





At this reading every home owner should have received a letter from the ROC informing us that the rent is going up \$6.00 per month beginning January 1, 2016. While this increase had been discussed at a meeting we had with the ROC this past spring, we had hoped that it might not have been approved. As homeowners we are **not** particularly pleased with the increase since our Social Security benefits have not been given a cost of living increase and, as we know, many of our residents cannot stand another strain on their check each month. We, the HOA, will continue to negotiate on your behalf concerning this issue and others with the ROC.

Once again, we encourage you, the Homeowner, to help protect your investment by joining the Homeowners Association. Either bring your annual fee of \$20.00 to the next meeting in November or drop it off at our treasurer's (Natalie Eustace) home #115.

You can pick up a new park telephone directory and update your emergency contact information if necessary. We appreciate your help in keeping all of our records in good order.

You'll notice a lot has taken place here in the park since you left. Despite a record-breaking summer of rain, we were able to get the streets resealed. The palms have recently been trimmed by Alexander's. Thanks to Clay and Joe, the clubhouse has been power washed & painted; the laundry room renovated, the pool shower redone, new fans installed in the pool patio, and work continues on coach #229.

The winter mowing schedule is now in effect – every other Tuesday of the month.

Tampa Bay Plumbers has been back in the park finishing the valve discovery process. As previously mentioned, these "old' valves will then be marked appropriately for the next step of future replacement.

There is legitimate concern about the condition of the water in the channel between FSE and Pointe West. I did speak to Brian Usher, Director of Public Works, and did receive a recent return call from his assistant Kim Tracy. Kim mentioned she would be in touch with me on their scheduling for the cleanup. That cleanup might include removal of sediment which requires permitting from the Army Corps of Engineers. Any phone calls from you (our concerned residents) to the City of Largo are empowering to you as well. Contact Brian Usher, Director of Public Works, City of Largo at 727-587-6700 x6741. The next day was the Happy Trail Kennel...dog mushing. From here we went to Alyeska Resort in Girdwood which was WOW. The views and the inside of this resort were top notch. Then finally onto the Alaskan Wildlife Conservation Center which lead us to Seward to board the Norwegian Sun.



One of the most important principles Paul conveyed was that the faith we have received must be handed down to others. It is not enough for us to believe. We must train others, who can then in turn train those who will come after them in the faith.

NO PLASTIC BAGS OR STYROFOAM SHOULD BE PLACED IN YOUR BLUE BIN. THESE ITEMS ARE NOT RECYCLABLE. THEY SHOULD BE PLACED IN YOUR REGULAR TRASH CONTAINER.

There are also recycling bins in the Clubhouse (under the new counter by the front door) for eyeglasses, cell phones, flags, and Labels for Education. Recycle containers are also by the soda machine in the clubhouse and in the pool area. We will pick up trash and recyclables EVERY MONDAY AND THURSDAY. Please rinse any jars, bottles, and cans. THANK YOU FOR HELPING OUR ENVIRONMENT.

Trash may be deposited 24/7 in the garbage dumpster behind the gate in the maintenance area. Do not leave anything outside the gate. Our trash pickup days are Monday and Thursday – unless a holiday falls on the usual pickup day. This will be noted in the monthly calendar. Please put your trash in a can with a lid to deter animals and particularly the black birds from getting into it and spreading food, etc. all over the streets.

- Straighten the chairs and tables whenever you move them around don't leave them for someone else to rearrange.
- If you put an umbrella up make sure you put it down and tie it when you leave the pool. Winds can blow up quickly we wouldn't want anyone to be injured by a flying umbrella.
- The green wrist bands serve to identify residents and guests it's important for every-one's security to know who belongs here and who doesn't. PLEASE WEAR THEM.
- Be sure to dispose of trash properly there is a special covered can for aluminum cans and other recyclables – do not put household/personal trash in the trash can – NO GLASS ALLOWED IN THE POOL AREA (this is for everyone's safety).
