



2018 Annual Putting Contest Results



History of Women Working Wonders

in Fairway known as WWW, or Women Working Wonders.

In the November 2014 - April 2015 period, the Physical Assistance equipment program had to be discontinued due to insurance and liability issues A process was set in place to contact anyone still in possession of such devices with the alternative of returning them or keeping them as their own possession by signing a waiver indicating they were taking possession and would not hold WWW or FV liable for any future injury. Waivers remain on file in the FV office and sin the WWW files. Articles were placed in the flier indicating alternative sources for equipment.

This is the third and final article summarizing the history of the 10 year old organization

In collaboration with FSO/FSC and FVRA, WWW contributed \$900 toward the purchase of hearing assistance devices for use by the hearing impaired in the Clubhouse for meetings and other activities. Orientation to the new devices was held by WWW whose members also volunteered to loan out devices at several CH activities. Volunteers from WWW and FSC continue to distribute the devices.

In January 2015, WWW members began hosting the annual 90th Birthday Party for FSC as volunteers and continues to plan and staff this activity sponsored by FSC each year.

In the November 2015 - April 2016 season, due to the fact that many WWW members are seasonal residents, it was decided to expand membership from the original 20 to include five

others on the waiting list. The expanded membership ensured more "hands on deck" during periods when the activity of the group expands.

Membership contributions, which had been suspended for a couple of years due to sufficient income in the WWW treasury, were reinstated to ensure continuance of valuable services to residents in need. Recent unsolicited donations from residents were primarily related to the loan of physical assistance equipment and had previously increased the treasury. Without those donations, the members felt a return to their own personal contributions was appropriate.

Members personally interviewed each of the 2016 90th Birthday honorees, obtaining personal facts and stories to share at the January event, emceed by Mary Blythe. A DVD of the 90th Birthday Party highlights, developed by FV resident Madolyn McMahon and reproduced by Mary Blackmon, another resident, was paid for by WWW and distributed to each honoree as part of a Valentine remembrance.

The WWW "client list grew to 71 residents representing 49 households. It is unknown how many member visits and personal contacts have been made with residents during this time frame. WWW delivered 150 meals collectively for Thanksgiving and 5 Lite Supper meals during this period. Annual projects such as meal delivery, flower/plant delivery, the 90th Birthday Party, etc. are headed up by teams that volunteer to organize and coordinate each activity. At the last meeting in spring of 2016, Margaret (Peg) Williams, who provided leadership to WWW since its formation, indicated her desire to step back from the leadership role at 8 years of valuable and effective leadership to the group. A TEAM concept of leadership was instituted in 2016-17, led by Co-Chairs, with Mary Blythe as mentor/adviser. Chairperson Williams tuned her responsibilities over to the new Co-Chairs, JoAnn Mauro and Jean Weaver for the 2016-17 year.

Membership as of 2016, includes the twelve original or near original members noted in the first Flier article who still belong as well as: Evie Bowles, Lois Davis, Darla Gabriel, Sandy Houchens, Betty Kentish, Pat Lumley, Mary Marks, JoAnn Mauro, Carol Pace, Lois Perrault, Shirley Reynolds, Jean Weaver and Carol Wilson.

The services of WWW continue to be administered on a confidential basis. The organization does not reveal, or publicize those in the community receiving financial assistance, getting meal delivery, seasonal remembrances or any other form of assistance from WWW. Requests for financial assistance is handled by a small (2-3 members) committee and the type of assistance only is revealed to the membership, not the name of the recipient(s). The only public acknowledgment of any residents occurs at the annul 90th Birthday Party in conjunction with FSC, an event to which invitations are delivered and participation remains voluntary. WWW members are pleased that our services bring smiles and joy to those remembered at birthdays, holidays and other occasions and that we can bring needed services to those who require assistance. we feel the mission of the organization continues to be fulfilled and, as long as there are willing volunteers in our community, we foresee WWW continuing to be a helping hand for many years to come.

Rod was elected to the FVRA Board of Directors and served six years. During his tenure he served as Vice President and President (when the sitting President returned North for the summer. He also served as the Golf Committee liaison.

A few of the other activities Rod was involved with include:

- Reinstituting New England Night, which is now called the New England Strawberry Cabaret, which features professional entertainers and strawberry shortcake. Rod served as Chair of this committee for six years.
- FVRA State Flag Project Rod took over this project shortly after moving in and has done a terrific job keeping the flags flying in the park.
- Rod helped with the recycling program for many years, crushing cans in the can shed and transporting them to the recycling center. He also over saw the newspaper recycling.
- He was instrumental in encouraging the Association to use the FVRA logo. Rod worked with the FSO (now FSC) to sell shirts and jackets with the park logo.
- Member of the Audio Committee for many years and instrumental in convincing the Board to build the current sound booth in the clubhouse.

Start thinking green this spring

ost of us can do a lot better when it comes to being ecofriendly. Here are two areas where we can improve upon our good intentions while we lessen our negative impact on the environment:

• Recycling. It's great if you always throw your empty soda cans and water bottles in the recycle bin, but are there other items you are overlooking? If your municipality has a recycling program they probably have a set of guidelines posted online that explains what they accept and how you should prepare those items for disposal. Even though that peanut butter jar is marked as being recyclable, it might be considered garbage if traces of peanut butter are still in it. Find out what you need to know and make a commitment to recycle as much as possible, properly.



• The brown bag lunch. Embrace sustainability when you take your lunch to work by eliminating the amount of disposable products you use. Carry your lunch in a cloth sack, bento box, or small basket. Pack food in glass, metal, or some other kind of reusable containers. Swap out paper napkins with cloth napkins, and plastic straws with metal ones. Consider keeping a coffee mug and set of flatware at your desk in an effort to generate less waste.

A broadband of conservation

In 1989, attorney and activist Susan Tixier mobilized a group of "mature" women on a hike through Utah's Grand Staircase-Escalante. Most of them were already involved in wilderness preservation efforts, but their goal was to discuss conservation issues surrounding many of the U.S. national monuments and make sure that the voices of older Americans were represented in that conversation.

A member of a passing group of hikers saw them and said, "What a bunch of great old broads!"

On that day, Tixier and her colleagues decided to officially call themselves "Great Old Broads for Wilderness." Since then they've grown their membership to 8,000 across 38 "Broadbands" nationwide.

The group advocates for issues affecting the environment and wilderness protection causes. Their ranks include "Young Broads," and men of all ages, "Bros." They host "Broadwalks" where they dedicate a day of stewardship to an area, address conservation issues there, and spend time hiking and exploring.
