



RUMOR MILL & OTHER THINGS

ccording to the Spot Crime online reporting website (email subscription) there have been five reported incidents of property crime (thefts and burglary) within the Park since the first of June. All residents should be aware of the temptation that unsecured, loose items and unlocked automobiles provides to any casual observer passing through the community.

The Gateway website currently lists 10 homes ranging from \$3500 to \$89000 available for immediate occupancy. The Park consists of approximately 312 improved lots and the fact that there appears to be less than 3% of the homes vacant, certainly bodes well for we residents. If Gateway remains a popular and desirable place to reside we should expect that Park owners and their management staff will have adequate revenue and incentive to maintain and improve the amenities they provide, and will adequately vet new residents in an effort to attract and keep responsible residents of good moral character.

Keep in mind the pipes supplying water to our homes and to water our lawns are old and not buried deeply in the ground. Parking and driving on the grass will most certainly lead to breakage and the interruption to water service during the time it takes to accomplish repairs to either of the systems. Pay attention to the signs and please do not drive on or park your motor vehicles on the grass.

Other than the Annual Bazaar and Halloween and Valentine Dance ticket donations the only other source of GAO General funding is through the paper and can recycling. The paper 'dumpster' is located at the north end of 1st Way and aluminum cans (free of cigarette butts and ashes please) can be deposited in the clubhouse storage room or the barrel marked for aluminum cans at the east entrance bulletin board.

ANOTHER COMPUTER TIP FROM RICKSDAILYTIPS EMAILS ASKING YOU TO LOG IN AND UPDATE YOUR INFORMATION ARE ALWAYS FAKE

The Editor

[Credit Card and Banking Institutions, whether you access accounts online or not are requesting you supply an email address and a mobile (smart phone) number so they can contact you and keep you up to date with account information. The same is true with virtually any and all retail product or service businesses. Your editor receives about 25 emails per day from any and all manner of business entities, most take the form of advertisements, but every so often comes that request to visit a website and log on to an account. Over the years I have learned to be suspicious of any 'link' contained in any email I receive.]

If you ever get an email that appears to be from your bank or some other online service telling you that you need to click a link in the email to log in to your account and update your personal information, don't do it.

These types of emails are always fakes. Every one of them, every time.

Well, there is one (and only one) exception and that is when you cannot remember your password and you click the "Forgot Password" link, in which case you'll most likely receive an email containing a link to click in order to reset your password. ALL other such emails are fakes.

Of course there are indeed times when you'll be asked to verify or update your information for a given account, but that request will always be made after you have logged into the account with your current username and password, never before.

Don't be fooled by "official" looking emails and websites. Hackers and thieves are experts at making their fake emails and websites look legit.

If you are ever tempted to click a link in an email and enter your username and password, DON'T DO IT! The website on the other end of that link quite possibly a fake, and after you enter your username and password the bad guys will take that information and log into your real account, pose as you and clean out the account!

Here are the steps to follow when you receive one of these fake emails:

- 1. Forward the email to the fraud division of your bank or online service. You'll find the correct email address to use listed somewhere on their website.
- 2. Delete the email without clicking any links in it. The link might appear to be legit, but if you hover your mouse over it you'll see the URL of the site the link actually leads to displayed at the bottom of the screen and it WON'T be the URL for your bank's website.
- 3. Manually type in the URL or use a bookmark that you already know to be legitimate for your bank or service's website and log in from there. If anything truly needs to be updated you'll be notified via a pop-up window or bolded message. If you have any questions at that point you can always call their customer service number and ask the rep directly.

If you happen to slip up and enter your login information on a fake website (you'll know because the login will fail), go to the real website or call customer service immediately and change your password.



Did you know that August is also...

Back to School Month. As summer draws to a close, back-to-school season is in full effect. Remember to safely share the roads with school buses, pedestrians, and bicyclists, and provide children with the necessary knowledge to stay safe at school. Whether children walk, ride their bicycle, or take the bus to school, they—and the motorists around them—should remember to take proper safety precautions.



National Black Business Month. During August, individuals, institutions, and businesses are encouraged to visit at least one black-owned business per day. Like a good neighbor . . .

Te depend on our neighbors to water our plants and walk our dogs when we're out of town—or do we? A study from the Pew Research Center found that only a little more than half of Americans—52 percent—say they trust all or most of their neighbors, and 48 percent they trust only some of their neighbors, or none at all.

The Pew Center found that among households with incomes of \$75,000 or more, 67 percent of residents trust all or most of their neighbors, but in households earning less than \$30,000, only 37 percent feel the same.

Race may also be a factor, although the connection is unclear: Sixty-two percent of white Americans say they trust their neighbors, just 31 percent of African-Americans do, and only 27 percent of Hispanics.

The Zika virus: Protect yourself with the facts

The Zika virus is spreading in the headlines and around the world, but you don't have to panic. The best defense is information. Here are some basic facts about the virus from the NBC News website:

- Origins. Zika comes from the continent of Africa. It was first observed in 1947, but didn't seem dangerous. That changed when it migrated across the South Pacific and ultimately arrived in Brazil, where immunity against the virus is low.
- **Effect.** The virus itself doesn't seem to cause major health problems in most people beyond a rash, headaches, and fever. But it can in some cases cause paralysis, nerve damage, encephalitis, and miscarriages, as well as birth defects and deaths in newborn children.
- **Transmission.** The Zika virus is mostly spread by mosquitoes native to tropical regions. It can also be sexually transmitted.
- Reach. Zika has already arrived in the United States, where approximately 700 people have been infected after traveling to foreign countries. Mosquitoes that carry the disease are common in many areas, even as far north as New York, so localized outbreaks could occur in several states.
- **Prevention.** Air conditioning and windows screens are both good defenses against the mosquitoes. In addition, officials advise that people wear long clothing and insect repellant when going outside.








Get started on your writing project today

If you've dreamed of writing a novel, a short story, or even a poem, but you don't know how to get started, don't worry. Most creative writers have trouble with the first page from Lime to time. Try these tips for charging up your imagination:

The night shift takes a bigger toll on women

Torking the midnight shift is hard on everyone, but it may be more detrimental to women's health than men's, according to a study by a sleep research center at the University of Surrey.



The center put 16 male volunteers and 18 females in a controlled environment where each day lasted 28 hours without natural day-night light levels. Every three hours during "daytime" the volunteers performed a range of tasks that measured brain function, alertness, motor control, and memory. Both men and women were affected by the lack of natural circadian rhythms, but the impact was greater on women, who exhibited more problems than men during the early hours of their awake period. The information is useful for everyone contemplating work on the so-called graveyard shift.

Loneliness is bad for the heart

oneliness and isolation may be bad for your mental health, and they can also have a negative impact on your physical health. That comes from a British study reported on the CBS News website, which found that in addition to high blood pressure and compromised immune systems, loneliness can apparently lead to problems with the heart.

The British researchers looked at data from more than 180,000 people. They found that adults with few friends or social relationships were 29 percent more likely to suffer a heart attack or angina, and also 32 percent more likely to have a stroke.

The cause and effect relationship remains unclear, but the findings suggest that strong relationships can influence your health in many ways.

Choose the right food to combat stress

Te all have our go-to foods when we're stressed out—chocolate cake or a bowl of ice cream. But certain foods can actually help you relax without blowing your diet. Consider these alternatives:

- Leafy greens. Spinach, lettuce, and other leafy vegetables can help your brain produce dopamine, which can calm you down.
- Turkey. The tryptophan in turkey boosts serotonin levels, relieving depression.
- Salmon. Salmon is high in omega-3 fatty acids, which can inhibit hormones that cause stress.
