

Each paid-up household is entitled to one vote. Please remit your 2015 membership renewal fee of \$2 to the GHA Treasurer, Lana Kennedy, prior to the meeting. It is important to be a paid-up member and attend the meeting as a majority of the membership is required to constitute a quorum.

Two Directors' positions are open for election -- each for a 3-year term (January 1, 2015 to December 31, 2017). If you would like to be a candidate for a director's position, please be at the meeting or if you should be unable to attend you may provide a signed statement agreeing

the meeting or if you should be una to be nominated.

The election shall be by ballot (unless dispensed with by unanimous consent) and a simple majority (50%+1) of the votes cast shall be binding. Votes may be cast in person or by proxy. Proxy forms are available from June Boudreau and must be filed with the GHA Secretary, Cheryl Williams, before the meeting.

We encourage all Gateway residents to participate in the Annual Meeting & Election on February 2.


