

THE HOMEOWNERS' ASSOCIATION

s members of the HOA we are always mindful of the needs of the residents and work hard to ensure that Management and Corporate are aware of our needs and the lifestyle we pay for and deserve to have; it's our responsibility.

It's hard to understand why anyone would choose not to support that. When we go to Management or Corporate with an issue, they see that only a fraction of us are willing to stand up for what we deserve. We wonder if we are taken seriously when they see that only a portion of our residents are willing to speak out. Sadly, that answer is NO.

Many of you have legitimate complaints that we hear in our HOA meetings and on the street. But if you aren't willing to show your support by paying \$12 per home per year for a membership, then you are talking to deaf ears. We can't support you if you don't support us. Its not that we don't want to, we can't. There is strength in numbers; that's just the way it is. If we are not a united group, they don't listen to us. And if you think that you are hurting us by not joining the HOA, well, yes you are and you are hurting yourself and everyone else.

If someone is telling you not to come to our meetings because people are always complaining and yelling, then don't complain and yell. If you are a member, you are entitled and welcomed to speak your concerns, then sit down, wait for a response and if that doesn't suit you, go to the Board and discuss it further after the meeting. That is your right as a member. If you are not a member, you have no right to complain.

If you want to become a member, come to the next HOA meeting the Monday the 3rd of August, bring your \$12 and see Rosalie at the front table. She will be more than happy to accommodate you.



OUR "NEW" RULES & REGULATIONS

ith summer in full swing, we are seeing so many more people gardening and sprucing up their homes; we see them at the pool, the lake, bicycling and walking and visiting with their friends and neighbors.

Lately, the subject of their neighborly chats has included the 'Rules and Regulations' document that was delivered to each home by mail early in July. Those of us who have been here for a while know that not much has changed.

With the exception of a few things that did not pertain to our park, like the mowing of our own lawns, almost all the information was the same as it has been since the beginning of our park so there is no need to be alarmed.

One actual change has to do with the late rent date going back to the 5th of the month. Up until about 4 years ago, our late date was the 5th of the month. Then it was changed to the 10th to accommodate some residents who needed the extra time and now it's going back to the way it was before the change. The five extra days (to the 10th) helped some, but not those others who got their checks even later in the month. So, what would be fair to all?

One big problem for us is that we have not had permanent Management, for so long, who knew or enforced our rules. Also, most residents don't have their copy of the Rules or were never given one so they just don't know. However, most of the rules are 'common sense' rules that you see in every community; keep your lot clean, clean up after your pet, don't speed through the park and be courteous to your neighbor.

But now we have these Rules in writing and I encourage you to keep them in a safe place and refer to them as needed. If you need to discuss something about them that you don't understand, either talk to Carol or ask a HOA Board Member or someone else whom you trust to give you accurate information. Don't allow yourself to be angry or upset due to bad information and hype. Ask the right people.

SPECIAL NOTE: Management advises that due to the error concerning "Lawn Maintenance" a revision to these Rules will be coming soon.

FMO NEWS

omebody asked me the other day, "What has the FMO done for me?" My answer was "What did you do with the approximately \$400+ that FMO saved you last year?" He asked, "What \$400?"

My answer was this: "How about the sales tax on your lot rent that FMO assisted in stop-



ping from going into law" And, "what about the tangible tax on your Florida room, carport and shed that the FMO assisted in getting eliminated, which results in a savings of between \$40 & \$100 per year?" this is why the FMO is your safety net in Tallahassee; to make sure bad things don't happen to residents of manufactured home parks.

**The following events are fictitious but not impossible.

January 2022 – In the year of their 60th anniversary, the Federation of Manufactured Homeowners of Florida, Inc (FMO) announced they are dissolving the corporation as they are no longer able to meet their financial and legal obligations, thus ending the only statewide advocacy group for mobile/manufactured homeowners.

February 2022 – Citizens Insurance announced they will no longer offer insurance to mobile homes older than 10 years and all carports and sheds will not be included in the coverage.

March 2022 – In a cost cutting measure, the Governor has recommended abolishing the Division of Condominiums, Timeshares and Mobile Homes, thus eliminating the DBPR (Florida's Department of Business and Professional Regulations)

New bills have been creat4ed in the upcoming Legislative Session to:

- Abolish the sales tax exemption on mobile home lot rentals
- Eliminate the funding for the Mobile Home Tie-Down Program
- Eliminate the Florida Mobile Home Relocation Corporation

April 2022 – Mobile home installers no longer need to be licensed.

April 2022 – All park bingo cards subject to sales tax

April 2022 – Residents in cooperatives will lose their homestead exemption

May 2022 – Mobile homes on rental property will now be taxed as real property

June 2022 – park owners have begun to lobby for elimination of Florida Statute 723, indicating Florida Statute 83, the Landlord – Tenant Act, should once again be the governing document for mobile homes on rental property.

December 2022 – Purchases of Mobile/Manufactured homes has seen a momentous decline and is expected to continue to decline as this once affordable lifestyle has seen significant rental increases and devaluation of these homes. This once affordable alternative option to Florida Retirement is no longer viable.



NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH

he Neighborhood Watch consists on the participation of EVERY resident in our park who wants to feel protected and take a part in making Crystal Lake a safer place to live.

