Prepare Your Home for Hurricane Season

Hurricane Season is for 6 months from June 1 to November 30. If you leave for two weeks or more you must put away all objects outside your home that could become missiles in a hurricane wind (i.e. hoses, garden equipment, hanging baskets, bar-b-q, lawn furniture and wall hangings including thermometers). Strip your fruit trees of any fruit and hire someone to watch for weeds or overgrown bushes. If you leave a car in your driveway and the license tag will expire while you are gone, back into your driveway, as the City of Largo can cite you for having a car that is not ready to drive.



Our Scramble was kept on time with the help of Stephanie Herdmann.


