A MESSAGE FROM THE ROC BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Tello Everyone:

Well, Christmas has passed, January has left us and we are on our way into the New Year. There have been a lot of changes here in our Community. We, the Board of Directors have heard your calls and have responded. Our hope is for continuity and harmonious relationships with all of the people in our community.

We have welcomed a new Office Manager. Some of you have already met her at this point. Her name is Kathleen, she prefers to go by Kathy. She comes to us with over 25 years of management experience. She is very task driven, as well as a pleasant personality. In addition, we also have a new maintenance person. His name is Steve. He comes to us with many years of experience in his field as well. I'm sure you all will be seeing him around the Community, so please join in welcoming him as well.

I also want to remind everyone that our office hours are from 9AM-3PM, Monday through Friday. These have always been our posted hours, so please make note that we will be adhering to those hours. While you may on occasion see a light on in the office or a car still outside, the phones will not be answered and the door will be locked. We ask that you respect the posted working hours, as stated above of 9AM-3PM. We want you all to have privacy for your questions, comments, or concerns. Going forward, there will be two (2) board members doing all interviewing of prospective buyer/s and renter/s. This is under the advice of our attorney. As of January 1, 2019 this will be and has become our standard practice.

This is done so that their friends or neighbors may offer their assistance to the resident as they are recovering. We realize that there are many federal, state and local government agencies already in place for the purpose of assisting our neighbors in need. One such Agency is the Senior Helpline (Phone number -727-217-8111) which provides information on aging services including caregiver support, case management, daycare, home - delivered meals, in - home help, insurance counseling, legal help and alternative living arrangements.

According to a recent AARP study, 28 percent of people age 75 and older in Florida live alone. The AARP Florida state director, Jeff Johnson, says that Floridians are particularly at risk of isolation because many moved here from elsewhere and may not have family or other companions nearby.

We have a group of individuals in our park who are concerned that we may have some neighbors who may be in need of a helping hand but do not know who to ask or where to get information on resources that may be available to them. This group is presently an informal network who would like to act as a "good neighbor resource" for our neighbors in need. We do not wish to "reinvent the wheel". However, we would appreciate hearing from anyone with ideas as to how we can best assist in meeting the needs of a neighbor that are not currently being met by the agencies already out there. There is a great deal of experience, knowledge and talent in this park and we would appreciate hearing from you. 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
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
