The Grand Opening of Four Seasons was celebrated in April 1970. The first billboard erected was on the

PARK MANAGER'S REPORT

The Park is certainly getting busy as our winter residents return. Many of you have stopped by the office just to say "hello" and to let Desiree know that you are here – we appreciate that. It's important for us to know that homes are occupied and we automatically change your address in our records so that important mail can be delivered appropriately while you are here. Let us know if you need to update your emergency contact information - that, too, is important. We appreciate **MANAGER** your help in keeping all of our records in good order.

You'll notice a lot has taken place here in the park since you left. Despite a record-breaking summer of rain, we were able to get the streets resealed. The palms have been trimmed by Alexander's. Thanks to Clay and Joe, the clubhouse has been power washed & painted; the laundry room renovated, the pool shower redone, new fans installed in the pool patio, and work is almost completed on coach #229.

Please take particular note that STOP SIGNS have been placed at each exit of the park as you drive on to 101st Street. Placement of these new signs was required by City of Largo as part of the permit process for the Sealcoat project done by Asphalt Maintenance Company. Please be sure to observe all stop signs in the park, particularly now that many residents are walking and riding bikes.

The winter mowing schedule is now in effect – every other Tuesday of the month. In December, there may be one cutting early in the month – then the regular schedule resumes after the first of the year.

Tampa Bay Plumbers has been back in the park finishing the valve discovery process. As previously mentioned, these "old' valves will then be marked appropriately for the next step of future replacement.

There has been a legitimate concern about the condition of the water in the channel between FSE and Pointe West. As reported last month, I contacted the Largo Director of Public Works and they have placed a yellow barrier in the water at the bridge and worked with a very large

machine in the water at the 2nd park entrance. This machine actually trimmed trees and branches along the channel. I continue to be in contact with Largo Public Works and will alert you once a schedule is in place for additional treatment.

We have had several visits from Matthew Grzeslo, Lead Spray Technician for the Pinellas County Mosquito Control. In early November, he sprayed the large canal for surface vegetation and in mid-November he treated the Hydrilla under the surface and algae in several applications. The small channel (between Pointe West and Four Seasons) is the responsibility of City of Largo. The larger canal is maintained by Pinellas County.

I placed another call to Pinellas County Mosquito Control with a request for treatment. It will help if you walk around your mobile once in a while and check to see if there are any places where water/rain accumulates. Left unattended, mosquitoes will breed easily, especially in these days of unusual heat.

Many letters were sent out in early November to homeowners regarding the abundance of weeds in flower beds, sides and rear of coaches. The weeds were exceptional this year due to the monsoon rainy season. Power washing of coaches and exterior painting is also in order. Carport clutter must be remedied. It is incumbent for each owner to maintain his/her own home for the benefit of the entire community.

Also, I encourage those interested to attend Largo Commission meetings which are open to the public. **Largo City Commission** meetings are held on the first and third Tuesday of the month at 6 pm. All meetings take place in City Commission Chambers at Largo City Hall, 201 Highland Avenue. RECYCLING PROGRAM AND TRASH COLLECTION

e are well into our second year of recycling and thank all residents for their cooperation. Each home has a blue bin with your house # painted on the side. The following items should be put into your blue bin and put by the curb on our trash pickup days.

- Glass jars and colored glass bottles or jars
- Juice and milk containers
- All types of cans
- Shredded paper (only if placed in a paper bag)
- Clean papers including newspapers
- Flattened card board

• Plastic jars and bottles

NO PLASTIC BAGS OR STYROFOAM SHOULD BE PLACED IN YOUR BLUE BIN. THESE ITEMS ARE NOT RECYCLABLE. THEY SHOULD BE PLACED IN YOUR REGULAR TRASH CONTAINER.

There are also recycling bins in the Clubhouse (under the new counter by the front door) for eyeglasses, cell phones, flags, and Labels for Education. Recycle containers are also by the soda machine in the clubhouse and in the pool area. We will pick up trash and recyclables EVERY MONDAY AND THURSDAY. Please rinse any jars, bottles, and cans. THANK YOU FOR HELPING OUR ENVIRONMENT.

Trash may be deposited 24/7 in the garbage dumpster behind the gate in the maintenance area. Do not leave anything outside the gate. Our trash pickup days are Monday and Thursday – unless a holiday falls on the usual pickup day. This will be noted in the monthly calendar.

- Observe special times for your young visitors. Children under the age of 16 may use the pool between the hours of 10AM 1PM and 5PM till dusk, and should be accompanied at all times by their host/s or a designated adult.
- Straighten the chairs and tables whenever you move them around don't leave them for someone else to rearrange.
- If you put an umbrella up make sure you put it down and tie it when you leave the pool. Winds can blow up quickly we wouldn't want anyone to be injured by a flying umbrella.
- The green wrist bands serve to identify residents and guests it's important for everyone's security to know who belongs here and who doesn't. PLEASE WEAR THEM.
- Be sure to dispose of trash properly there is a special covered can for aluminum cans and other recyclables – do not put household/personal trash in the trash can – NO GLASS ALLOWED IN THE POOL AREA (this is for everyone's safety).
- Use bike rack near the east entrance to the pool. Please do not park your bike on the patio.
- Be mindful of playing loud music when others are in the pool. Some may enjoy it others like the quietness. Please be respectful.
