

t was suggested that a summary of the Manager's Meeting be put into the **MANAGER** News & Views each month for those who could not attend. This is a summary from October and November of 2015.

- 1. THE RENT INCREASE IS \$7. See accompanying aarticle.
- 2. CUTTING THROUGH YARDS is not permitted. When people pay lot rent, this becomes their space.
- 3. The HANDICAP spots on the east side of the Clubhouse are for car parking, not for golf carts.
- 4. ROOT CONTROL. It is recommended that you use a root control product in your bathroom; it is available at Home Depot for \$12 a bottle, which is 4 applications, and you only use it once every 6 months. If you have a root problem at the clean-out, it is the Park's responsibility, but some root problems have been developing under the mobiles and in the vent pipe, which is the home owner's problem.
- 5. LAWN SERVICE Complaint forms are available in the Office.

- 6. FMO. It is highly recommended that everyone join this organization. For more information, contact Ron Russell at 727-538-2439.
- 7. SIDEWALK REPAIRS are being done to comply with an insurance audit. I understand that other sidewalks need work, but they are not on the agenda right now.
- 8. GARBAGE. (Large items, yard waste, remodeling materials) is only to be put out to the road on Sunday, Tuesday, and Thursday after 5:00 pm. (No one wants to look at outside garbage 7 days a week,)
- 9. RECYCLING BINS. Please break down all boxes befpre putting them in the bins so the containers do not fill up too fast, as we can only get them dumped once a week. ALSO, read the sign that tells you what can be put in the recycling bin.
- 10. HOUSEHOLD TRASH. If the dumpster on 12th Street is full, please take your trash to one of the other 2 containers (4th and 3rd Streets). When you put it on the ground, the animals get to it, and then the area looks messy.
- 11. Reminder that there is a trailer available for large remodeling projects or yard trimming . Make arrangements with Roy at 727-678-2066.
- 12. THE LIBRARY Is looking for donations of DVD's. Over 100 have been borrowed and not returned in the last six months.
- 13. There is no overnight street parking, or on the grass. If have more vehicles than you have room for in your carport, park one of them in the 12th Street lot.
- 14. NO TRASH BURNING. Fire pits and BBQ grills are for food preparation and ambiance.
- 15. PHONE BOOK. We have a volunteer to do an electronic phone book, with e-mail addresses . A printed copy will be sold (reasonably priced to just cover printing) for those who do not have computers. I have a master list in the office for everyone to stop in to make sure their information is correct, and to add an e-mail address if desired. You also can request DO NOT PRINT if you do not want your name and number to appear. Deadline for updates will be January 15th, 2016, with the book available as soon as possible after that.

Get on pace for a healthy new year

The end of the year is the perfect time to commit to a healthier lifestyle going forward. How can you maintain your resolve on a daily basis? Try these tips:

- Pick a partner. People who exercise with friend have a higher success rate.
- Set concrete goals. Don't vaguely aim to walk "more" each day. Set challenging but realistic goals. And be sure to chart your progress.
- Shorten the duration. Rather than a single hourlong session, aim for three 20-minute workouts or four 15-minute workouts a day. People who opt for shorter sessions actually tend to work out more over the course of a week.
- **Redefine "exercise."** You don't have to spend hours at the health club to stay in shape. Keep track of your daily activity and try to incorporate healthy behaviors like walking for at least 20 minutes, taking the stairs instead of the elevator, or getting off the bus or train a block early. Exercise will become part of your day, not an added chore.
- **Clear your mind.** Make a regular date with yourself for exercise and train yourself not to think about all the other tasks you could be doing. Focus on the here and now and don't get distracted by the future or the past.
- Find exercise you enjoy. Most gyms offer a variety of exercise equipment, so choose an activity that makes you feel good while you're doing it, not something you detest no matter how beneficial it may be. Riding a bike through your neighborhood is just as helpful as sitting on a stationary bicycle in the gym.
- Set your own goals. Even if you work with a buddy or trainer, decide for yourself what you want to achieve. Set realistic targets that challenge you, not impossible goals that make you reluctant to try.

NEA: Fewer Americans enjoy the arts in person

When was the last time you went to the symphony, the ballet, or a museum? A National Endowment for the Arts study points to a disturbing trend: The number of Americans attending core arts events like the opera, the theater, and other activities is on the decline.

According to "A Decade of Arts Engagement: Findings From the Survey of Public Participation in the Arts, 2002–2012," only 33.4 percent of U.S. adults attended any arts events between July 2011 and July 2012—down from 34.6 percent in 2008, and down yet again from a decade earlier when the figure was 39.4 percent.

One bright spot in the report: Although only a third of U.S. adults attended a cultural event in person, 71 percent said they had watched, listened to, or downloaded some kind of artistic event via the Internet. That includes streaming pop music, however, lumping Beethoven in with Nicki Minaj.



