

LEST WE FORGET – SEPTEMBER 11TH

n a clear Tuesday morning in 2001, 10 terrorists from the Islamist extremist group al-Qaeda hijacked four commercial airplanes, deliberately crashing two into the Twin Towers in New York City and a third into the Pentagon in Arlington, Virginia. After learning about the other attacks, passengers on the fourth plane, Flight 93, launched a counter-offensive, and the plane crashed into an empty field in western Pennsylvania. The 9/11 attacks killed 2,977 people from more than 90 nations. The oldest victim was 85 years old; the youngest was two. More than 400 were first responders who died performing their sworn duties.

The 9/11 Memorial opened on the 10th anniversary of the attacks. It consists of two pools set in the footprints of the original Twin Towers. Thirty-foot waterfalls – the largest in North America-cascade into the pools, each then descending into a center void. The names of the victims are inscribed in bronze parapets around the pools. many folks displaced from their homes, many seeking shelters throughout the Tampa Bay area. We have been very fortunate and hopefully the rain and storm pattern that we've experienced will soon pass as fall begins.

- The lawn service & sealcoat process is a day by day game plan. Alexander's was able to cut Wednesday, August 12th, after two weeks. Hopefully, we can get back into our once a week cutting soon.
- Safety hitches had been applied to the trash & recycle dumpsters.

- Our PVC fencing has been cleaned by brush & hand with an organic compound recommended by West Coast fence called Simply Green.
- Concrete will be moved in its final stages to the banks of the canal as the sogginess dissipates.
- Renovation of coach #300 is complete and work is about to commence at #229.
- The pool lights have newer controls & the shower area has been remodeled, two ceiling fans are on order & that area is being addressed for further beautification & qualitative enjoyment.
- Tampa Bay Plumbers will be back in the park once the Sealcoat project is completed to finish the valve discovery on the north end of the park.
- We are looking at the cart path area again for beautification as well. I had Alexander's cut back their trees by about 3 feet all along any adjacent fencing.
- The Manager's First Draft Budget has been prepared & we are gearing up for our fall meetings & agenda items.
- Palm tree trimming shall be commencing shortly, as the seed pods decline in their spurts & growth on the queen palms. This, of course, weather permitting.
- Much attention is being done to eliminate invasive plants/trees from the park entirely. We have had & are having quite a busy summer in all echelons.
- We had an informational meeting / discussion on insurances at Koffee Klatch on Wednesday, August 12th, by Barry Scarr of Scarr Agency and Jessica McCracken, Commercial Lines Agent.

IMPORTANT TIPS FROM ASSOCIA REGARDING HURRICANE PREPARATION

Hurricanes are frightening, but can be survived with minimal impact given the proper preparation. The following guide is designed to help you minimize damage and save lives through quick response and clear thinking that come from having a complete plan in place. Following you will find information to help you weather the storm, including checklists to make sure you have everything you need, tips for preventative measures you can take to facilitate a fast

response, and helpful guidelines for evacuation, damage assessment, and rebuilding your community. At Associa, we consider our clients to be family and we want you to be safe this hurricane season.

Listed below are suggestions for preventative measures to take before a disaster. **GATHER PERSONAL SUPPLIES:**

• Water – at least 1 gal. per person for three to seven days • Non-perishable packaged or canned food/juices • Snack foods • Non-electric can opener • Paper plates/plastics utensils • Garbage bags • First-aid kit • Flashlight(s)/ batteries • Rain gear • Medicines/prescriptions • Cash – ATM and/or banks may not be open for a few days/weeks • Gas – fill your car with fuel in case of an evacuation• A fully-charged emergency cell phone • Keys to unit • Waterproof container of important documents (medical, insurance, financial, social security, etc.) • Reading material, games, etc.

WHEN YOU EVACUATE: • Contact family/friends as to the situation •Let the FSE office know where you will be staying. Leave in daylight if possible • Secure/lock mobile; remove everything from carport or deck • Place towels on all window and door sills in case of water • Do not tape windows, this will not strengthen them • Turn off all water faucets • Disconnect all electrical items at the switches in the breaker panel box (except refrigerator) • Remove antenna(s) or satellite dish, be careful not to touch electrical wire • Have a primary and secondary evacuation route (traffic may be heavy) • Relocate ASAP prior to winds/rain becoming too dangerous • Bring any of the provisions listed that can be managed; add a pillow and blanket. We strongly recommend you evacuate in the event of a hurricane. If you choose to remain, please remember that you do so at your own risk.

SHOULD YOU CHOOSE TO STAY: • Clean, sterilize and fill available containers with water for emergency drinking purposes • Fill bathtub with water for bathing and to flush the commode • Move to an interior room or closet of your unit without windows • Be aware that as the hurricane approaches you should remain in your mobile. There will be no help available until after the storm passes.

