



WHERE IN THE WORLD HAVE YOU BEEN?

EUROPEAN TRIP – JOAN AND STAN MACDONALD

e had a wonderful experience visiting five countries; Hungary, Croatia, Serbia, Bulgaria and Romania.

We departed Halifax on August 8/17 to Toronto and then overnight to Budapest, Hungary. We boarded Uniworld's River Duchess riverboat early on the 9th and spent a leisure day enjoying its amenities. That evening, we met the Captain and his officers at a welcoming champagne dinner party. The next day, we enjoyed a wonderful panoramic bus tour of Budapest and all its old historic buildings.

Later that night, we sailed the beautiful Danube stopping the next day in Vukovar, Croatia. We were bussed to the small village of Osijek where we were treated to an authentic Croatian meal at a family farm where they grow organic fruits and vegetables according to European Union Standards. Once back in Vukovar, we visited the bullet ridden water tower, a reminder of the bitter Croatian War of Independence of 1991-1995 where several thousands died.

Our next stop was Belgrade, Serbia where we visited the Memorial Museum of Josep Tito. The high-lite was our tour of the Dynasty Palace built in the 1920s and 30s. It was outstandingly rich even down to gold floor tiles.

August 13th, we sailed the Danube towards Bulgaria. We cruised an 83 mile stretch through scenic gorges cut through the Carpathian and Balkan Mountains that create a natural border between Bulgaria and Serbia. This is classed as one of the most dramatic and beautiful sights in Europe, as well as being very dangerous.

Next stop was Vidin, Bulgaria from where we were bussed to a small town in the foothills of the Balkan Mountains where we could hike and explore the astonishing rock formations that are over 200 million years old. Joan and I did not climb to the top, but our younger friends who did, took our camera and provided us with amazing photos.

August 15th, we cruised to Rousse. We took a bus excursion to a small village, visited a commercial freshwater fisherman's farm where we also enjoyed a Belgian lunch.

The next day, we arrived at our final destination of Bucharest, Romania where we stayed for two days at the Radisson Blu, one of the most modern hotels we have ever stayed at. During the next two days, we toured the city. Two of our favorite high-lites were; a visit to the People's Palace, the second largest building in the world (The Pentagon being first). It has 1100 rooms, is 12 storys high, and 20,000 laborers worked on the building which nearly bankrupted the country. The second was a visit in the country to see 'Vlad the Impaler's Tomb' and the 18th century 'Mogojoaia Palace' – both outstanding!

On August 18th, we flew home via Frankfurt Germany where we spent the night. We really enjoyed our historic trip, but are very glad we live in two of the most wonderful countries in the world; Canada and the U.S.A.


