This is a partial list of what we were able to buy in the past and the prices that we charged:

Potatoes (4/\$1.00), Onions (2/\$1.00), Tomatoes (2/\$1.50), Bell Peppers (2/\$1.00), Lettuce (\$1.00), Celery (\$1.00), Scallions (2/\$1.00), Baby Carrots (\$1.00 per bag), Butternut Squash (\$1.00 each), blueberries, bananas & large eggs for \$1 a doz.

Unfortunately, since fewer people came to 'shop' this month, we will need to ask you to **sign up with us** to let us know that you are interested. Our goal is not to make money... but we don't want to lose money and have to throw out these fresh foods. Call Ron, Kim or Violet. If we are unable to answer your call, please leave a message with your name and a good phone number so we can call you back to take your orders. You can also list the things you would like us to bring back and we'll try to get exactly what you want. You can also text us or leave a message on our Facebook group page.

We'd like to be able to keep doing this service so that we can all eat better and cheaper. Remember... we don't make money doing this but we don't want to over-buy and lose money either.

NOTE: Available produce and prices may vary each time.

If this event works out, we will be doing it monthly.

<u>Eggplant Parmesan Rollatini</u>

Serves 8

Ingredients

- 4 tablespoons olive oil
- 2 large eggplants (about 3 pounds total), sliced lengthwise (about 16 slices total)
- kosher salt and black pepper
- 1¹/₂ cups marinara sauce
- 2 large eggs
- 1 15-ounce container ricotta
- 2 teaspoons dried oregano
- 2 cups grated mozzarella (8 ounces)
- ¹/₂ cup grated Parmesan (1¹/₂ ounces) Instructions:



- 1. Heat oven to 450° F. Divide the oil between 2 rimmed baking sheets. Dividing evenly, arrange the eggplant slices in a single layer on the baking sheets and turn to coat in the oil; season with ½ teaspoon salt and ¼ teaspoon pepper.
- 2. Bake the eggplant, rotating the baking sheets halfway through, until soft and beginning to brown, 12 to 15 minutes; let cool. Reduce heat to 400° F.
- 3. Meanwhile, in the bottom of a 9-by-13-inch or some other 3-quart baking dish, spread ¹/₂ cup of the marinara sauce. In a large bowl, whisk together the eggs, ricotta, oregano, 1 cup of the mozzarella, and ¹/₄ teaspoon each salt and pepper.
- 4. Place about 3 tablespoons of the ricotta mixture on one end of a slice of eggplant, roll it up, and transfer it to the prepared baking dish. Repeat with the remaining eggplant slices and ricotta mixture.
- 5. Top the eggplant rolls with the remaining cup of marinara sauce and the remaining cup of mozzarella. Sprinkle with the Parmesan.
- 6. Bake until the cheese has melted, and the sauce is bubbling, 20 to 25 minutes. Let cool for 5 minutes before serving.

I have spoken to Manager Tom about their concerns; he told me that people have also come to him about these same problems and that he is looking into ways to handle these issues.


