Activity Funding

Bazaar

The annual bazaar continues to be the major source of funding of Gateway Activities. The thousands of dollars raised over the years on the single day has been the primary factor in allowing for our dances to remain entertaining and affordable for all who choose to attend. Recognition goes to Cheryl Williams for her efforts as the primary planner for the bazaar and I am pleased to report that the Fundraising Bazaar held December 2nd, 2017 added \$1416.55 to the Gateway Treasury.

Newspaper and recyclables add to funding in a limited fashion.

Pancake Breakfast, Bike Parade and Coffee Chat have income and expenses and are selfmaintaining during their seasonal operations.

Dances and other activities receive and disburse money on an individual basis from GAO unallocated funds.

Gateway Choir maintains a positive funding level though it is totally dependent upon donations for income.

Ladies Day and Bingo have their own treasurers for maintaining their week to week operations throughout the Fall/Winter/Spring season.

At this time and throughout this season, your Gateway Activities Organization has been well funded as was reflected in the Treasurer's report.

Presidents Comments

As President of GAO I made inquiries and was immediately assured by the new management personnel that activities would not be affected as the result of the management changes. Social activities are prominent on the ARC Investment Gateway website. For this reason it is important that activities be maintained though we must recognize the reality that the numbers of us available as volunteers for these activities is becoming limited.

Our GAO activities would not exist except for the volunteers who give of their time and money and skills. 

A group of Rummili players has recently formed to augment the Domino players. Game night is about offering the clubhouse as an alternative to what would otherwise be a group of friends gathering at someone's home.

Friday - Golf

Saturday - Pancake Breakfast – Dick Gilbert

Dick and his crew once again and consistently have performed well. Pancake Breakfast was one of the first functions Kathy and I attended at Gateway. It impressed me in 2006 and continues to impress me today. Attendance can vary greatly throughout the season but the quality of the product offered remains. Average attendance is down slightly, at times dipping into the low 40s but is usually mid to upper 40s on any particular Saturday.
