HAT IS IDENTITY THEFT?

Identity theft occurs when someone steals your personal identifying information and uses that information, like your name, Social Security number, or credit card number, without your permission, to commit fraud or other crimes.

The crime takes many forms. Identity thieves may rent an apartment, obtain a credit card, or establish a telephone account in your name. You may not find out about the theft until you review your credit report or a credit card statement and notice charges you didn't make - or until you're contacted by a debt collector.

RESULTS OF IDENTITY THEFT

Identity theft is serious. While some identity theft victims can resolve their problems quickly, others spend hundreds of dollars and many years repairing damage to their good name and credit record. Some consumers victimized by identity theft may lose out on job opportunities, or be denied loans for education, housing or cars because of negative information on their credit reports. In rare cases, they may even be arrested for crimes they did not commit.

HOW THIEVES GET YOUR IDENTIFICATION

- They steal your wallets, purses, or mail, including bank and credit card statements, preapproved credit offers, and checks or tax information.
 - They find a lost wallet or purse.
- They change your address by diverting your billing statements to another location by completing a change of address form.
- They rummage through your trash looking for bills or other paper with your personal information on it.
- They pretend to be financial institutions or companies and send spam or pop-up messages to get you to reveal your personal information (also known as phishing.)

PREVENTION

- Do not habitually carry your Social Security card, Social Security number, or your Medicare card.
- Never give personal information over the telephone or internet, unless you initiated the contact.
- Cancel extra credit cards and IDs. Make a list of the credit cards you keep. Never leave a PIN with your card.
 - Order your credit report at least yearly it's free.

ACTS

- September is the ninth month of the year in the Julian and Gregorian Calendars and one of four months with a length of 30 days.
- September begins on the same day of the week as December every year, because there are 91 days separating September and December, which is a multiple of seven (the number of days in the week). No other month ends on the same day of the week as September in any year. This month and May are the only two months to have this property. April and July of the previous year begin on the same day of the week as September of the current year as a common year, October of the previous year always begins on the same day of the week as September of the current year as a leap year, January of the previous year begins on the same day of the week as September of the current year as a leap year and a year immediately before that. In common years, September ends on the same day of the week as April and December of the previous year while in leap years, September ends on the same day of the week as July of the previous year. In years immediately before common years, September begins on the same day of the week as June of the following year and in years immediately before leap years, September begins on the same day of the week as March and November of the following year. In years immediately before common years, September ends on the same day of the week as March and June of the following year and in years immediately before leap years, September ends on the same day of the week as August and November of the following year.

EZride service is offered for ANY trip purpose in Pinellas County with destinations that also include southern Pasco, as well as specific destinations in northern Hillsborough, such as H. Medical trips must be within 10 mile radius from pick-up. Vehicles are wheelchair accessible. Clients must register by phone before service begins.

FROM THE KITCHEN RECIPES

GROUND BEEF STEW

Looking for something inexpensive and easy to make? Low fat crock pot recipes like this are a cinch to make. The thick and hearty mixture is chock-full of ground beef, potatoes and baby carrots. This is a healthy crock pot meal bound to receive compliments.

- 1 pound ground beef
- 6 medium potatoes, peeled and cubed
- 1 package baby carrots
- 3 cups water
- 1 envelope dry onion soup mix
- 1 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1 teaspoon Italian seasoning
- 1 to 1-1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1 can (10-3/4 ounces) condensed tomato soup, undiluted
- 1 can (6 ounces) Italian tomato paste

In a skillet, cook beef over medium heat until no longer pink; drain well. In a crock pot, combine the next 8 ingredients.

Stir in the beef. Cover and cook on high for 4-5 hours. Stir in soup and tomato paste; cover and cook for 1 hour or until heated through.

CROCKPOT RICE PUDDING WITH RAISINS

- 4 cups 2% reduced-fat milk
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1/2 cup uncooked medium-grain rice (not instant)
- 1/2 cup raisins
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg

Combine milk, sugar and rice in a medium-sized slow cooker.

Cover and cook, stirring occasionally, on high for 3 to 3 1/2 hours or until creamy. Stir in raisins and cinnamon. Pudding will thicken as it cools.





