PARK RULE REGARDING PAYING YOUR RENT

Rents are payable in advance, <u>due on the first regular business day of the</u> <u>month and late after the fifth of the month.</u> Late fees of \$1 per day will be assessed as of the first of the month for all rent paid after the 6th of the month. Pursuant to Florida Statute 83.49, no rent will be accepted more than six months in advance." This means that your rent check must be IN THE OFFICE by the 5th, not dated before the 5th and slipped in the door on the 10th, or whatever; I check the office daily for checks the first week of the month, even on non-office days. EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY, any rent checks received after the 5th will be subject to a service charge of \$5, plus late fees, if I receive it after the 5th and have to send you a letter.... this does not pertain to anyone who has made special arrangements with me to pay their rent later due to extenuating circumstances. Regarding the 6-month rule, this means over 6 months paid on one check, and does not pertain to those who leave monthly post-dated checks with me. If this problem continues, I will entertain the idea of late fees being a flat \$30 per month, whether it is one day late or more. For those of you who mail me your check, I will look at the postmark to see if it was sent in a timely manner...no one will be penalized due to the issues we have with the US postal system.

Did you know that July is also...

National Cell Phone Courtesy Month. As the cell phone has developed into the smartphone, it's become one of the biggest distractions of all time. National Cell Phone Courtesy Month was founded in 2002 with the intent of making cell phone users more respectful of their surroundings.

Underwater cave fish is first found in Europe

The first cave fish in Europe has been discovered by a German underwater cave explorer, according to the U.S. News & World Report website.

Cave fish have been discovered in other parts of the world, but the German discovery is the first time one has been found as far north as Europe. Scientists believe it arose some 20,000 years ago and has evolved to live in an underground environment.



The diving spelunker encountered the fish while exploring an underwater cave in southern Germany. The fish is almost colorless and resembles the stone loach found in rivers close by, although it has smaller eyes and larger nostrils.

Enhance your success with kindness

Nice people can finish first, insist Lisa Kaplan Thaler and Robin Koval in The Power of Nice:How to Conquer the Business World with Kindness (Currency). The book's core tenets remain worthy of consideration. Improve your "NiceQ" with these exercises:

- Be kind to yourself so it's easier to be nice to others.
- Share credit and treat everyone with respect instead of "kissing up and kicking down."

• Say no when necessary—but present it in a positive light. When turning down an assignment, help find someone else who can take it.

- Plant seeds of kindness by doing five nice things every day that have no quick payoff.
- Complete the statement "If I were a kinder person I would ..." and then act on it."

Don't let these get in your way

ften the biggest obstacle to our success lies in our way of thinking. Self-help guru Tony Robbins points out three mistakes you may be making that undermine your progress:

• Confirmation bias. When looking for data or advice, do you have a truly open mind or are you just looking for information that confirms what you already believe? If the latter, you could miss important facts.

• Recency bias. Everything changes, but if you ignore this fact of life you may end up repeating the same steps without making real progress. Just because something worked once doesn't mean it will continue to be successful. Review your strategies on a regular basis and be ready to change if they're no longer applicable.

• Loss aversion. Some of us tend to dwell more on our failures than our success, leading us to avoid risks at all costs. Anticipate failures so you can prevent them. Learn to accept and learn from your failures so you can move forward.

Artificial intelligence is coming

rtificial intelligence sounds scary in science fiction stories and movies, but it's becoming a big factor in business success, according to a report from Tata Consultancy Services. Its survey of 834 executives across 13 global industry sectors found that 84 percent of organizations see AI as essential, and 50 percent believe it will transform their businesses.

AI doesn't appear to be cheap, though. Seven percent of business survey said they invested more than \$250 million on AI in 2016, and 2 percent expect to spend a billion dollars by the year 2020.

Energy drink and vodka? Think again

E nergy drinks like Red Bull or Monster Energy are all the rage, and so is mixing them with alcohol for a more potent cocktail, especially among young people. But is it safe? In research reported on the WebMD website, the answer looks like "no."

Canadian researchers analyzed 13 studies involving alcohol mixed with highly caffeinated energy drinks. They found a higher rate of injury among people indulging in such cocktails compared with simply drinking alcohol by itself. Injuries included car accidents, falls, violence, and suicidal behavior.

The authors point out that the stimulant effects of energy-drink caffeine can mask the impact of alcohol, even though alcohol still has an impairing effect on the body and the brain.

Watch your waist in your 40s to avoid dementia later

arrying belly weight during the 40s appears to increase the risk for dementia in the 70s, whereas carrying extra midsection weight later in life isn't as accurate an indicator. Researchers say these findings are disturbing because 50 percent of adults in the United States are considered abdominally obese.

Researchers at Kaiser Permanente studied 6,583 people who were between the ages of 40 and 45. An average of 36 years later, 16 percent of the participants— who had been measured for abdominal density—were diagnosed with dementia. Abdominal obesity increased the risk of dementia regardless of whether people had normal overall weight or were overweight or obese overall—and regardless of the health conditions including diabetes, cardiovascular disease, and stroke.