There are many ways in which you can help. As for now, we provide you a partial list of things you can do:

- a) Be a Watch Captain Collect information from patrols in your designated area, remind people in your area about meetings and encourage them to attend.
- b) Be a Street-Patroller make a note of anything you see that seems suspicious on your daily walks such as unidentified vehicles (We're looking into getting decals for authorized cars), people walking or biking through looking into carports or walking between houses, etc.
- c) Be a Window Watcher Be more observant and take a minute or two to make a note of anything you see on your street that just doesn't look right. Save this information for your Watch Captain to deliver to the Coordinator for record-keeping or an necessary action.
- d) So you see there's something for everyone to do to have a part in keeping our park safer and always remember: If you see something suspicious, pick up the phone and call the Pinellas Park Police Department at (727) 541-0758.

We know Richie is part of our Neighborhood Watch team when we see him because he wears a reflective vest and sometimes a white T-shirt that says PINELLAS PARK CRIME WATCH. Yet, twice now, someone has called 911 to report him patrolling late at night and even once during the early evening. What part of "PROTECTING YOU" isn't understood?

The first time, it was an inconvenience because his wife, Margie (another part of the NW team) had to come in the dark (with her walker) to bring ID so he could prove who he was to the Police.

The second time was just recently. How embarrassing to our park for someone to feel the need to report a man - on a scooter that they see during all times of the day and night, with a reflective vest - for doing a VOLUNTEER job to keep us safe and protected. And thank Goodness that he doesn't take these attacks personally and can usually laugh them off or he would have quit a long time ago. Then what?

Also, thank Goodness the PPPD only sent one Squad Car this time not like the last time when the Fire Department and a K-9 officer showed up. These officers may have been needed somewhere else for something more important.

I have to admit it would be kind of amusing to see the local police stopping the Neighborhood Watch Patrol (Richie was actually laughing when he was telling me about it) but we need the Police support. Remember the story of "The Boy Who Cried Wolf"? When help was needed no one came. Maybe we should be thankful that you see him everywhere... day and night.

I'm not suggesting that you never call 911: I'm just asking you to be selective. Get to know those who out there to protect and support you. If you see something that doesn't look right to you, call the Neighborhood Watch Team! If there is something threatening, call 911. We need for everyone to be safe.

DO YOU NEED A RIDE?

 EZride Program – this is a fee for service transportation program offered by Neighborly Care network. The program serves Pinellas county residents aged 55 and older, and disabled residents.

EZride service is offered for ANY trip purpose in Pinellas County with destinations that also include southern Pasco, as well as specific destinations in northern Hillsborough, such as H. Lee Moffitt Cancer center, the VA Hospital/Medical Clinic and the University of South Florida Medical clinics at a flat rate fee.

EZride requires an annual membership fee of just \$25, which can be given as a gift. The cost of each trip is based on a \$3.00 pickup fee plus a charge of \$1.50 per mile for each one-way trip. You can visit the website at www.Neighborly.org or call 727-571-4384. Not too bad for a quick trip to the Dr. or the Grocery store or pharmacy.

COFFEE CAKE DONUTS

Serves: 6 Ingredients

I For the Crumb Topping:

- ½ cup unsalted butter, melted
- ½ cup light brown sugar
- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- ½ teaspoon ground cinnamon

For the Glaze:

- ½ cup confectioner's sugar
- ½ tablespoon milk

For the Doughnuts:

- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- ½ teaspoon salt
- ½ cup granulated sugar
- 1 egg, at room temperature
- 1 tablespoon unsalted butter
- ½ cup milk
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract

Instructions

- Preheat oven to 325 degrees F. Spray a doughnut pan with nonstick cooking spray and set aside.
- Prepare the crumb topping by melting the butter in a heatproof bowl. Stir in brown sugar, flour and ground cinnamon until coarse crumbs form. Set aside.
- In a medium bowl, sift together flour, baking powder, and salt. Set aside.
- Cream together the sugar, egg, and melted butter. Add milk and vanilla extract.
- Once wet ingredients are combined, slowly add dry ingredients and mix until fully incorporated.
- Spoon the batter into a medium-sized Ziploc bag and seal. Cut off one corner of the bag and fill each doughnut cup ¾ full. Divide crumb topping equally between the 6 donuts. Place into the preheated oven and bake for 14-16 minutes or until donuts are slightly golden. Remove from oven and let rest in the doughnut pan for 5 minutes or until slightly cooled. Remove donuts and place on a wire rack.
- Next, make the glaze. Whisk together confectioner's sugar and milk until smooth. Drizzle desired amount over donuts and enjoy!

Fruits: 60 calories

- 1 sm. Apple or Medium orange Carbohydrates: 70 calories
- ½ cup pasta or dry cereal Hockey Puck
- ½ small bagel Hockey Puck
- 1 slice whole-grain bread Hockey Puck
- ½ medium baked potato Hockey Puck

Protein/Dairy: 110 calories

- 3 oz. Fish Deck of cards
- 2-2 $\frac{1}{2}$ oz meat 2/3 deck of cards
- $1-1\frac{1}{2}$ oz hard cheese -1/3 deck of cards

Fats: 45 calories

- 1 ½ teaspoons peanut butter − 2 dice
- 1 teaspoon of butter or margarine 1 die