PEACH COBBLER

Ingredients

- 2 (21 oz.) cans peach pie filling
- 1 (15.25 oz.) box yellow cake mix dry
- 1/2 cup butter COLD



Spray slow cooker with cooking spray.

Dump peach pie filling on the bottom of slow cooker and evenly spread and distribute.

Evenly distribute cake mix by pouring it over the top of the peach pie filling.

Next, slice the cold butter into thin squares and lay them on top of the cake mix. You should be able to cover the entire top with thinly sliced squares of butter.

Cover and cook on LOW for 3-4 hours or until top is golden brown in color.

Serve warm with vanilla ice cream.

SLOW COOKER ITALIAN BEEF SANDWICHES

- 3 cups of boiling water
- 5 cubes of beef bouillon
- 1 tablespoon Worcestershire Sauce
- 2 teaspoons ground black pepper
- 2 teaspoons garlic powder
- 1½ teaspoons onion powder
- 1½ teaspoons dried oregano
- 1½ teaspoons dried parsley
- 1½ teaspoons dried basil
- 1 teaspoon crushed red pepper (to taste)
- 1/8 teaspoon ground thyme
- 1 (3 pound) boneless beef chuck roast, trimmed of most fat

Sandwich Fixin's

- 8 hoagie rolls
- 16 slices provolone cheese
- 1 (16 ounce) jar roasted red peppers, sliced
- 1 (16 ounce) jar mild sliced pepper rings

Turn 6 quart slow cooker to high heat. Add boiling water, beef bouillon and Worcestershire.

Combine remaining seasonings in a small bowl. Sprinkle over beef broth and whisk to combine. Add roast and flip to coat both sides. Cover and cook on high for 4 hours or low 8-10 hours. Shred beef by using two forks to pull it apart. Stir to coat all beef in the juices. Cook 1 additional hour covered. (Do not drain)

When ready to serve: Slice rolls in half, place on a baking sheet and broil in oven for 2-4 minutes until bread is lightly golden brown.

Scoop beef on toasted roll and top with 2 slices of provolone cheese. Place back on baking sheet and broil until cheese is melted. Top with red pepper slices and mild pepper rings.

Serve and enjoy.

Two-minute walks may improve your health

Exercise keeps you healthy. Fortunately for busy people, exercise doesn't have to mean working out at the gym or running a marathon. A study reported on the Science Daily website found that adding just two minutes of walking per hour to your routine can extend your life expectancy.

Scientists at the University of Utah School of Medicine discovered that taking a two-minute walk once an hour was associated with a 33 percent lower risk of dying. Even brief walks add up to a substantial benefit when taken often during the day. The scientists emphasize that these walks should be an addition to a moderate exercise habit, not a replacement for one. It's a step in the right direction.

City life? Not for all young adults


The TV sitcom Friends depicted a group of young New Yorkers enjoying life in the big city—but in the end, at least two of them chose to move to a house in the suburbs. Young adults in real life appear to be making the same choice (without the laugh track). A survey of more than 1,500 people born since 1977, released by the National Association of Home Builders, found that few of them want to remain in the city for their entire lives.

Sixty-six percent indicated they'd like to live in the suburbs, and 24 percent have their hearts set on a rural residence. Only 10 percent want to live in the center of an urban area. They're mostly looking for space: Eighty-one percent said they want three or more bedrooms wherever they end up living.

Online videos bigger than TV these days

Video has taken over the Internet, especially among the younger generation. A survey of 13-to 24-year-olds by Defy Media found this evidence of the influence of YouTube and other video providers on youthful fans:

- Millennials watch an average of 11.3 hours of free online video a week, and 10.8 hours of subscription video—but only 8.3 hours of scheduled broadcast TV.
- Videos are more popular than online TV content. Seventy-six percent of young people in the survey said they find YouTube more entertaining than TV programs (more popular with 55 percent of participants).
- They're tolerant of advertising on the Internet. Fewer than half—41 percent—said online videos have too many advertisements, but 63 percent feel TV does.
