EBO Statutory Committee

The committee has had several meetings regarding the annual lot rental rate increases. It is our feeling that we need to bring all of the homeowners up-to-date on recent activities. We have met with ELS management on two separate occasions. During the initial meeting, ELS presented us with a comparison spreadsheet of other parks and a proposed Long Term Agreement (LTA).

The mobile home communities that ELS provided as a comparison were by no means comparable. For the most part, they were larger communities and had more amenities than at East Bay Oaks. The LTA that was given to us was a boilerplate agreement given to all of their parks. As the Statutory Committee carefully dissected the agreement, we found numerous errors and out right violations to Florida State Statute 723 which governs mobile home parks. We also discovered new items added to the LTA, e.g. billing residents maximum ad valorem taxes, (which add up to an increase) that have not been in previous LTAs.

We had consultation with our attorney after she reviewed the proposed LTA and she made multiple recommendations to change the language and delete verbiage that protects ELS and leaves the residents unprotected.

The committee drafted a letter stating why we felt that a minimal increase would be a fair offer and mailed to ELS prior to our next meeting with them. The letter consisted of some of the issues with our community and included pictures, e g, knee high grass, crumbling pool walls, clubhouse ceiling disrepair and flooded streets.

At our next meeting with ELS management, basically their opening statement was "we are not going to make any changes to the Long Term Agreement". They totally disregarded all of the data we provided them and would not negotiate anything in the contract.


Our options as your Statutory Committee are to sign an agreement that is not in compliance with Florida law and waives your rights or move to a year-to-year rate increase. At this point, our hands are tied because we are not in favor of signing an agreement that is not supported within FSS723.

Many of the other ELS communities that currently have a Long Term Agreement are in the same situation. We are continuing to meet with other communities, getting advice from the FMO, Networking for Progress and other attorneys.

All of your Statutory Committee members went into this initiative with the mindset of fair negotiations. Unfortunately, ELS did not feel the same way. Today's personal economic climate and corporate America economics' are not in alignment. Many corporations are seeing large profits while the retired sector is not seeing any increase in pensions and the Canadian dollar continues not be strong.

At this point, nothing has been signed nor negotiated. The committee wants to be upfront and make you aware of the actions thus far. We will keep you up-to-date as developments occur.

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



Dump hours: Monday - Friday 8:00 am - 3:30 pm

Pick-up hours: Tuesday and Friday 8:00 am till 12 noon

Closed Saturday and Sunday



Trash pick-up services

- All garbage must be placed into plastic bags and securely tied weighing no more than 25 lbs.
- Please do not place trash into boxes. Boxes must be flattened and tied with string. "All broken glass/mirrors must be placed into a box and taped securely. Dispose of all medical needles and medicines properly. Do not place in trash bags.
- All newspaper should be bundled and tied securely with string.
- Trees and brush trimmings must be cut into no larger than 4-foot lengths and bundled in no more than an 18-inch diameter in order to be picked up.
- All weeds, leaves and lawn trimmings must be placed in plastic bags and tied closed for proper pick-up. Bags are to weigh no more than the 25 lbs. as specified above.
- Furniture appliances paints and any constructional materials will not be picked up. Place furniture and constructional debris in open top dumpster. Appliances and paint please call Pinellas County Solid Waste Division 727-464-7500.
- No TV's, electronics, or tires. Paint must be dried up.
- Please do not place any trash out the night before pickup. This will invite animals to rip and open your garbage making it more difficult and time consuming for pick-up. Uncontained garbage and fluids are a great health risk if inhaled by your neighbors and our staff.



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

RULES AND REGULATIONS – A GUIDE FOR RESIDENTS OF EAST BAY OAKS

A Further Look Part 2

INTRODUCTION

Last month, the following Rules were highlighted: Sale of Manufactured Homes, Pre-Qualification of Prospective Residents, Guests and Visitors and Special Rules for Recreational Area. These are all important rules that must be followed so that ALL of us can enjoy living here at East Bay Oaks.

This month, we will concentrate on some of the Resident's Responsibilities. The resident IS NOT relieved of their responsibilities just because the Owner does not fulfill all of their responsibilities. Some of these responsibilities are necessary to comply with law, and "all of the Rules and Regulations are intended to promote the convenience, safety and welfare of the Residents and to provide comfortable and pleasant surroundings."

A. MANUFACTURED HOMES – QUALITY STANDARDS

- No unauthorized structures may be erected on any home site. Permission to erect any structure must be obtained in writing from Management in advance.
- Manufactured Homes shall be attractively maintained by Resident and comply with all applicable laws, codes and ordinances, these rules and regulations, as from time to time amended, and the Community Prospectus. Failure to properly maintain the manufactured home shall be a breach of these Rules and Regulations and shall constitute grounds for eviction pursuant to Section 723.061 Florida Statutes. To maintain a clean, attractive appearance, the home should be washed every year or as needed.
- Management must approve all home site landscaping plans and any digging in order to protect underground utility lines, pipes and cables and Resident's safety. Resident is responsible for edging Resident's yard, for maintenance and trimming of shrubbery and trees thereon (NOTE: except for Palms and Oaks which are the Park's responsibility per the Prospectus) and for maintenance of Resident's lawn, including but not limited to, landscaping, fertilization, and application of insecticide as necessary.

B. STORAGE SHEDS

• The location of storage sheds must be approved in writing by Management prior to installation. Any such installation shall begin only after appropriate building permits have been obtained. All work is to be done by a licensed, qualified and bonded contractor who has proof of valid liability and workmen's compensation insurance coverage. There may be only one storage shed to a home site. All storage sheds must be properly anchored.

C. FENCES

• No fences are allowed on home sites in the Community. The use of fencing materials in any manner whatsoever must be approved by Management prior to installation.

D. MOTOR VEHICLES

Parking:

- Two (2) vehicles are permitted to each home site within the Community.
- Guest and visitor vehicles must be parked in areas as designated by Management
- No vehicles may be parked in or on common areas except as specifically authorized by Management in advance.
- No vehicles may be parked on the lawns. No overnight street parking.
- Only Registered vehicles are allowed within the Community....Vehicles which are inoperable or without valid current license plates are not allowed within the Community.
- Commercial or non-passenger vans, campers and motor homes are not allowed to be parked or stored at any time on the site.
- Trucks no larger than one tone are permitted

E. PETS

- All pets must be approved by Management in writing before.... Resident obtains a pet after move in.
- Resident may keep not more than two (2) pets. Not to exceed eighteen (18) inches in height at the shoulder at maturity, nor exceed twenty (20) pounds each at maturity defined as follows:
 - 1) dog
 - 2) domestic cat
 - 3) Bird
 - 4) Fish
 - 5) other domestic animal as approved by Management
- Noisy or unruly animals, animals considered dangerous or vicious by Management and animals with respect to which other residents file justifiable complaints with Management must be removed from the community.
- All Pets MUST be on a leash no longer than six (6) feet at any time the pet is outside the Resident's home site.
- Pets may not be walked on the lawns of any home site in the Community, other than the Resident's home site.
- When walking a pet, Resident must have with them at all times a suitable means to pick up and properly dispose of all pet litter immediately.
- No pets are allowed in the Community Recreation areas at any time.
- Guests pets are not permitted in the Community.
- Resident shall not conduct any breeding or commercial enterprise or activity in the Community.
