And so we wait.....the new cabinets have been ordered and the contractors are waiting for their delivery so they can complete the project. The office has told me they should be here in the next few weeks (today is September 12), so hopefully this happens before our activities begin.

MAIL STATION:

COMPLETE! The new station appears to be working for all. For those of you that use the outgoing mailbox in front of the office, you just need to go to the new mail station and there are several outgoing mail slots to deposit your mail.

POOL: The pool is still under mandated rules from the Health Dept. on Dawn to Dusk swimming until new lighting is put in. Today (September 12) I was told that they had to get new bids from another contractor because the one they originally were working with wasn't following through.

We are still waiting for the pool deck to be repainted with a non-skid paint to avoid any unnecessary falls.

COMPLAINTS: When filing a complaint, please either take a copy with you or have the office make a copy and have them date and initial your copy. They will then let you know that the complaint has been dealt with (if it is a serious problem). They cannot tell you what was said or actions taken due to privacy issues. New management has assured us that they will stay on top of complaints.



DIRECTORY: 2019 & 2020 Management will no longer be giving us the names of new residents nor the names of who moved out. It is of great importance for neighbors to let someone from the Board know if a home has sold so that they may remove the old owner from our directory. They will then contact the new owner to see if they would like their phone number listed. The Board will be receiving the annual rent list in September so they will be able to get names and lot numbers from there, but that will not cover any months from October through April when the book goes to print.

For those that are hesitant about having your number published.....it is great for emergencies. People that don't have a purpose to call you usually don't. The HOA will never call unless absolutely necessary.

VOLUNTEERS-All organizations can use your help. Please consider volunteering for anyone of the associations. All the associations run on strictly volunteers and we are looking for those that can give an hour or two of their time for the many functions that we have. Remember, the more volunteers the quicker the task can be accomplished. You can find phone numbers to Board members of each in this book.






