred when people from disparate fields were connected, especially in an age of intellectual fragmentation.