Americans upbeat about science





espite controversies and disagreements about climate change, genetically modified foods, animal testing, and other scientific issues, most U.S. citizens have a positive view of science and scientists, according to a study from the Pew Research Center.



The study found that 79 percent of U.S. adults believe science has made their lives better, and a majority of them have a positive view of science's impact on such matters as food quality, health care, and the environment. Additionally, 61 percent believe that government investment is essential to scientific progress, although 34 percent say that

private investment would be sufficient.

The effort to understand the universe is one of the very few things that lifts human life a little above the level of farce, and gives it some of the grace of tragedy.

'Sandwich' material may protect future space travelers

ne danger posed by long space voyages is damage to a spacecraft's hull by micro-meteors and other space debris. Even a very small object racing at high speeds can strike like a bullet, poking a nasty hole in the side of a spaceship millions of miles from Earth. Shields offer some protection, like the one used by the International Space Station to

vaporize objects before they hit. But according to the Science Daily website, scientists may be close to perfecting a self-sealing substance that can repair a small breach in a short time.

The material is made by placing a reactive liquid between two layers of a solid polymer. In experiments shooting bullets into the "sandwich," the liquid was able to quickly establish a solid plug once it was exposed to air, preventing an oxygen leak from inside a spacecraft. The substance could also be used in cars and other terrestrial structures, the researchers say.

Undersea monolith poses a mystery

T may not be the imposing black monolith from the film "2001: A Space Odyssey," but it's mysterious nonetheless: Explorers have discovered a manmade stone structure deep in the waters off Sicily, and its purpose is a puzzle.

The object, originally on an island in the Sicilian Channel that became submerged during a flood 9,300 years ago, is 12 meters long (39 feet) and weighs 15 tons. Scientists estimate that it's about 9,350 years old. Broken in two pieces at a depth of 40 meters (139 feet), the object has three roughly similar holes: one on the top, and two more on its sides. The structure would have required cutting, extraction, transport, and installation, suggesting its makers had fairly advanced engineering skills. Its purpose remains unclear.

How do you weigh a dead dinosaur?

Paleontologists routinely tell us that a particular dinosaur or mammal from millions of years ago weighed X pounds, but how do they measure the weight of an animal that's extinct? Here's one new technique scientists have developed:

The first step is constructing a digital model of the bones recovered. Then a computer program covers the model in a digital "shrink wrap" to estimate the animal's volume. In the final step, they come up with an estimate using a volume-to-mass conversion based on 14 living mammals starting with the red deer (90 kilograms) to the African elephant (2.7 metric tons).

This process allows researchers to calculate that the wooly mammoth weighed in at 3.6 metric tons, and the giant ground sloth was 3.7 metric tons.





Enjoy the holidays of December

ecember is a month of celebrations and holidays that span many different countries and cultures. Don't miss out on any of them. Here's a guide to what your friends and neighbors are up to this month:

Hanukkah, Dec. 6-14.

The eight-day Jewish holiday begins at sundown. Hanukkah marks the rededication of the Temple of Jerusalem following the Jews' victory in the Maccabean Revolt in 165 B.C. According to the Talmud, the Jews had only enough olive oil to keep the eternal flame in the Temple burning for a single day—but miraculously, the oil continued to burn for eight days, during which time the Jews were able to produce and consecrate fresh oil for the flame.

Hanukkah is observed by the lighting of a nine-branched candelabrum, called a menorah. One candle is lit each of the eight nights, with a central candle lit each night to light the others.

Christmas, Dec. 25.

This Christian holiday celebrates the birth of Jesus, sometime between the years 7 and 2 B.C. The word "Christmas" comes from "Christ's Mass," a phrase first recorded in old English as Cristes mæsse in 1038. Christmas began to be observed with feasts and celebrations in the Middle Ages—the online encyclopedia Wikipedia notes that King Richard II of England hosted a Christmas feast in 1377, with 28 oxen and 300 sheep eaten.

The colonial Puritans of New England disapproved of Christmas celebrations, banning them during the 17th century. But other colonists observed the day with Christmas trees and nativity scenes. President Ulysses S. Grant signed the law making Christmas a federal holiday in 1870.

Kwanzaa, Dec. 26 to Jan. 1.

A seven-day celebration of African heritage and culture, Kwanzaa was created in 1966 by activist Maulana Karenga to provide African-Americans with a holiday that emphasized their shared history and experience. The name Kwanzaa is derived from "matunda ya kwanza," a Swahili phrase meaning "first fruits."

Houses are decorated with African art and colorful cloth, and seven candles are placed in the kinara, a candleholder. The central candle in the kinara is black, with three red candles on the left and four green candles on the right. The candles represent the Seven Principles of Kwanzaa, which are contemplated each day as one is lit: unity, self-determination, collective work and responsibility, cooperative economics, purpose, creativity, and faith.