I am Gluten Intolerant

I do not have celiac disease but my insides don't tolerate gluten very well. My symptoms are bloating, gas, and going between diarrhea/constipation, plus my skin itches like heck. I am also exhausted all the time. I was originally gluten free back in November 2008. I stopped being gluten free December 2011 after I had my stomach removed. My symptoms started coming back and it took me a while to put two and two together so in January 2015 I went back gluten free even though my test came back negative. Within two weeks (both times) my symptoms pretty much went away. I have had my Michigan doctor suggest this to me the first time I just didn't decide to go gluten free. Then I had the blessing of my Florida doctor too. As they both said, humans were not made to eat gluten especially since it is so processed now.

What is gluten...wheat, ryes, malt, oats may or may not depending on where processed, couscous, barley...etc.; you would be amazed where you will find gluten. MSG is gluten. Soy Sauce is gluten unless it says gluten-free on label. Seasoning may have gluten because sometimes flour is added so it won't clump; the same with shredded cheese. Luncheon meats, but there are a couple of brands that are OK. French fries can have a coating on them or be fried with other things that are breaded. Mashed potatoes, as they may have flour added to thicken. Creamed soups, if flour is used as thickener. Believe it or not make-up, crayons, gum, candy, etc. could have gluten in them - weird I know. How about medications and vitamins, as they may have gluten.

What can I eat? Since I am intolerant I can sometimes take a chance and eat fries out. I do try to eat grilled or baked fish or chicken. If I have a salad I sometimes have to watch the dressing I use since many have gluten in them. Ed worries about me since he has been there when I have had flare ups. We try to check websites before we go to dinner to see if they have gluten free choices. More and more do. I try to be especially cautious when traveling since don't want a flare up. It is a challenge, but what in life isn't!

I am collecting gluten free recipes, but I am making many baked goodies substituting gluten- free flour for regular flour. Some things work, but many do not. It is a learning experience. I am of Italian heritage, so not having good crusty bread or great pasta or even a pizza has been a challenge. I have made my Anise Pizzelle cookies with much success with this substitution. Bread not so much. Pasta is getting better in the stores but it is hit or miss. Pizza is like eating cardboard. Poor Ed has been a real trooper with this. Many times I will make a spaghetti squash instead and that works out.

Here is a gluten-free buckwheat and oat pancake recipe I have made several times. Add either blueberries or pecans - delicious.

1/2 c buckwheat flour (THIS IS GLUTEN FREE FLOUR)

1/2 c gluten free oat flour (you can ground oatmeal into flour)

1 T honey or agave nectar

2 t baking powder (make sure gluten free)

1/2 t baking soda

1/2 t xanthan gum

1/4 t salt

2 T flax seed meal...optional

1/4 t nutmeg


1/4 t cardamom...optional

1 c buttermilk or almond milk

2 T coconut oil - melted

1 large egg or egg substitute

1/2 t vanilla extract...make sure gluten-free



Preheat a large heavy skillet over medium-low heat, combine the dry ingredients in a medium-sized bowl and mix with whisk. In separate bowl mix the milk, oil, egg, agave/honey, vanilla and then add them to dry. Mix gently until all ingredients are moist. The batter will be lumpy.

Brush skillet with oil. Pour 1/8 c batter onto skillet. Turn pancakes when they bubble on top and bottom is slightly brown. May take 2-3 minutes. Carefully flip and continue until cooked another 1-2 minutes.

When I add berries/nuts, I add when I first drop on skillet. Or you can serve with fruit/nuts when completely cooked. This makes approximately 12 -1/8 cup pancakes. MAKE SURE YOU COOK LOW AND SLOW. Delicious and nutty tasting. Bon Apetit!

These rules are published each month in the newsletter for you and your guests. Why not pull out this page and post it on your refrigerator or bulletin board for reference. We want everyone to have a good time, but be safe in the water.

- If you are the last one out of the pool, always be certain that the rope is secured across the pool. Please ask your guests to be aware of the importance of this as well.
- If you are a smoker and use the 'butt' buckets please clean them out once in a while. Make sure the 'butts' are completely out before you put them in the trash can.

• The life preserver is for emergencies only – it is not a toy – do not let children play with it in the pool.

• Observe special times for your young visitors. Children under the age of 16 may use the pool between the hours of 10 AM 1PM and 5PM till dusk, and should be accompanied and controlled at the pool by their host/s or a designated adult.



- Straighten the chairs and tables whenever you move them around don't leave them for someone else to rearrange.

psychologist walked around a room while teaching stress management to an audience. As she raised a glass of water, everyone expected they'd be asked the 'half empty or half full' question. Instead, with a smile on her face, she inquired, "How heavy is this glass of water?"

Answers called out ranged from 8 oz. to 20 oz.

She replied, "The absolute weight doesn't matter. It depends on how long I hold it. If I hold it for a minute, it's not a problem. If I hold it for an hour, I'll have an ache in my arm. If I hold it for a day, my arm will feel numb and paralyzed. In each case, the weight of the glass doesn't change, but the longer I hold it, the heavier it becomes."
